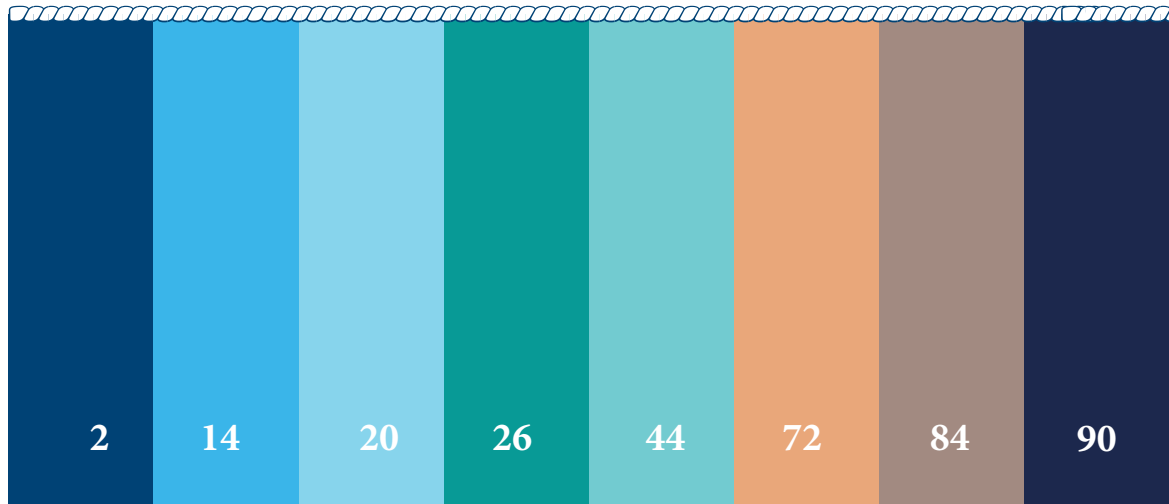
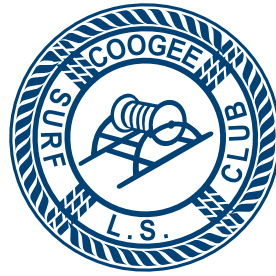

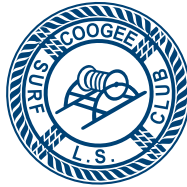

Building Committee Report

It is with great delight that we are able to report to our members that our grand vision for an extensive renovation of our Clubhouse will become a reality this coming season.



Clubhouse Renovations

Our Club continues to grow in strength and numbers and we have simply outgrown our beloved Clubhouse.

As such, four years ago the Club Management Committee gave approval for the Executive and the Building Committee to develop a concept plan and take it through to development approval. This was done, after widely consulting with the community and council officers.

The next stage was to gain the funding to be able to realise the project. After a number of years seeking grants, all of our hard work came to fruition with advice that we

would receive grants from both the State and Local Government.

Currently the Building Committee are working with Randwick Council Officers to complete a tendering process for both the Construction Plans to be developed, and the selection, by public tender, for an appropriate construction company to build our clubhouse.

The Construction Plans are expected to be completed by November 2019, with construction to commence on 1 April 2020.

As such the Ocean Room will be closed during our off-season (Winter 2020) and access around the clubhouse will be limited at times during the construction phase. This is an unavoidable consequence of

the renovation and we ask that our members work with us to ensure everyone's safety during this period.

We thank both our previous State Member for Coogee, Bruce Notley-Smith, the Mayor Cr Kathy Neilsen and former Mayor, Cr Lindsay Shurey, and all Councillors of Randwick City Council for their ongoing support of our Club.

There will be a members information night at the Clubhouse, once the Construction Drawings are completed, most likely in early November.

President's Report

It is my pleasure to present my first report as President of CSLSC. What a year it has been!



Firstly, I am pleased to report that no lives were lost while patrolling Coogee beach this season. This is an amazing achievement and credit goes to our brilliant lifesaving team, led by Andy Gardiner and Emma Gill. In collaboration with the Randwick City Life Guards, our Lifesaving team ensured comprehensive coverage of Coogee beach, Garie beach in the Royal National Park, Wylies Baths and this year, McIver's Ladies Baths. This season, we were pleased to assist McIver's with vital rescue equipment in light of the larger number of patrons utilising their baths in more recent times.

From great lifesaving comes great education. This season George Fatseas led our surf education program and I'd like to congratulate him on a great season. Our members obtained more than 400 awards this season, meaning our club topped Randwick District for total number of awards obtained. I am grateful and thank all our instructors

who gave up a considerable amount of their time educating our future lifesavers.

Once again, Coogee had a strong competitive season. In 2018/19 we came away with five silver medals in the Open and Youth Championships and 10 Masters Gold medals at the National titles. Congratulations to not only all our dedicated competitors, but our committed area managers and coaches. A special thank you to competition director Helen Deas and assistant Sharon Deans, who dedicate much of their spare time streamlining the competition area, including a revamp of our long running surf carnival.

Our Minnows came under new leadership this season, with Captain Rebecca Waugh taking charge of almost a thousand nippers. The Minnows delivered another extraordinary season, finishing 3rd place at the NSW State Championships (point score). Other successes include, the

Dippers program which was again extremely well supported by our volunteer members, while their 'take 3 for the sea' initiative highlighted the devastating impact plastic has on our environment.

While it has been a fantastic season, our club is growing and changing right before our own eyes. The biggest change awaiting is the upcoming club renovation. As we strive to be a centre of surf lifesaving excellence in training and education, this rebuild will also help secure our financial security and future. This large, multi-million dollar project now has a commencement date of April 2020. Many have seen this project through at different time points, and I thank Mark Doepel for his vision, along with Tony Waller and Matt Scanlon from the building committee and others who've worked tirelessly behind the scenes to get this initiative up. I also thank, of course, Randwick Council and the



NSW Government for funding this important project.

Our sponsors continue to make a great contribution to our club and we are very grateful for their generosity. Once again, our Sportsperson's lunch was guided by Steve 'Chimes' Gillis, with significant funds raised for our competition area. Our November and April ocean swims continue to attract a large number of community swimmers, on the back of the outstanding volunteering efforts of our members on the day - ensuring a safe, well run event. For our most recent swim in April, we were able to join forces and help raise funds with the Royal Hospital for Women in Randwick. We look forward to growing this relationship.

In June this year, the club conducted a strategic planning day to map out our priorities and direction in numerous key areas. Here, members representing a wide variety of club areas discussed the club's need for clarity on its values, vision and purpose. Key aspects of lifesaving and competition, modernising communication and financial security were also raised and discussed. One of the great challenges for our club is youth retention. Another priority is our commitment to diversity and equality of opportunity. We are already targeting these areas through our updated constitutional reform, looking to give our youth a great voice via more senior leadership roles and the appointment of a diversity officer. Following our planning and assessment day observations, a CSLSC 'best self-project' working group of club members was formed to develop an action plan. It was a truly inspiring and energizing day with plenty of positive feedback. This could not have been possible without an experienced facilitator, and I'd like to take this

As I wrap up, my job was made much easier thanks to the dedication of the Management Committee, particularly the Executive. Each has played a tremendous role throughout the year. Briefly, Paul Hinds single handily re opened the kiosk, and in doing so, gave a dozen of our Minnows the opportunity to serve food and beverages as well as earning a few dollars along the way. Tass Karozis worked tirelessly with our ocean swims, Coogee Carnival and was part of many time-consuming working groups throughout the season. Andy Gardiner is surely one of the busiest club captains in Australia, while Pat Garcia just makes things work. Now serving 10 consecutive years on the Executive committee, Pat continues to find the time within his busy schedule, dedicating many working hours to the surf club. I've learnt to appreciate the crucial role of our Governors within the club and the

wider community. I thank them for all their assistance when I really needed it. Lastly, I cannot forget our administration staff, to Karen and Tracey, thank you so much for all your hard work.

Finally to my little family; Saorla and Maeve. Thank you for your patience and understanding, for all times I had to duck away, the phone calls, unexpected meetings and much more. The Presidents role is a tough one, and its easy to forget it's a volunteer role. Nevertheless, it had been a rewarding and great learning experience.

Secretary's Report

In our 113th season patrolling Coogee beach, the members of Coogee SLSC can once more proudly proclaim that no lives were lost.

This season our members performed nearly 24,000 patrol hours. During this time, they performed 11 rescues with a tube, four without gear and five with an IRB. Our patrolling members managed seven suspected spinal injuries, 49 marine stings, and seven dislocations and fractures. They cared for six lost children; and performed nearly 600 preventative actions. Congratulations to our Club Captain Andy Gardiner, Vice Captain Emma Gill, the lifesaving committee, patrol captains and patrolling members on another successful season on Coogee beach.

The education area led by new Chief Instructor George Fatseas welcomed 130 new bronze medallion holders this season (the most in the branch) and 85 Surf Rescue Certificate cadets (also the most in the branch). It really is wonderful to see our patrols swell with these new recruits. 46 members obtained their senior first aid certificates while 22 members obtained their spinal management qualifications. In total, the club's members obtained 411 awards this season. Congratulations to all of our club trainers and assessors and to all of our members who upgraded their qualifications this Summer.

This season the club obtained funding to complete its clubhouse renovations. \$2,580,000 was obtained from the Office of Local Government Stronger Communities Fund. \$300,000 was obtained from the NSW Department of Industry Office of Responsible Gambling. \$720,000 from the Randwick City Council 2020-21 Capital Works Budget. Randwick Council have also helpfully offered the club its in-house project management services for the remaining stages of delivery. The works are scheduled to commence in April 2020. I thank all those club members who have played

significant roles in obtaining funding and managing this important project for the club including Mark Doepel, Tony Waller, Matt Scanlon, Rob Gibellini, and Paul Hinds.

Congratulations to some of our amazing members who were recognised for their contributions to lifesaving at both a branch and state level. Andrew Tooher was awarded this year's honour blazer. Charlotte McHenry, who is currently completing a double degree at UTS, was awarded the SCU Scholarship. Doug Hawkins was awarded Sydney branch's Volunteer of the Year. Matt Spooner was awarded Branch Member of the Year. Our under 13 Male and Female beach teams were also awarded Sydney Branch's JD Team of the Year.

At the Annual General Meeting last year, Carolyn Martin was awarded the '1907' Foundation Medal for sustained and distinguished service to the club over multiple seasons. Carolyn has managed and led the club's masters team to consistent Aussie title wins over a number of years. Congratulations Carolyn.

This season the competition area was led by Competition Director, Helen Deas and Assistant Competition Director, Sharon Deans. They have done a remarkable job and introduced a range of reforms that put the competition area in good stead for the next few seasons.

At Aussies this year, the club came 6th in the Masters with 133 points, and 19th in the Opens with 30 points. At the NSW State championships at Swansea Belmont, the club came 4th in the Masters with 204 points and 9th in the Opens with 112 points. The club came 3rd in the NSW State Age Championships with 168 points. At Branch the club came 3rd in the Masters with 179 points; 7th in the Opens/Lifesaving Championships with 155 points; and 2nd in the Age Championships with 263 points.

This year our Australian champions all emanated from our Masters team and include Rona Macniven, Renee Gibbs, Sharon Deans, Elisha Smith, Phil Pettit, Jo Emery, Carolyn Martin, Linda Walsh, Helen Deas, Sharon Deans, and Wendy Pepper. Congratulations to our Masters on this marvelous achievement. In recognition of their accomplishments, and those of past Masters champions, a new honour board will be placed in the Memorial Hall this season.

In November 2018, the club sent a team of ten to the World Surf Life Saving Titles in Adelaide. Congratulations to the following competitors who are now proudly world champions - Chris Gately, Wendy Pepper, Jo Emery, Phil Pettit, Wendy Pepper, Linda Walsh, Helen Deas and Sharon Deans.

On behalf of a grateful club I thank the competitors, coaches, officials and supporters who contributed to another successful competition season for the two blues.

Minnows Captain Bec Waugh took over the reigns of our nippers this season. Under Bec's leadership, our junior members obtained 833 awards this season. It is always wonderful to see our beach come alive each Sunday morning with the laughter of kids learning to navigate the surf, ride boards and dive across the sand for flags. Our nippers continue to go from strength to strength and I thank the Minnows Committee, the age managers, age assistants and coaches for their wonderful work this season.

The club held numerous social events this season under the direction of Social Director Fiona McEwin including the Start of Season party on 14 October 2018, the Comedy Night on 9 November 2018, the Coogee Luau Competition Fundraiser on 2 February 2019, the 50 yr and 75 yr long service function on 26 April, the awards presentation and End of Season party on 5 May 2019, and of course the Annual Dinner on 24 May 2019.

Each year the club remembers those members who served and died in war and on operational service. This year, the club held its ANZAC commemoration on ANZAC morning following the dawn service. The ceremony was well attended by the Deputy Mayor Cr Danny Said, Cr Alexandra Luxford, Randwick Council General Manager Theresa Manns, and President of the Coogee Randwick Clovelly RSL sub-branch, David Cohan.



Thank you to David Park, Tony Waller and Doug Hawkins for organising this event once again. Lest we forget.

For more than 15 years the club has run its island swim carnival. The event is typically comprised of an 800m Junior Dash, which follows a circuit inside Coogee Bay, a 1km Splash and Dash, which follows a circuit inside Coogee Bay, and the historic 2.4km Island Challenge.

This season, the Coogee Island Challenge was held on Sunday 25 November 2018 and 14 April 2019. The November swim was held in difficult conditions and water temperatures that hovered around the 16 degree mark. The decision was made to reduce the length of the swim to 800m inside the bay. The April swim was held in much better conditions for the more than 1200 swimmers who competed on the day. Thank you to all the volunteers who assisted on the day.

This year the club continued its review of the club's constitution. The Rules Working Group, consisting of Life Member Gary Daly, Immediate Past President Mark Doepel and Public Officer, Catie Anderson, presented its report to the Management Committee this season. The Committee resolved to adopt a number of the working group's recommendations and the club is now working closely with law firm Clayton Utz to redraft the club's rules. These will be presented to club members for consultation over the next few months. I thank Gary, Mark and Catie for their work on this important project.

Earlier in the season, in accordance with SLSCA Member Protection Policy 6.05, the Management Committee formed its first Judiciary Committee and first Disciplinary Committee. The Grievance Committee consisted of

Chair Michael Barnes, and members Helen Deas, Jenny Todd, and Matt Fogarty. The Club's first Disciplinary Committee consisted of Chair Cilla Robinson, and members Mark Doepel, Matt Spooner and Nicola Logan. I'd like to thank each of these members for the difficult service they performed for the club this season.

The Kiosk opened a few days before Christmas 2018 and now sells ice creams and drinks to beachgoers on the promenade. It is turning over a tidy little profit for the club I congratulate Treasurer Paul Hinds on all he has done to make the kiosk a reality. I also thank the many junior members of our club who staff the kiosk on weekdays and over the weekends.

Club members continue to also serve the surf lifesaving movement at both a branch and state level. It is worth noting that club member George Shales is currently both the Sydney Branch and State President. Tony Waller currently serves as the State Director of Education. Doug Hawkins serves as the Branch Director of Junior Development. Matt Spooner serves as the Branch Manager Lifesaving. Matt Evans serves as the Branch Support Services Manager.

This season the club bade farewell to former Boat Vice Captain Andy Neal, 50 year long service member Andrew "Winkie" Winters OAM, 50 year associate Danny Groom, 50 year member and Aussie Champ Ken Key, 50 year long service member Paul Amundsen, former Club Surf Board Champion Peter Wilson, and 50 year long service member Thomas Hickey. The Coogee SLSC community offer its condolences to the family and friends of these long serving club members.

Our club would not be able to continue to operate without the support of its wonderful and longstanding sponsors and partners – the Coogee Bay Hotel, Randwick City Council and Sydney Credit Union. On behalf of our members I'd like to thank all of our sponsors and also the members of our Sponsorship Committee, particularly Committee Chair - Life Member and former President, Rob Yeldon.

I thank those unsung heroes that serve our members in the club office on Sunday mornings: Alison Bell, Jerry Berowne, Paul Chilcott, Alan Millar, Helen Murphy, Jenny Todd, and Lyn West. I thank those who assist with the Coffee Club: Glen Miller, George Cassimatis, David Park, and Lessel Davis.

I thank Tracey Bloxsom for the extraordinary administrative service she has provided our club during her time in the office. Over the years, Tracey has helped to make the club what it is today. She has been integral to so many initiatives that we take for granted, including the development of the club's weekly newsletter, the True Blue, the club's Annual Report, the club's Instagram and Facebook pages. Tracey leaves club employment for SLSCA employment and, on behalf of a grateful membership, I wish her all the best in the next stage of her career. I also thank our one and only Office Manager Karen Beale who continues to drive the club's administrative operations and functions area. I thank Assistant Secretary Troy Swan for his service to the lifesaving committee and assisting in the administration of the club; Public Officer Catie Anderson for her generous support; Rob Gibellini for his ongoing assistance to the club in sponsorship and other areas; the club Governors David 'Luna' Park and Tony Waller for their leadership and wise counsel; Andy Gardiner and Emma Gill for their leadership and management of our lifesavers; Club Treasurer Paul Hinds for managing the club's complicated financials; and Deputy President Tass Karozis for his leadership and for driving so many club initiatives like the Coogee Island Swim, Coogee Courage and the website rebuild.

This was the first season of Club President Matt Fernandez. From the very start of the season Matt was compelled to deal with a range of sensitive issues including club grievances, the opening of the club kiosk, the review of the club's rules, and the renovating of the clubhouse. All of this has required Matt to devote significant time, effort, diplomacy and emotional energy. He has been the rock in an otherwise stormy season and we are all lucky to have him. I thank him for his leadership this season, and to Saorla and Maeve for sharing him with us.

Finally, thank you to all our members. It is always wonderful to be surrounded by so many people who believe in civic duty – and who love the surf. I look forward to seeing you all on the beach next season.

Club Captain Report

I would like to acknowledge and pay tribute to our two brave colleagues, Ross and Andy Powell, who gave their lives in service at Port Campbell, Victoria.

Their selfless bravery and commitment to their community, club and Surf Life Saving is truly humbling. Our thoughts are with their family and friends as we reflect on our own season here.

Our season kicked off in typical fashion, with the annual gear inspection. Ably led by our Gear Steward, Andrew Tooher, we were well placed to start patrols on 29 September 2018 with Patrol 3 at the helm.

Many of our life savers had already completed their annual skills maintenance under the watchful eye and consummate organisational skills of our Proficiency Officer, Nikki Ozsdolay, and she and her team continued to support our members through the process to the end of the year.

Christmas and New Year came and went, with minimal incident. The increase in preventative actions by all the patrols certainly paid dividends,

with only 20 rescues needing to be performed over 23,984 hours of patrolling by our members.

A new initiative, "Command Leadership for Patrol Captains", was kicked off this season and provided our Patrol and Vice Captains with further training on incident and resource management, including the introduction on patrol of a command and incident board. This has proved to be a very useful tool for Patrol and Vice Captains, providing a quick overview of the status of the entire patrol at any given moment, including any incidents under management. We will look to build on this next season, but in the meantime would like to thank Club Governor Tony Waller for his time and input into this initiative.

Since September 2018, in addition to our regular patrols at Coogee, we have also been supporting Garie SLSC in the National Park. Garie has suffered from a decline in patrolling members

in recent years and it was agreed with the Sydney Branch that we would assist with patrols, along with other clubs in the branch. Coogee SLSC mounted patrols at Garie and covered an additional eight patrols on their behalf across the season, the most of any club in the branch.

I would like to thank all the members who took the time to travel to the National Park and represent Coogee SLSC on patrol at Garie Beach this season.

As the season came towards its conclusion, we wished our competitors luck in the nationals and moved to shorter patrol hours.

The life saving season was wrapped up with the annual Patrol Competition, which this year took on a new event, the pool inflatable challenge. I can confirm that paddling giant inflatable flamingos around a can is much harder than on a rescue board!

Congratulations to Sara Wilson and Patrol 4 who took out the Patrol of the Year Competition in impressive style.

Our life saving season officially closed on Sunday 28 April 2019 and I would like to thank all our patrolling and supporting members for their efforts this year, along with the Life Saving and Management Committees, the Club Executive and the Governors for all their support.

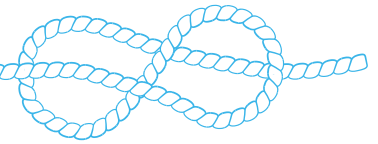

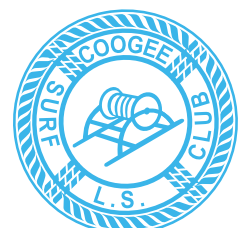

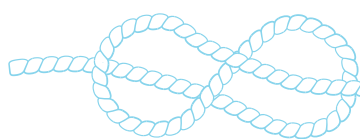

Chief Instructor's Report

I am pleased to report that the 2018-2019 season continued with success in the education area. This season we welcomed a record of 85 (previous season 72) new Surf Rescue Certificate and 130 (previous season 113) Bronze Medallion holders to the Club

Gold Medallion



This season we welcomed a record of 85 (previous season 72) new Surf Rescue Certificate and 130 (previous season 113) Bronze Medallion holders to the Club. These awards were more than any other Club in the Sydney Branch. Continuing on from this Coogee SLSC also achieved the highest number of Gold Medallion Awards (5), Resuscitation Certificate (41), Silver medallion Advanced First Aid (3), Pain Management (9), Rescue water Craft Operator Certificate (6), than any other Club in the Sydney Branch. Our overall awards for Coogee SLSC, including the Senior Club and the Minnows were 1263, the highest number in the Surf Life Saving Sydney Branch. In contrast, the second highest Club was only at 895, showing the strength Coogee SLSC has in Education.

Achieving such high skills through education is only possible with the tireless, selfless and enthusiastic efforts of the education team. I would like to thank the lead trainers for managing the various courses and the trainers who devoted their time to assisting them. I would like to thank Sean Bond for taking on the role of Assistant Chief

Instructor for the 2018-2019 season. Cameron Callaghan who continued leading the Thunder Bronze up-skilling the SRC holders to achieve their Bronze medallion. Emma Gill and Matthew Spooner started the season off by bringing their wealth of experience leading the Spring Bronze. Wayne Penn and Paul Stiff reunited to lead the Mum's and Dad's XXI Bronze Course that focussed on qualifying the Minnows parents to be actively involved in water safety and patrols. Doug Hawkins continued his tireless efforts by leading the Lightning Bronze, a course developed to allow members the opportunity to gain their Bronze Medallion in 10 continuous days. This was very favourable with school age participants who utilised school holidays in an enjoyable and productive way. I would like to thank Doug Hawkins for also assisting me with delivering the Surf Rescue Certificate to a record number of under 14s, and Resuscitation Certificate to the under 12s. This season also saw the new schedule for delivering the Resuscitation Award to the under 12s with half of the total group taking up this opportunity. Adam Treharne

and Fiona Phelps formed an amazing team, leading the Summer Bronze with never a dull moment. Doug Hawkins and James Campbell led the Dad's and Mum's Army XXII, which was the last bronze course for the season.

Higher Awards ensure that we continue providing the highest possible lifesaving standards to those visiting our beach. This season Craig Howie, who led the Advanced Resuscitation Techniques and Paul Stiff who delivered the Spinal Management Courses, delivered these higher awards. The IRB education team continued to be led by Andrew Tooher, Scott Parker and Poddie Crudden who excelled again this season by training 19 IRB Crew and six IRB drivers, both critical roles on patrol.

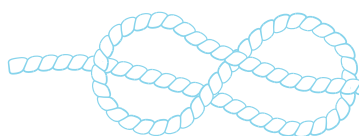
The highest Award obtainable in Surf Life Saving is the Gold Medallion, and this season I was privileged to be involved in training the squad. We had a total of six new members who were successful in obtaining this award for the first time. This is the most new Gold Medallion Awards in the Sydney Branch. Special congratulations go to Peter Harvie who participated in his 13th consecutive Gold Medallion assessment.

As there is still a large gap between the Bronze Medallion and the Gold Medallion, I was privileged to direct the Coogee Silver Medallion. The course included physical training in the pool and on the beach, and bridges the gap between the physical requirements needed to obtain the Bronze Medallion and those required for the Gold Medallion. The course also involved presentations on command and leadership at an incident by Tony Waller, support operations by Matt Spooner, Coogee SLSC traditions and history by David "Luna" Park, management of complex scenarios by George Fatseas, and mental health by Eri a Clinical Psychologist.

It was encouraging to see so many members achieving their personal goals from the Resuscitation Certificate, through the Bronze Medallion, higher awards up to the Gold Medallion. It was especially encouraging seeing some of the youth, Will Davison, Sean Bond and Rob Campbell that I have been involved with over several seasons achieving their Gold Medallion.

Competition Report



HELEN DEAS

The 2018-19 season has seen Coogee competitors strive individually and in teams across surf, beach, boats, craft, IRB, lifesaving, R and R, pool rescue and board riding. The season was about trying new ideas, with the focus on reinvigorating surf sports within the club.

One of the major focuses for the year was around the philosophy of 'one club' and bringing the different areas of the club together. This saw the pre-season training kick-ing off with 'Super Saturday' events. The theme of one club continued with both the senior club and the nippers wearing the same uniform for State and Australian titles for the season.

The Australian Championship was a silver affair for our open and youth teams, Coogee had 39 youth competitors with Ruby Thomasyu and Tom Gray both taking individual silver. Our Under 15 Mixed 5 person R and R of Ella, Maisie, Annika, Martina and Char-lotte and the U15 Female Beach relay of Ruby, Alex, Rosa and Ellie teams also achieved second place. In the Opens, the club

was represented by 50 competitors across beach, boats, surf, R and R and lifesaving. Both our men's and women's R and R teams narrowly missed out on the top gong, taking silver this year. Holly Abbey took silver on in the U17 beach sprint. Our boats had a mixed bag, with both the open men's and women's team just missing finals. Overall the team finished in nineteenth po-sition. Our master's team of 33 continued their strong performances all season with a number of gold medals in individual and team events. Many top six finishes helped the team to finish sixth overall on the master's point score.

The State Titles were contested at Swansea Belmont this season. Coogee was repre-sented by 35

masters and 41 Open competitors. Masters finished fourth overall and Opens, including the lifesaving competition, finished ninth. Our mighty minnows finished in third spot with less than 5 points separating the top three clubs.

This year saw the Sydney Branch masters and open reunited in a single carnival format. The event was held at Maroubra Beach in February. Our opens were represented in beach, water, R and R, boats, lifesaving events and surfing. Coogee fielded a team in the lifesaver relay, the first in many years. Overall results were third masters, seventh in opens and second in the Age Championships. Our club improved their placings in branch, state and Aussies across all age categories from the previous season, a tre-mendous result from all competitors.

World Rescue in November in Adelaide saw the Two Blues represented by ten masters, our IRB racing team and Holly Abbey in the Opens. There were plenty of medals in the pool, beach and water in conditions that ranged from hot to cold, to cyclonic winds and rain. Holly also represented the club in the Ocean Six series, with some outstanding results. The Annual Report details a full listing of all results across the season.

Our boat crews continue to grow in strength and numbers. They

targeted the South Coast Boats as well as Ocean Thunder events. There was some spectacular racing, and some expensive damage bills. Our beach runners, Masters and R and R teams have performed well at various events across the season. The full results from all carnivals is listed in the annual report.

Coogee Carnival saw major changes with a new date and format. This carnival was based on a 'fast three' format with a minimum of three races in each discipline based on ability rather than age or gender for water and beach. Traditional R and R and March Past were also held. Although numbers were down, it was well received by competitors.

Club championships were held in February. Coinciding with Minnows beach selections, the opens enjoyed the perfect beach track set up. With the beach closed by the life-guards, a second day in March for the water events as well as the Presidents Cup and Rose Shield. Club events saw the return of the anonymous donors as a Friday night twi-light. 35 competitors as individuals and the introduction of a team's event. Will Mison claimed victory in 19:28.

The club weekly surf race led by Tim Green saw a team of small team of regulars fight it out under Tim's dubious handicapping system. The Joe Seddon Cup for surfing was held at Era, with 28 competitors fighting for dominance of the waves, Joe Mison took out the shield. (is this correct?)

Three major fundraisers were

held during the season. The comedy night in November and the Lifesaver Luau with the band the Locos were competitor events with a focus on fun as well as a chance to bring competitors together. Thank you to Allison Roberts and Linda Walsh for putting these events together. Chimes and his Sports Lunch again provided to be a huge success in terms of valuable fundraising dollars to support the increasing costs of competition for the club.

Thank you to the sponsorship committee for your much-needed dollars for competition. A special mention to our major sponsors Randwick Rugby Foundation, Coogee Bay Hotel, SCU and Randwick City Council.

To enable our members to compete at carnivals, we have been supported in a huge way by our IRB team led by Scott Parker and Poddy Crudden. A huge vote of thanks to the IRB crews and drivers, Officials and First Aid volunteers.

I would like to formally acknowledge and thank our coaches who have provided countless hours of service to the club. Michael Parsons, Warwick Everingham, Michael Scroop, Chris Gately, Andrew McEncroe, Blair Chapman, David Smith, Matt, Leary, Harvey Barrett, Paul Beale, Julien LaRosa and Rod Colman.

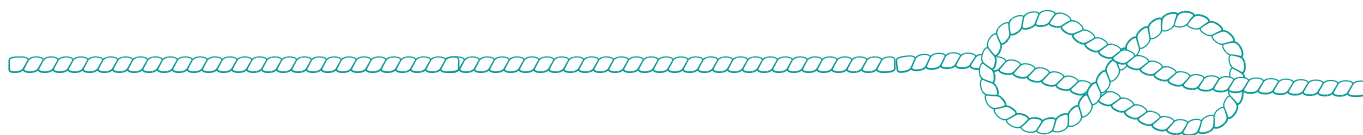
Working together achieves so much more. My amazing deputy Comp Director Sharon Deans has been a sounding board, team player and amazing friend. Thank you.

A 3rd at state Surf carnival and 2nd at branch carnival, a third season of Coogee Dippers, 18 age managers surviving the year, some tears as well as lots of laughs.

Our boy and girl captains this year: Sarah Pignatelli and Pat Kavanagh you are a credit to yourselves, your families and above all Coogee Minnows. It has been a pleasure watching both of you grow in leadership this season and I hope it has left a positive mark on your lives.

Now to my first season.....An initiation of sorts, I have learnt so much and to all, I have done my best. My thanks to Steve O'Donnell for his counsel and friendly ear at 9pm on a Thursday.

In early May last year the season preparations got underway. With the assistance of my husband Warwick Waugh and Michael Kavanagh new board racks were designed and installed into the boat shed. This year it was Clovelly's turn to host the Randwick shield at South Maroubra. The Carnival atmosphere shield was a non-competitive day to encourage kids thinking about surf sports to have a go. The 2019/2020 season will see Coogee Host the Randwick Shield. The plan between the Randwick Branch clubs is to continue to go to South Maroubra but to have a different club be the host each season. I am sure Coogee will do an outstanding job leading the shield next season.

Our SRC group was the biggest yet with 85 candidates under the guidance of trainers Doug Hawkins and George Fatseas and Age Managers Gary Trenaman and Tony Boyd plus many parent helpers

We finished 2018 with the Coogee Minnows Christmas Party and annual visit from Santa rowed in by our Coogee female boat crew. The excitement of the kids as the surf boat rode a wave in was a joy to behold as were the pork rolls and cold beers.

The Sydney Branch development camps were attended by a number of our boys and girls from our U11 and U13 age groups, plus age managers and parents. Thankyou to Sydney Branch and Doug Hawkins for the amazing work you do in this development space for youth.

The January Minnows Surf Camp was another roaring success and was well supported by Minnows and parents and the competitors from the Coogee Senior Club as well as our newly graduated SRCs.

John Mudge Day and lifesaving skills, including our under 11s competing in their own lifesaving competition dominated the start of 2019 on the beach at Coogee.

The results of Coogee Minnows Surf Sports this season are a reflection of the the competitions teams vision, effort and passion. Coogee Minnows achieved a 2nd at Sydney Branch carnival and 3rd place at the State carnival. A result we have not seen in the last ten years.

Not only was the State result one of the highlights for me but also the humbling work of our volunteers with the Coogee Dippers Program for kids with Autism. A huge thank you to Erika Gleeson and her team for allowing us to be a part of an amazing program. A huge thank you to all of the volunteers from our club, it is so beautiful to see families helping out.

We are losing some committee member and I want to make special mention of some of these people, Ian Davison will step down to an assistant treasurer role. He has done an incredible

job over the last seven seasons, managing the financials of this program is a big job and Ian does it with so much class, he is the voice of reason, the confidence behind decisions and a true leader on the minnows management committee. Personally Ian thank you, I have learnt so much and you have given your time unconditionally.

Sue Lever has been our secretary for over two seasons and nothing is ever a problem with Sue, she just gets the job done.

Competition Report

2018/19 was a remarkable season for the Minnows Competition team, which placed 2nd overall in the Sydney Branch carnival in early February and 3 weeks later the State team achieved 3rd place in the NSW Age Titles at Blacksmiths Beach, Swansea Belmont, only 5 points behind the overall winners, Cooks Hill. Coogee were the highest placed team from Sydney Branch at NSW Age.

Building on the work in recent years where Coogee had placed just inside the top 10 at the NSW Age Titles, this was a very significant achievement. This was largely on the back of the sand team winning the overall point score in their area for the second year running and the R&R team finishing 2nd in their overall point score and winning a medal in every division. The final result of 168 points included 9 Gold medals, 10 Silver medals and 7 Bronze medals.

This season, Coogee competed in carnivals at Queenscliff, Cronulla, Elouera, North Narrabeen, Manly, Maroubra and Swansea Belmont. All played important roles in honing and developing skills, building team work and having the team competition ready in the big end of season carnivals. The competitors consistently competed in the right spirit of sportsmanship and respect; they were wonderful ambassadors for the Two Blues of Coogee. By NSW Age Titles, the feeling from all involved was that we were one big community supporting each other and this does not happen by chance.

Further, these results were borne of the incredible dedication and effort of our competitors, both in training and competition, all season long, along with the programs put in place by our coaches and their passion in delivering them. Head coaches, Renee Gibbs on sand and Cameron Habler in the water, have invested enormous amounts of personal time and commitment to developing and implementing these programs, for which we are all grateful. To be the premier team in NSW on the sand for two years running now is testament to the dynamic program that Renee oversees for our sand athletes. Renee does not train our kids to win medals but to reach their potential to be the best they can be. The way they compete with respect and a smile, genuinely enjoying



themselves is a credit to Renee and the coaches and something for which the whole club should be very proud and thankful. Many people contributed to the overall success of the sand team this season, none more than Renee.

A huge thank you to Bec Waugh and the Minnows committee for their trust and support.

In the background, a small army of parents facilitated the training and participation at carnivals, so thank you to those that provided Water Safety, helped Officiate at carnivals, provided First Aid, IRB support and those that managed and chaperoned the competitors. Special thanks to the 4 parents who undertook the significant training to become an accredited Official (Emily Ashcroft, Gary Gregory, Adrian Janschek and Pdraig Hogan), the 6 parents and 1 older-sibling who did First Aid Training and finally, our tent and gear transporters, the Sheldon and the Curry families, who made major contributions to our enjoyment of carnivals.

One of the most pleasing aspects of this season has been the development of all key areas of competition to the extent that Coogee were in a position to enter a team in all events at NSW Age Titles this year, including all divisions of R&R, all water events in each age group and a March Past team for the first time in recent memory.

The expansion of the competition area over the past 3 years has resulted in our number of entrants to carnivals increasing such that we had 151 competitors at Branch and 124 entered for State Age Titles. 3 years ago there were no R&R or March Past competitors, this year there were 17 at NSW Age Titles. The sand team now has a team in every gender and mixed relay event and in 4 instances we have 2 teams in the same event with the nominal B team capable of making a State final, and all did so. The water area was not capable of entering all team events in prior years but is so now. Thank you to Jen Trinca for her work in managing the R&R group and developing a March

Past team from within that group. It was a highlight of the NSW Age Titles for many to see Coogee team march on finals day.

Thank you to Michael Johnson and Sheila Royles for taking responsibility for our Officials group which involves training our new Officials, organising the requisite number for each carnival necessary for us to compete and also acting as the liaison between the organisers and our own Officials, making sure our team are informed and compliant with what is required.

The Competition season in review

Before the season proper started, the sand competitors diligently worked their way through a pre-season from August to October. During this time, the Competition Handbook was updated for 2018-19 and the Competition group came together for the Information night in September to hear about the developments taking place to improve the overall program for the coming season. The core of the program was built around the sand training program incorporating specialised clinics that had worked so well the previous year and an expanded training program for water competitors. New initiatives included a dedicated long-distance sand running training group, coached by Michael Scroop, one of Coogee's distinguished Masters competitors, planned workshops to help in areas of nutrition and mental preparation, and the opportunity to do a weekly Pilates session with Deanne Scroop.

The carnival program was changed somewhat from lessons learned the previous year and the first carnival attended was the Queenscliff carnival in late October for sand athletes only. We were the only club to participate from outside the northern beaches but certainly made our presence felt, so much so that at times Officials were heard to murmur that it was like the Coogee club championships with so many of our caps filling places in finals. Next stop was Randwick Shield, a chance for newcomers and those unsure about competition to give competing a go as well as an opportunity for the water athletes to compete in the challenging conditions of South Maroubra. The main events at Randwick Shield are the All Age Relay where we got our first look at the emerging powerhouse of South Maroubra who narrowly defeated our team. The Robbo relay was also held in a mix of sand and water legs and it

was the closest in recent memory, with Coogee coming 3rd but only a matter of seconds behind 1st and 2nd place. This carnival was good preparation for our water competitors who attended their first proper carnival at Cronulla Short course a couple of weeks later. It was held under grey skies in decent conditions and much was learnt from this carnival, particularly for our under 9s, competing on boards and in the swim in conditions very different to Coogee, and also the under 14s team who were competing on the racing mals for the first time.

The Sydney Branch team for the NSW Interbranch representative carnival was selected in November based on prior results, current trial form and early season carnival results. Yasmeen Janschek and Seb Elizondo deservedly gained selection to this team which participated in this carnival, held on the second weekend in December on the North Coast. A great reward for their dedication and efforts in surf sports competition.

Ohana at Elouera 8/12/18

The Coogee team attended a terrific carnival at Elouera on Saturday 8/12/18, where, for the first time this season, Coogee arrived with a full squad of water and sand athletes and the 14s were able to compete with us after finishing their SRC.

Weather was superb, water conditions were very good, and the only showers encountered were of medals on the sand and in the water. Just as importantly, there were many wins without medals, particularly in the big surf and competitors that managed to complete the board or swim course in challenging conditions are to be congratulated for their achievement. The sand team once again dominated starting with a win in the All Age Relay and continuing through the flag and sprint events where most finals had multiple Coogee competitors. In the relays, the inclusion of tight lanes made things a little tricky but it was all a great experience for the bigger carnivals ahead.

The small but well-prepared 1km/2km team achieved 2 golds, Finnian Burns and Katherine Johnson, along with many top 5 placings.

For all the sand athletes, it was a great chance to put into practice all the education and training so far this season and it is a credit to the effort of the kids and the coaches the great results achieved on the day.

The water team had a terrific day as well, starting with the All Age Board Relay of Jasper W, Annabelle H, Ben P, Zoltahn S, Max M and Ava S competed well, kept in touch with the leaders and took a good scalp in beating Maroubra home. The water team won many medals but the highlights were the 3 gold medals won by Alexia Z in the u12 girls swim, Max M in the u13 boys swim and Ben F and Joel B in the u14 Board Rescue.

North Narrabeen Carnival 16/12/18

It was another great day of competition on the Northern Beaches, where, like Queenscliff earlier in the season, we took on the might of the Sydney Northern Beaches clubs.

Fabulous weather and a magnificent set up awaited. A football field size patch of flat sand, with 2 running tracks side by side and 4 flag pits meant non-stop action and allowed for the spectacle of 19 relay teams competing side by side in their own lane in the All Age Relay, where Coogee had 5 of the teams entered. Virtually every kid got a run and Coogee finished 3rd, 5th and 6th!

Highlights from the day were the gold medals won by Jack Johnson (u11 1km race), Matilda LeBard (u9 girls sprint and flags), Emma Haley (u10 girls flags), Sienna Durante (u12 girls flags), Seb Elizondo (u12 boys flags), Annabel Penny (u13 girls sprint), Yasmeen Janschek (u13 girls flags), Luke Avati (u13 boys sprint), Finn Wilkie (u13 boys flags), Stella Odgers (u14 girls sprint), Max Tanner (u14 boys sprint and flags), along with many relay golds. Thanks to our merry band of Officials, who helped run the carnival so smoothly and got us off the sand at 11.30am with enough time to get back for the Coogee Minnows Christmas Party in the clubhouse.

Manly Nipper Nats Carnival 20/1/19

70 Coogee Minnows competitors ventured over the bridge on Sunday 20/1/19 to compete as a full team at the prestigious and highly competitive Manly Nipper Nats carnival.

Conditions were excellent, clean lines and enough swell to make it interesting, lots of beach space and well laid out tracks in wait for the Coogee team.

This is a very high level carnival and in many events the fields were as deep and talented as you would find at NSW State Age Titles, which gave all our competitors a great opportunity to

Sydney Branch Carnival at Maroubra Beach 9-10/2/19

The Coogee Competition Team ventured to Maroubra Beach to compete in the Sydney Branch carnival over the weekend 9th and 10th of February. This is a very high-level carnival where 8 of the top 13 teams from State Championships 2018 were competing. Coogee Minnows was able to enter individuals in ALL disciplines and Age Groups of R&R, March Past, Board Riding, 1km/2km Run, Sand and Water Competition.

It was a successful day for our competitors with the R&R team winning a gold, silver and bronze medal, the board riders a gold and bronze and the March Past gaining 5th place in their first ever attempt at the event (full results details below).

On Sunday, the first event under way was the 1km/2km runs, where Coogee were prominent, followed by an incredibly close All Age Relay event where the Coogee team of Roman Szabo, Bae Gilligan, Evie Bowie, Ollie Sheldon, Ronan Sheppard, Eden Levit and Kane Sheppard came a very close 4th in a finish that saw the top 4 teams

hit the line within a couple of metres of each other, a great hit out with State Age in 3 weeks and timely lessons learned.

In the water, unfortunately the u9s and u10s water was cancelled and the u11s and u12s water competitors had a long delay before they started, the U13s and u14s water were moved to the south end of the beach and program revised to bring Iron Man and Board Rescue events forward as they are State Age qualification events.

The All Age Board relay got things under way in the water and Coogee put in a creditable performance, the team were in the mix all the way finishing 8th. Well done to our representatives Jacob Moynihan, Angus Folsom, Ben Pignatelli, Zoltahn Szabo, Max Moylan and Joel Baldwin. With those relays over it was into the carnival proper. The sand team, particularly on the track in the sprints and relays proved a potent force and many medals were won. Pleasingly, the relay combinations were great and this is where Coogee separated itself from the other clubs as can be seen in the results below.

NSW State Age Titles at Blacksmiths Beach Swansea-Belmont 1st to 3rd March 2019

On the weekend, 1st to 3rd March, Coogee sent a team of 124 competitors up to Swansea Belmont to compete in the NSW State Age Championships, the highest-level carnival that we can participate in as nippers. Around 100 surf clubs from NSW were represented and nearly 3000 nippers competed in all areas of Surf Sports competition.

Conditions were terrific, the swell was testing, and the competition was intense over the 3 days. Our competitors represented the Coogee Two Blue cap with pride and distinction. After a good start on Friday, Team Coogee hit the afterburners on Saturday and powered ahead of all other competition to be the surprise leader on 103 points when action stopped on Saturday night. On Sunday, finals day on the sand and in the water, Coogee continued to achieve brilliant results and as the carnival drew to a close there was a sense of anticipation that any one of 3 or 4 clubs could win the overall trophy and Coogee was in the mix. When the final points tally was announced at the end of the carnival, Coogee had amassed 168 points, which placed us 3rd in NSW, just 5 points behind Cook's Hill Surf Club, who finished on 173 points and were declared Champion Club for NSW (Newport was 2nd on 170 points). Coogee has not placed in the top 5 in the last decade, so this was an amazing result and the culmination of a lot of hard work in training and preparation by all our competitors along with great support by our coaches, managers and parent volunteers.

Coogee was the champion team in sand events and 2nd in the R&R

pointscore. The results that were achieved are a credit to our competitors, coaches and the team spirit.

One of the highlights for many was the team dinner on Friday night, where over 300 team members and supporters gathered like a family at Caves Beachside Hotel to celebrate the season, the results of the day and look forward to the competition ahead.

This was the end of the competitive season for most of the team except the U14s who continued to train and prepare for The Australian Surf Lifesavings Championships at North Burleigh in Queensland at the end of March, their first time competing at national level.

Before signing off, I would like to personally thank the following people for their wonderful help and contribution to the collective efforts of the Competition group. Cameron Habler, Renee and Steve Gibbs, Bec Waugh, Aidan Byrne, Scott Moylan, Steve Quinn, Sheila Royles, Michael Johnson, Tony Sheppard, Michael Scroop, Trevor Folsom, Jenny Trinca, Elisha and Craig Curry, Josh Hankin, Brendan Lee, Gerard Pignatelli, Glenn and Jacqui Sheldon. Coogee Dippers

Coogee Dippers program is a collaboration between the Coogee SLSC club and Autism Swim; and is an eight week modified nippers and surf awareness program for children and young adults with a range of disabilities.

This year was the third year the program has run, and it's safe to say it gets better and better every year. With numbers capped at around 26 participants per program, the program's success is reinforced through the extensive wait list that the program has for joining. Each participant is allocated a primary helper and at least 1 additional water safety, to support them to reach their goals. Some of these goals include: understanding when to go over and under a wave, putting face under the water, engaging in activities with others, developing relationships, turn taking, treading water, functional swim stroke, board riding and surf survival skills (to name just a few).

Children with autism (and disabilities broadly speaking) are at such incredibly high risk of drowning. There are a multitude of reasons as to why this is the case, however two that

are most relevant to the work of the Dippers program include:

1. Often children with autism have difficulties with Generalisation, which means they may not be able to generalise skills learned in one environment (e.g. a pool) to another environment (e.g. the beach). So exposure and reinforcement of these skills in different environments is imperative; and

2. Without programs such as Dippers being facilitated, these high-risk individuals may never have the opportunity to participate in surf education lessons, as mainstream programs do not cater to their needs.

Whilst the skills which were developed were astounding to say the least, perhaps consistently the greatest achievement of the program is the relationships which are formed and the community which is strengthened. Parents connect with one another over

free coffee supplied by the Local Café CaliPress, heart-warming bonds are formed between the club helpers and the participants, and the beach just beams with happiness and warmth on a Sunday morning.

This program requires up to seventy helpers on a Sunday morning. The volunteers at Coogee come from our Minnows Program (under 14) right through to our Long Service members of the club. It has been a major connectivity glue to bring members of our Surf Life Saving movement together and has seen Mothers and daughters, patrol captains and SRC new graduates working together to make the Sunday morning program fun for these kids.

Many of the helpers have been involved since the first year, and comment that this program is the highlight of their calendar - so there is no denying the fact that the helpers get just as much out of the program as the participants.

The partnership between Coogee SLSC and Autism Swim is an incredibly strong and important one on so many levels, and together we look forward to continuing to build the Dippers program from strength to strength.

- Congratulations to our 2018 graduating SRC's, you made it through after close to 10 years of Nippers! With the assistance (and patience) of their trainers, Age Managers, and parents, our 84 graduates are now qualified to take to the beach and assist in protecting us, our children and the wider community. Training this size squad is an amazing accomplishment as well as a logistical feat so a very impressive result. Hard work and dedication of students and those educators saw this great achievement completed again this year so well done to everyone.

- Once again we were thrilled to be able to work with Autism Swim and assist in the facilitating of the "Dippers" program for what is now its third year. The Dippers program is designed to assist children with Autism to have fun on the beach and in the water in a safe and controlled environment. Some of these children formerly refused to even step onto

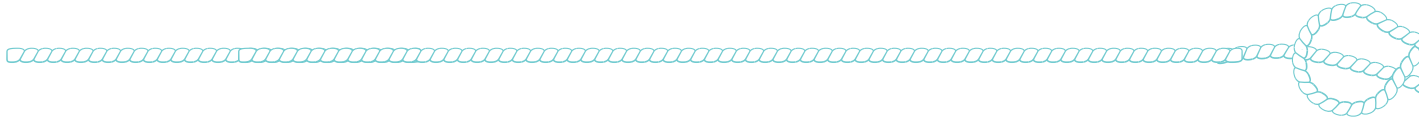


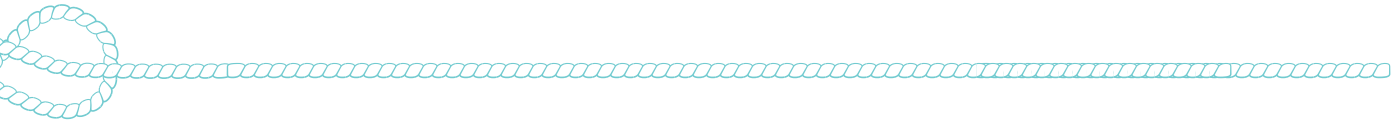

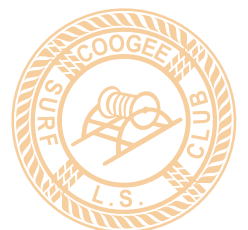

Coogee Island Challenge

A tremendous effort from all the Coogee volunteers who put in massive hours and tireless work to execute one of the club's biggest revenue generators.

The two swims this season could not have been more different.

In November, despite strong registrations in the lead up, the day of the swim brought in a cold swell that dipped below 16 degrees, and one of the best shore dumps Coogee has seen. A cautions assessment of the conditions led to a late start for the elite group and first three waves of competitors, however continued assessment noted that even our hardened swimmers were finding the conditions tough. This created a pause to the following waves and eventually the reassessment meant that, for the safety of our competitors and for the Coogee Club members assisting with water safety, the event had to be reduced to an 800m swim for anyone still willing to give it a go. The controversial decision brought some criticism but was made in the best interest of competitors and volunteers.

The April swim could not have been more different. The small

number of pre-registered swimmers were met with a glorious April morning of warm seas and flat conditions. The competitors flocked. This meant that registrations doubled to a near record 1259 competitors over the three swims. At the 10am start the southerly hit the back of the Island which meant a calm swim for the first kilometre then some chop out the back but a beautiful tailwind for the final stretch from "the southy" to the finish line. It was a perfect event that was finally challenged by an unaccounted swimmer, who failed to start in the first place. The huge registration numbers more than offset the poor results from November

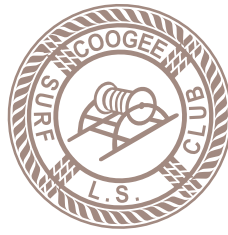
thousand-odd local kids that turn up has been a pleasure that he feels proud to have been able to do.

Finance



Our club manages its resources in order to support its members when patrolling, competing, learning, training or teaching. The responsible management of our club's finances remains a key plank of our club's success.



Treasurer's Report



PAUL HINDS

The Club reported an Operating Surplus of \$2,338 which compared to a Surplus of \$17,677 last financial year. Whilst not a fantastic result, in light of the weakness in some of our key revenue lines as well as some unexpected spend throughout the year, the Club has performed admirably to reign in costs elsewhere and deliver a positive operating result. As can be expected, there were a number of swings and roundabouts throughout the year, with the key features as follows:

Member Subscriptions fell 1.6%. The Senior Club delivered another year of solid growth in memberships to be up 3%, however, this was more than offset by a 5% decline in Minnows subscriptions.

External Funding. Donations were down principally due to the Inner Reef Raffle not being undertaken this season. Sponsorship was weaker, although progress has already been made to rectify this situation for FY20. ClubGrants continued the softer trend of prior years and are becoming a diminishing funding source for our Club.

Club Ventures

- Following two near record Coogee Island Swims in the prior season, the combined profit from both Island Challenge Swims in FY19 fell \$17.8K. The weaker result was by no means a reflection of the team coordinating both events. What it does reinforce is the highly variable nature of the Swim's earnings profile, with the November 2018 event significantly impaired by poor weather.
- Ocean Room Profit was up \$21.7K from last year, largely benefiting from savings on wages.
- The Sportspersons Lunch delivered another bumper profit to be up \$5K compared to last year, highlighting **Steve Gillis** amazing commitment to the major funding source of our Australian Titles touring team. Long may the event continue and long may Steve be acknowledged for his enduring dedication to the Coogee SLSC.

- The Lifesaving teams supporting our various education courses continue to grow their contribution to the Club, with income up \$6K from the prior season.

Other Earnings. Interest earned on our Cash and Term Deposits is up \$3.7K over the year, due to sourcing higher interest rate accounts for our term deposits and investing the \$270K (net of GST) NSW Club Infrastructure Grant since October 2018.

And finally some annoying issues which impacted FY19:

- In this financial year, the newly reopened Kiosk reported a breakeven result, burdened by un-required insurance costs of \$3.3K (which have been discontinued) and \$4.5K spent on barista specification stainless steel benches. The good news is these costs will be absent in future seasons, suggesting the Kiosk should become a reasonable earnings contributor to the Club going forward.
- A ransomware attack in January 2019 cost \$4.5K in IT system repairs.
- \$2.5K was spent on uncollected and non-recyclable trophies for the November Island Swim.
- \$25K of repairs & maintenance spend was fully expensed in FY19 however \$18.2K of grants (NSW Office & Sport for \$13.2K and NSW Department of Infrastructure for \$5K) which were tied to these works was recognised as revenue in the 2018 financial year.

Another key feature of the FY19 result which must be discussed is the charge for Staff Leave Provisions and Costs. As part of a review into our accounting and payroll systems it has emerged that the Club has not been appropriately accounting for its obligations to our employees. Given we have had one full time employee for 17 years and a casual/permanent part time employee for 11 years, the Club's liability for Annual Leave and Long

Service Leave had grown to \$46.4K. So as to ensure we are compliant with our various regulatory requirements and providing full and transparent financial accounts, we have had expense this item through the Income Statement to build a Provision for Annual and Long Service Leave on Balance Sheet. Going forward we will be expensing a significantly lower amount of ~\$2K per annum, reflecting the yearly increase in this liability.

A review of the Balance Sheet suggests our Club remains in a sound financial position, highlighted by the Net Asset and Net Cash position. A new feature of the Balance Sheet is the inclusion of a \$270K Payable, representing the costs expected to be incurred via the NSW Club Infrastructure Grant. Of course, there has been a commensurate \$270K increase in Financial Assets as these cash proceeds have been invested in a term deposit with the Sydney Credit Union, whilst we await commencement of the redevelopment project.

Following a year of significant change I would like to take the opportunity to thank **Karen Beale** and **Greg Middleton** for their contributions to the Club. The Governors, **Tony** and **Luna**, must be acknowledged for their undying commitment to Coogee SLSC as well as their welcome counsel. Also special mentions to **Rob Yeldon** and **Robert Gibberlini**, not just for their essential roles in managing Sponsorship and Grants, but for their mentorship and guidance on a broad range of issues over the past season. And finally to the Executive, it has been an interesting year on many levels but you are all to be congratulated for your continued efforts and teamwork in leading the Club forward.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

We communicate with the Management regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

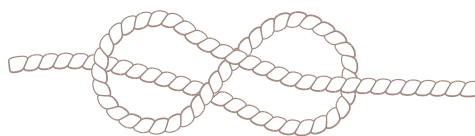

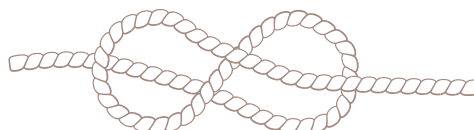

Will be missed by his family and friends.

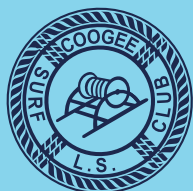
PETER WILSON, CLUB SURF BOARD CHAMPION
