



AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS CITY BEACH PERTH



To our club member John Vaughan who managed the successful N.S.W. team in the State teams section of the Carnival—congratulations John on a terrific performance by the team.



The first prize of a Holden Automatic Sedan was won by March Past coach, Bruce Emerson.


Unfortunately from a club membership of 615 only 93 members supported this venture and the balance was made up of persons outside the Surf Club.

PRESIDENT'S ADDENDUM

This fine and comprehensive report completes a year's work in which many ventures have been undertaken in the interests of the Club, the members and the movement generally. The onerous position of Honorary Secretary was carried out in a most capable and businesslike manner by Reg Johnston, and I take this opportunity of conveying my sincere thanks in appreciation of his splendid efforts.

The 1970-71 season has seen the completion of many projects begun during the 1966-67 season. These include the extention to the Club shower room, fully equiped gymnasium, lockers, hand-ball court, relocation of the captain's room and gear room, new toilet block, tiled area upstairs, modern bar, refreshment kiosk on the beach and members' parking area.

Financial arrangements also made during the 1966-67 season are now at a stage where only a small amount is left to be repaid. Of the original loan of \$20,000 only approximately \$520 is left to be repaid on the interest.

One loan of \$2,000 from the Herald Fund N.S.W. State Centre has been repaid. Another loan of \$2000 has been repaid to the extent of \$1,000.

An amount of \$2,000 has been allocated for re-painting of the club house. The club house, furniture and fittings have been revalued. Vast amounts have been spent on sending club teams to National Championships. Another surf boat has been ordered and the club constitution revised. All these achievements have benefited the great majority of club members although I feel our greatest achievements are still bringing results. I refer to our encouragement to Junior and Cadet members. A glance at the carnival results for the year will bear this out. This, I believe, is your committee's greatest accomplishment.

It will be appreciated that none of the above achievements could have been contemplated let alone commenced unless someone was prepared to saddle himself with the responsibility of seeing them through to finality. A number of your officials have never hesitated to offer their services, time and energy when called upon to do so, mentioning in particular Joe Seddon, John Dunn, Jack Scott, Jack Cannot, Joe Toohey, Mick Sweeney, Jack Sheffield, Bruce Emerson, Tom Baker and Eric Walton.

It is pleasing to note the measure of club spirit and co-operation generally is most pronounced. However it is desirable to impress upon each member that he forms a highly necessary unit in the club as a whole and it is encumbent upon him to uphold the dignity, prestige and honour of the club.

It has been my privilege to act as President of this fine club, and I trust my efforts have been adequate to ensure a satisfactory season.
