

Treasurer's Report

Presented with this report are the Balance Sheet and Financial Statements for the year ended 30th April, 1991.

The year was a success financially with the club being able to meet all commitments, including the very real cost in sending a team to Perth for the National Championships, whilst continuing to accumulate funds for much needed renovations.

During the year the "old seminar" room was demolished and action taken to rectify flood problems. Despite vandalism and fire the area is now almost complete and will house the clubs gymnasium. In excess of \$18,000 has been expended on this project so far.

Reserves have been accumulated to enable replacement of the verandah and modernisation of the mens change and shower areas whilst incorporating a ladies change area downstairs.

Income

The clubs funds accrue from 4 main sources and certain members worked extremely hard to ensure that all areas of funding met expectations. Jack Cannot and his band of assistants in the shop experienced a frustrating year with the beach area virtually being cut in two by major earth works.

That they were able to produce a result in line with last year's performance is a tremendous effort and one that deserves the clubs complete appreciation.

The Social Secretary Paul Beale and Warren Breeze put together a fund raising social calendar which was extremely successful and enabled the club to send a big team to the National Championships in Perth at a very modest cost to individual team members. This was quite an achievement and one that deserves highlighting.

Conscientous investment and tight control rewarded the club with substantial investment income whilst subscriptions were at an all time high.

Expenditure

Expenditure was closely monitored and all accounts vetted by the committee. Most items of expenditure were kept within budget. In particular though I would like to acknowledge the work of our gear stewards Les Barlow and Col Scott who believe in fixing and repairing as opposed to the "throw-away" mentality that afflicts so many today. Their efforts meant that our gear is in good order and condition and our costs are minimal.

Expenditure of over \$10,000 was allocated by way of grants/provision for equipment to individual members as follows.

Expenditure comprised the purchase of boards and skis, swimming subsidies, and payments to the Association for representative team members and members selected to participate in camps, etc.

Entry Fees to carnivals and championships paid on behalf of competitive members were in excess of \$3,500.00 for the season.

Notes to and forming part of the Financial Accounts as at 30th April, 1991

- The accounts are prepared on the continuing business concept, using the historical cost convention and therefore do not reflect changes in the purchasing power of money.
- Stock of Kiosk Goods, Bar Purchases and Stock for resale have been valued at cost price.
- An amount of \$20,000 was granted by the Department of Sport Racing & Recreation to the Club in 1988 for specified purposes. This amount has now been taken into account and used in accordance with the conditions as specified.
- The building in which the Club is situated is shown in the Accounts as having a value of \$214,806. In

- Building renovations estimated to cost in excess of \$100,000 are to be undertaken within the next two years. It is intended that funds set aside in a Provision for Building Maintenance will be used on this project.
- 6. A Public Liability Insurance Policy s held by the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia providing inter alia cover for the Club and members of the Club whilst engaged in life saving activities or properly authorised duties as approved by the Club.

Club Captain's Report

The 1990-91 season was a highly successful one for Coogee S.L.S.C. Firstly, I am proud to report that 'No lives were lost' whilst we patrolled the beach. Five rescues were completed. Four were effected by the IRB, and one with the aid of no rescue equipment. Throughout the season patrolling members also took part in numerous searches for lost children (all successful), treated a large number and variety of minor first aid cases and made some 200 preventative actions. That is, warning people from danger — no doubt contributing to the lower number of rescues this season, proving that prevention is far better than cure.

Some sixty-six members gained their 100% attendance for the season, and I would like to thank them for their unselfish efforts that sometimes carry a number of other less conscientious active members. Thanks also needs to be directed to the Patrol Captains for the efforts that they have made this season to ensure the safety of the bathing/surfing public.

Other major highlights of the season included;

- Tony Seddon's dual Championship wins in Perth in the Open & U-18 board riding;
- Leigh Habler's and Malcolm Allen's surf results and outstanding still water results at Open and Age Championships;
- The large number of placings gained by the Boat, Swim, R&R Boardriding and Ironman sections of the club at weekly carnivals;
- The fact that a large number of teams competed throughout the season (including; 7 Boat crews, 5 R&R teams, a surf team and two board relays) thus enabling some fine club spirit to develop;
- The 10th Place gained by the Rep. Team in the inter-club pointscore at the Australian Titles, a fine team effort:
- The selection of the 'A' Boat Crew in the State Team;
- The efforts of Macro and his helpers who largely contributed to the subsidisation of the team to Perth;

Radio Officers Report

Our club will be purchasing a waterproof IRB Radio in the near future. If we can show the same care, courtesy and commonsense shown with our beach radio it will also last for many years of fine operation.

Helicopter Rescue

The "Lifesaver" helicopter rescue service, as it is now known, has in the last twelve months re-inforced its position as the "number one" Helicopter Emergency Medical and Rescue Service in the country.

The recent purchase of three Dauphin helicopters, refitted to become the most sophisticated rescue helicopters in the country will offer the population of N.S.W. with a service second to none.

Coogee S.L.S.C. is proud to have two members, Tony Waller and Clayton Allison flying as helicopter rescue crewman, from the Sydney Service, based at Prince Henry Hospital.

Tony and Clayton, who gained their Helicopter Crewman's Certificate in 1985, have carried out numerous rescues, between them in 6 years of service. By the end of this season, both will have completed their Helicopter Crewman Instructors Certificate.

Many club members do not realise the dedication and time commitment required to retain their positions as rescue crew.

Unlike the surfing season, patrols are carried out 12 months of the year, on a 24 hour basis. Each volunteer crewman is required to complete four patrols per month, as well as attended mandatory retraining days and crew meetings each month.

On top of this each crewman is re-examined in all aspects every 6 months.

As for the physical side, each crewman must requalify each alternate month with a 4km timed run, or a 400m pool swim. With a 1km/400m run/swim; and 15 minute treadwater in flight suit, every six months. A yearly medical examination is also carried out.

Crewmen must also remain current with Advanced Resuscitation and Advanced First Aid Certificates.

Flight training is held every second month, with crewmen being checked in all aspects of their role as Rescue Crewmen. A typical day would see a member abseiling up to 100 metres from a helicopter; jumping from a helicopter to carry out a surf rescue; a winding medical crew 90 metres onto a target below.

A crewman must also be conversant with radio operations, basic navigations and have a general knowledge of Airmanship.

During the year Tony and Clayton have been involved in a number of different missions from a cliff rescue carried out by Clayton to a week spent at Forbes by Tony, carrying out rescue and medical support missions to a community isolated by flood waters.

Overall the boys find it demanding and yet very rewarding.

Come June this year, both Tony and Clayton will be attending a helicopter operations study tour to the west coast of the U.S.A. where they will attend training facilities of the U.S. Coast Guard, Los Angeles City and County Fire Departments and Los Angeles County Lifeguards. All this will be made possible by the support given to them by the members of Coogee S.L.S.C.

IRB Captain's Report

The 1990-91 proved to be one of consolidation of equipment and provision of a quality IRB service to the beach patrols. This was made extremely difficult by the lack of suitable accommodation for hulls, engines and ancillary equipment necessary for IRB operations. The constraints of working from a shipping container in the middle of the beach are such basic maintenance such as hosing down the hulls and flushing the engines after use are impossible, a circumstance such as changing spark plugs or cleaning carburretors even worse.

I would suggest that the seizure of two motors by Christmas was a direct result of our inability to provide any great degree of maintenance.

However, through a number of initiatives we have been able to rise above these problems and now have two motors that are extremely reliable and well maintained at a minimal cost.

This then allowed the IRB to fulfill its role of support to beach patrols and competition, performing a number of rescues, being available for the training of bronze medallion and IRB driver candidates, and the club providing all IRB need on our carnival day. From our current point we need to develop a group interested in driving the craft and more importantly committed to the maintenance of hull and motor. To foster this the club is now working closely with the Maroubra, South Maroubra and Clovelly Club in an ad hoc co-operative which is improving the ability of drivers within each club.

Finally, I would like to thank the three IRB Captains of the other Randwick District Clubs for their assistance, and John Restuccia for opening the doors to the other clubs.




Coogee S.L.S.C. Swimming Club




