# Fifty-fifth Annual Report and Financial Statement for the Season 1960-61

Gentlemen,-

It is with a great deal of pleasure that I present, on behalf of your Club Council, this, the 55th Annual Report and Financial Statement, covering the activities of the Club during the 1960-61 Season.

Since the re-building of the Club House our financial position has been consolidated, and we are pleased to report that a further amount of £1,000 has been paid off our overdraft. Also, the first re-payment of £200 to the S.L.S.A, State Centre Herald Fund has been made.

We have again fulfilled the primary function of a Life Saving Club, and are proud to record that no lives were lost at Coogee Beach.

The number of Patrol Efficiency Pennants awarded, together with the list of trophies for the Club's domestic programme, reflects favourably on the interest taken by Club Members.

The Council had the unpleasant duty of cancelling and suspending the membership of several members for failing to carry out their patrol obligations. Remember, we are not entirely a sporting body—we undertake to guard the lives of surfers, and must carry that out. It is hoped that members will be more diligent in this, the most important side of our work.

Our new laminated ply surf boat, the "Millers Oceanic," was christened by Mrs, Roderick Miller, wife of the Managing Director of Millers Brewery Pty. Ltd., on Sunday, 23rd July, 1961.
