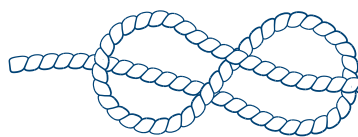
Nominations are now called for the Office Bearers of the Club for the season 2020-2021.

Building Committee Report



TONY WALLER & MATT SCANLON

As we write this report the largest renovation of our Clubhouse has commenced. On the 1st April 2020, our Clubhouse was handed over to Randwick City Council as Project Managers for the works to commence.



In the preceding months, the Building Committee had been meeting fortnightly with the Council and architects, Allen Jack & Cottier, to finalise designs and to select the successful building company, which was done by public tender.

The winner of the tender was Xenia, who has experience in building in marine environments and with providing high quality architectural finishes.

The great relationship with Xenia, our architects, and Council has ensured the project has gone ahead even though the pandemic was kicking into full gear. There were concerns about being able to source building materials, let alone tradesmen to complete the works during this period. Thankfully, it has not been an issue.

Key features of the design will ensure our Clubhouse maximises all of our limited floor space to best effect.

Design features include:

- An elevator from street level that will allow disability access to both the Ocean Room and the Memorial Hall.
- Rest rooms that meet Australian standards for use by the disabled.
- A revamp of our fire safety system throughout the entire building

meaning we will make full compliance as a Class 9B building.

- The Ocean Room will be able to be divided from 1 to 4 rooms to enable multiple training sessions and meetings being conducted at the same time. Special acoustic folding walls will be custom built to achieve this function. Each room will have its own audio-visual system.

- Floor space in the Ocean Room will increase and will allow for up to 220 people to be seated for major functions. Accordingly, the bar and kitchen space will be moved to the southern end of the building and made larger to cater for this increase. This will also allow “back of house” access for our caterers via the old caretaker’s room.

- The Office will be repositioned to the South Eastern corner. The old office floor and walls will be raised to the same height as the Ocean Room and will give us views of the beach.

- A new veranda with glass balustrading and bi-fold doors will be fitted on the eastern side of the Ocean room for most of the length of the room.

- Air conditioning shall also be installed.

- Downstairs will see a full-length concrete veranda being installed along with a seawall below the gym to protect it from heavy seas. A new doorway will be

installed to the gym as well as a stairway direct to the carpark from the southern end of the Club. This will ensure access to the gym without interrupting any training being conducted in the memorial hall.

- The entire outside of the Clubhouse will be repainted.

During the course of the year it was found that there were some weaknesses/faults in the sandstone cliffs on which our Club was built which necessitated remedial work being undertaken at the same time as our renovation. This was both expensive and necessary and we again thank our Randwick City Councillors, the General Manager, and her staff for their ongoing support in finding the necessary funds for these works to go ahead.

The Building Committee thanks the Management Committee and our members for their ongoing support during the necessary lock out of the Club to ensure these works are completed in a timely and safe manner.

At this time, we are on budget, and on schedule for a mid-November hand over from the Builders with an expected opening to members on the 1st December 2020.

I was under no illusion as to what this position involved, and, despite the massive fallout from COVID-19 I have remained on track and positive about our future. As this report goes to print, our club has been voted in the top five in Sydney Branch and our financial results are being signed off with a small profit, an amazing effort from all involved, despite a drastically shortened season.

No Lives Lost on our beach is something that we should all be immensely proud of. Congratulations to our army of 769 patrolling members, Lifesaving and Education teams led by our experienced Club Captain and Honour Blazer recipient, Andy Gardiner. It is pleasing to see a 40% increase in 100% patrol proficiency numbers. Our club is also helping to keep Garie Beach in the Royal National Park safe. Again, Andy led the way on this with six extra patrols. Our volunteers are so full of energy and professionalism as well as being highly educated nowadays. Thank you to some of our most important leaders in the club – Patrol Captains & Vice-Captains. Your influence on others is immense.

Coogee gained the most awards in

Sydney Branch (1,263). Great work once again by George Fatseas and Doug Hawkins. Our frequent trainers never stop working and burnout is a very real danger. Our club needs many more volunteer trainers to step up so an equitable sharing of this workload can be achieved.

It is heartening to see 74 new SRC's and 95 "Bronzies" graduate this season and the very high retention rates from our Minnows' ranks. I am a firm believer of the benefits to our club's culture of organic growth and retention through our youth membership. Keeping our kids engaged from U6's to teens and into their twenties is a big challenge. Great to see our Minnows leaders Bec Waugh, and now Steve Gibbs, thinking strategically on this issue and delivering kids into the senior club that are growing in confidence to become valuable lifesavers and competitors. Another positive is the growing involvement of parents and the family culture that surrounds Coogee SLSC.

The renovation of the top floor bar, function, training and meeting rooms space is a huge step towards Coogee

becoming financially self-sufficient. I am excited that this project is well underway and should be open for business early in 2021. On behalf of all Coogee SLSC members, I sincerely thank the NSW Government, Randwick City Council and Surf Lifesaving NSW for their generous financial support for this project. RCC have also project managed this renovation from concept to completion. Two of our valued members, Matt Scanlon and Tony Waller have driven this project over the last three years. From our members, deep gratitude.

When the negativity surrounding COVID-19 passes, our Coogee SLSC Foundation will be launched. This will provide a sensible and well managed vehicle for our club to receive income from generous members, benefactors, sponsors and corporate donors into the future. Many thanks go out to our Foundation Committee members led by Chair Mark Doepel who adds experience, expertise and counsel like no other.

Mark has also delivered a completely re-written club Constitution. He has

worked tirelessly on this complex document for three years. Others who assisted in a big way include Gary Daly, Pat Garcia and sectional leaders. Our modern Constitution now complies with all Statutory & Regulatory bodies and, most importantly, contains our club's values.

Competition was cut short this season by COVID-19, but we still managed to shine. Our Minnows achieved a record 2nd placing overall at the State Championships, Masters 5th and Open's 8th. Hats go off to all of our members who have taken the disappointment of a cancelled Aussie Titles on the chin. Our boaties took a double blow this season with the cancellation of the George Bass Marathon held on the Far South Coast of NSW. Our club is so proud of our members who pitched in to assist the local communities and Bermagui SLSC (refer to an amazing letter of thanks elsewhere in this report). To Competition Director Greg Smart and outgoing Minnows Captain Bec Waugh and their dedicated teams – amazing results through sheer hard work.

This season marks the 40th anniversary celebration of Women in Lifesaving. Coogee SLSC was one of the first clubs to embrace women back in 1980 and are proud that our club has prospered since then with many female Australian Champions, valuable life savers and club leaders amongst its ranks.

Coogee Surf Club was proud to nominate eight outstanding members, teams and for Club of the Year in the Sydney Branch Awards of Excellence. I am happy to announce that Doug Hawkins was voted Trainer of the Year, an extremely well deserved award for someone whose workload and pride in Coogee SLSC is second to none. Additionally, Coogee was given credit for most awards in Sydney Branch for

season 2019-20.

My sincere thanks go out to all club sponsors. They are our No 1 supporters and partners. Many thanks to Olivia Gardiner who took on the role of Sponsorship Co-Ordinator this season. Olivia successfully engaged existing and introduced new partners to our club. In addition, Olivia was also the co-ordinator and author of our brand new five-year Strategic Plan 2019-24 delivered earlier this season.

This season has been a bumpy ride for our functions trading. Impending renovations, staff changes and COVID-19 shutdowns have severely impaired our earnings. Despite this, our Bar Manager and Licensee Simon "Faf" Figures and Social Co-Ordinator Lachie Blair managed to keep our Sunday bar and some revived member functions trading strongly. Our Season Opener, NRL Grand Final and Australia Day functions were record earners.

Coogee's Ocean Events Team has taken some big hits from COVID-19, with our April Island Challenge Swim and maiden Run-Swim Biathlon being cancelled. Our November Island Challenge was very well supported with nearly 1000 swimmers. Many thanks to Sharon Deans and her team for their professionalism and new ideas for future events.

Secretary's Report

Volatile. Uncertain. Complex. Ambiguous. This season has been like no other. The sheer level of disruption experienced by our members and communities has been unprecedented. With fires, floods and COVID-19 it felt like there was no “normal” in our 2019-20 season. As a club we came together, comforted each other, looked after the club together, mourned those we lost together and even when separated we continue to watch out for each other.



I am proud to be able to confirm that despite all the distractions this season, for the 112th season, no lives were lost while our members patrolled the beach. Even as we were forced to have a “skeleton” patrol at the end of the season, we kept our beach safe.

And even despite the shortened season, our members patrolled 19,147 hours on the beach. We continue to patrol Coogee Beach, Wylie’s Baths, and Garie Beach.

Under the leadership of our Club Captain Andy Gardiner and Vice-Captains Will Davison and Andy Illidge, Coogee patrolling members performed more than 570 preventative actions on the beach. They performed 14 rescues and provided 51 cases of major first aid. Congratulations to all the lifesaving committee, our 15 patrol captains and all our patrolling

members for continuing to keep our beach safe.

This season our education team was led by Chief Instructor George Fatseas and Assistant Chief Training Officer Cameron Callaghan. Under their leadership Coogee gained the highest number of awards in Sydney Surf Life Saving Branch. Overall we gained 394 awards, including 74 Surf Rescue Certificates, 98 Bronze Medallion, 33 new IRB Crew, and 70 Apply First Aid awards. Thank you to all our instructors and assessors.

Competition this year only had a limited season. During the bushfires the George Bass marathon was cancelled. In January, the Branch Carnival was cancelled twice due to storms and later in the season the President’s Cup, Rose Shield and Seddon Shield were cancelled due to the necessary response

to COVID-19. And finally, it was most disappointing for our competitors not to be able to finish the season at Aussies.

However, there were opportunities for our competitors to get out and demonstrate all the hard work that was still going into training. At the club, competitors focused on intra-club events including three rounds of Club Championships. Our Club Champions this season were Jake Andrews and Emily Miers. And at State Titles Coogee was very well represented with 131 Minnows, 30 Masters and 90 Open Competitors attending at Blacksmiths Beach in early March. Overall our Masters placed 5th, Open Competitors 8th, and Minnows 2nd.

Of note for the Masters, gold medals at State Championships were won by Nicola Logan, Rebecca Waugh, Michael Scroop, Helen Deas, Michael Barnes,



Phil Pettit, Linda Walsh and Sharon Deans.

In the Open Competition Jake Andrews made a number of finals, Ashley Finegan also made finals and won a bronze in the Under 17 Belt Final.

For the Minnows, this was the best ever result at State Championships – a huge congratulations to them and thank you to their competition and coaching teams led by Michael Kavanagh who have strived for a number of years to improve both their water and sand areas. This year was Minnows' final season under the leadership of Bec Waugh. It was a tremendously impressive couple of years under her leadership, not just for the competition results but also with all of the initiatives that Bec embedded at Minnows including, among other things, the expansion of the SRC program, increased capacity of Coogee Dippers, introduction of environmental initiatives and youth leadership pathways.

This season we bid farewell to several long service and life members. These included Norm "Nob" Hill, Charles "Barrie" Cribb ASM, Barry "Bolla" Telford, Jeffrey "Snayley" Sayle OAM; original female member Felicity Brown; and long-time member Terry McGuinness.

On a positive note, after many years of raising funds and planning the

substantive renovations of our Surf Club began as the season ended. The vision for this new Clubhouse was presented back in 2016 by then Club President Mark Doepel and endorsed by the Club Membership. Since then the building Committee comprised of Tony Waller and Matt Scanlon have worked tirelessly to bring this vision to fruition. The clubhouse is being renovated to open up the inside spaces, add balconies all around the sea side perimeter and provide extensive coastal views from the entire upper floor. The renovated space will provide the clubhouse with a new flexible space for members to enjoy and for guests to hire for functions. The clubhouse is expected to reopen in December 2020.

The Club continues to be supported by a number of sponsors. Our sponsors provide significant financial support that enables us to continue our activities on patrol and at competitions. They include Harvey Norman, Chish 'n' Fips, and Coogee Bay Hotel. I would like to pay particular thanks to our Sponsorship Committee headed by Vice President Olivia Gardiner who continued to work closely with our sponsors especially during Covid-19 when when she actively sought to promote those that support us.

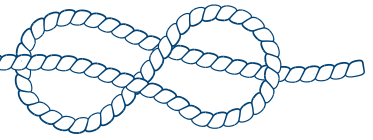

Club Captain's Report

While we ceased patrolling on 28th March 2020, we still had our emergency call out team on standby and the season came to a formal conclusion, with no lives lost at Coogee, on 26th April 2020.

Despite the early finish, our life savers still performed 19,147 patrol hours on our beach, completing 14 rescues, 51 major first aids and 571 preventative actions.

This was all managed by an experienced group of Patrol Captains, many completing multiple seasons in the role, along with some new talent coming through as Patrol Vice Captains. This has been a great opportunity for them to consolidate and build their teams and consistency in leadership has proved to be a winning formula.

There were many busy days on our beach over the season and some major incidents but, with the teams firmly established, they coped admirably with everything that was thrown at them.

Due to the Covid-19 restrictions and cessation of patrolling, we had to forego the formal Patrol Competition and use the patrol inspections conducted

throughout the season to determine the Patrol of the Year. This was taken out this season by Patrol 15, led by Robert Campbell, who all had a tremendous season on the beach and hit near perfect scores in their inspections. Our congratulations go to Robert, Sean Bond the Vice-Captain and all the members of Patrol 15.

Our other lifesaving awards covered Most Outstanding Cadet – Tom Walker, Most Outstanding Junior – Ruby Thomasyu, Rookie of the Year Olivia Smith and Patrol Person of the Year – Emma Askam. All these life savers have had a remarkable year and contributed above and beyond. Congratulations to them all and they fully deserve our recognition and thanks.

The education team were as busy as ever this season, completing 394 awards across all disciplines, the most in the Sydney Branch. This included 98 new

Bronze Medallion holders, 74 Surf Rescue Certificates and 70 First Aid qualifications. We also had 33 new IRB Crew members and 4 new IRB Drivers.

We ran several Skills Maintenance days and sessions in the first part of the season, ably managed by Nikki Ozsdolay with the support of the training team. Over 700 members were put through their paces across Bronze Medallion, ART, Spinal and IRB driver and crew. This is a huge exercise for our club every season and I would like to thank all those involved in making it happen.

The other major event at the beginning of the season is the annual gear inspection. This continues to run smoothly under the watchful eye of our Gear Steward, Andrew Tooher, who spends a huge amount of time maintaining and fixing equipment and managing our gear in preparation for inspection. Along with Paul Lardi, liaising with our suppliers and managing and maintaining all our radios, we were yet again in a strong position when the inspection came around and, as always, passed with flying colours. My thanks to all those who helped again.

Debbie Zonich has been a stalwart for the Life Saving Committee, as Registrar again this season. This has to be one of the most important, but often overlooked roles in the club. Debbie has provided us with fantastic support, particularly while we continue to reconcile patrol hours and allocations with the Patrol App. While the app has



not always performed as expected, it is proving to be a valuable tool and the lifesaving team will continue to help branch progress with its development.

For the third season in a row, the club has provided lifesaving support to Garie SLSC. Our club members ran 6 patrols on behalf of Garie SLSC this season, clocking up over 1,000 patrol hours between them. This has been a valuable and interesting initiative as it has helped provide Garie SLSC with some breathing space, but has also provided our members with an opportunity to patrol at a very different location to Coogee, within a unique environment, throwing up its own challenges. I would encourage all members to experience patrolling at Garie while we still have the opportunity to support them.

Another unique event this season was the fundraising our volunteers undertook for the Sydney Airport Authority. This saw all the clubs from the Sydney Branch involved in several days of fundraising and bucket waving at the Sydney Airport terminals. As always, Coogee SLSC members responded strongly, particularly our junior members, and Coogee SLSC was proud to contribute with over \$7,500 in funds raised.

We also have a number of members who volunteer their time with the Sydney Branch Support Operations Group. This includes Duty Officers and Rescue Co-ordinators, Jet Ski Drivers (RWC Support Skis), Drone Operators (UAV) and of course Surf Rescue 30 Drivers and Crew.

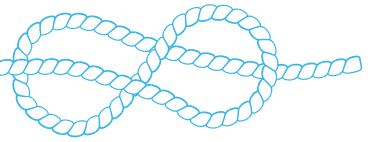

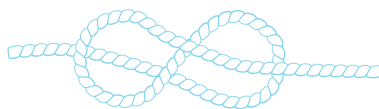

Chief Instructor's Report



GEORGE FATSEAS

I am pleased to report that during the 2019-2020 season the Education area, continued to build on previous seasons success, with the Senior section of the Club achieving 394 Awards, the highest number in the Surf Life Saving Sydney Branch.

We were only down by 17 awards from the 2018-2019 season which is a good result considering COVID19 restrictions and the shorter season.

Our members are amongst the most qualified in Australia with Coogee SLSC achieving the highest number of awards in: SRC (74), Silver Medallion Beach Management (17), IRB Crew (33), Apply First Aid (70), Pain Management (10), Trainers (11), Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue equal first (13), Bronze medallion 2nd (98).

Coogee SLSC this season was selected by SLSNSW to pilot the new SRC course and we have submitted our feedback to SLSNSW who has now developed the new SRC and Bronze Medallion courses which will roll out during the 2020-2021 season.

When including the Coogee Minnows section in the Senior Club our overall Awards were 1263 (equal to the 2018-2019 season), this is the highest number in the Surf Life Saving Sydney Branch. This is very encouraging from a Club sustainability program as the Minnows continue to develop members transitioning into the senior Club.

Currently members achieve their Surf Rescue Certificate at 13yrs of age, however they need to wait two years when they are 15yrs before they can do their Bronze Medallion. Unfortunately, there are not many opportunities to upskill or retain them as members during this period. In the 2019-2020 season we initiated the Coogee SLSC Academy. This was open to members who had just completed their SRC and were interested in developing their skills while they were waiting to be old enough to obtain their Bronze Medallion Award. The aim of the Academy was to develop lifesaving, competition, and leadership skills in a fun and social environment and was open to any member who showed commitment regardless of ability. The first intake had 25 members who showed great commitment in being involved in beach training, developing leadership skills through involvement in teaching the new SRC group, the dippers program, water confidence group, providing water safety for the general Minnows water activities, and obtaining their higher awards with all but 2 members gaining their Apply First Aid Certificate. This group will now go into phase 2 next season to obtain their bronze medallion, additional higher awards and continue their leadership development.

We are now working on further developing this program for the new intake of Academy Members for the 2020-2021 season.

Being the most successful Club in Education in the Sydney Branch does not come easy. There is always more work and time commitments than normally appears in organising, delivering and assessing the various courses. This is only possible through the selflessness and enthusiasm of the Education team both lead and supporting trainers and facilitators by providing numerous hours of teaching and assessing to our existing and new members. I have always encouraged members that the best way to learn yourself is to teach.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Cameron Callaghan for his help as Assistant Chief Training Officer during the season. Cameron started the season off by leading the Thunder Bronze, a SRC to Bronze course. Matt Spooner took on the lead role for the Spring Bronze. Doug Hawkins took on the lead role for the Lightning Bronze Course. This course proved to be so much in demand that we created for the first time the Transition Bronze Course which was lead by Doug Hawkins and myself and transitioned SRC members to their Bronze Medallion over a condensed 4 day period.

I would like to thank Doug Hawkins for also assisting me with the delivery of another large (74 candidates), most likely the largest Surf Rescue Certificate Course in Australia to under 14's candidates. The most challenging course as this was also the pilot for the new course to be rolled out next season. I would like to thank Mary Ryan and Paul Haes as age managers for the under 14's who did an outstanding job in bringing these members to the SRC course over so many years in the Nippers and being supportive and encouraging to all allowing us to achieve 100% pass. Doug also assisted me with delivering the Resuscitation course to the under 12's. Adam Treharne and Fiona Phelps lead the Summer Bronze, whilst Doug Hawkins and James Campbell lead the Dad's and Mum's Army XXIII course.

Higher Awards are essential to up-skill our patrolling members ensuring that we continue to provide the highest possible care on our beach. This season Craig Howie took on the lead for the Advanced Resuscitation Techniques with Beck Mister who also delivered the Spinal Management Courses. The IRB area continued to be led by Andrew Tooher, Scott Parker and Poddie Crudden who excelled again this season by

training 33 IRB Crew and 4 IRB drivers, very essential roles on every patrol.

The highest Award obtainable in Surf Life Saving is the Gold Medallion, and this season I was privileged to be involved in training the squad. Special congratulations goes to Peter Harvie who participated in his 14th consecutive Gold Medallion assessment. Peter recently was recognised by his peers as carrying out the Branch rescue for the month of April 2020. Peter put his Gold Medallion Skills to the test when he rescued a father and son kayak paddlers who were thrown out of their vessel at Gordons bay on Sunday 5th April in choppy seas with large 1.5 m waves.

This season saw the continuation of the Coogee Silver Medallion that was lead by myself and included 16 members who improved their beach skills as well as gain valuable knowledge in the areas of command and leadership at an incident, presented by Tony Waller, Support Operations presented by Matt Spooner, Club Complex scenarios presented by George Fatseas. Candidate assessment included research and presentation of team assignments specifically dealing with Coogee Beach, a mini-mission (400m run, 200m swim, 200m board paddle and 400m run) and a team complex scenario. I would like to thank Tony Waller and Matt Spooner for their continued assistance in this area.

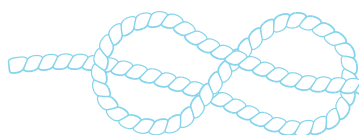

As usual, this high achievement we obtained would not have been possible without them. I would like to thank all of our Club Members who also support me by taking on Higher Awards and allowing me to be involved with their journey through their training processes.

The 2019-2020 season continued to be personally rewarding for me as CTO. I rather enjoyed the challenges in implementing the SRC pilot study and being able to contribute to the development of the new course. Seeing the first year of the Coogee SLSC Academy coming to fruition as well as being involved in the numerous courses to our members. I particularly enjoyed working with Rebecca Waugh and the Minnows teams in developing strategies to assist in achieving education goals in these areas, and look forward to further collaborations with the Minnows in the future.

Having innovative ideas doesn't always mean that they will come to fruition, this only happens with support from others and in particular I would like to thank the Lifesaving Committee and Management Committee for their continued encouragement, assistance and support throughout the season allowing me to implement initiatives. Last but certainly not least I would like to thank the wonderful ladies in the office Debbie Zonich and Karen Beale who are always supportive, available and obliging in all areas of the Club.

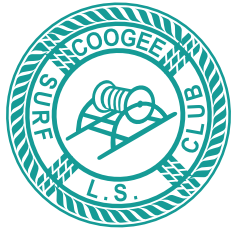

Competition Director's Report

The 2019-2020 season was also about re-establishing a solid intra-club events program around our Club Championships and encouraging surf sports within the club, which we achieved with strong attendance across all three rounds.

At the start of the season, one of our major goals was to re-establish a strong intra-club events program centred around our 3 rounds of Club Championships, while still pursuing excellence at regular Carnival Competitions.

Our first intra-club event for the season was the Anonymous Donor's biathlon held on a Friday evening in early November. There was a fantastic turn-out of support for the event coordinated by Michael Scroop with over 51 starters across all categories, with Marcus Littlejohn taking overall honours.

This summer was the first time in quite a few years where we have run multiple rounds of Club Championships, with a round in each of November, January and February. The first round attracted 80 individual competitors, and

this rolled on through Rounds 2 and 3, for a total of 110 individuals competing in the events. Jake Andrews was dominant in the Club Championships Surf Races, beating all comers and winning all three rounds quite convincingly to become the new Club Champion. Emily Miers had strong competition with Ashley Finegan, but accumulated sufficient points to be crowned Female Club Champion. I would sincerely like to thank Sara Wilson, Michael Parsons and Kevin Allen for coordinating the Beach Area, and Mark Andrews, Terry Flynn and Michael Canterella for coordinating the Water Area, and lastly, Josh Ricamara for coordinating the water safety for each of these events.

As we approached the end of the season, the global pandemic started gathering momentum, and we were

forced to cancel all competitive Surf Sports events and training in line with Government and SLISA guidelines. Unfortunately, this meant we had to cancel the Rose Shield, President's Cup, and the Seddon Shield (boardriding).

Our boat crews continue to grow in strength and numbers. They targeted the George Bass Marathon with a male and our first female team (that was unfortunately cancelled a couple of days in to the race due to the catastrophic bushfires on the south coast), South Coast Boat Series as well as Ocean Thunder events. Our beach runners, Masters and R&R teams have performed very well at various events across the season and quite often Coogee would figure prominently in the Carnival pointscores as a result. We also saw the emergence of an U17 craft and water area which is starting to gather some momentum. The full results from all carnivals are listed later in this annual report.

The Branch Championships were to be held at Maroubra Beach in mid-February, but postponed twice on consecutive weeks before being cancelled for the season. On the first occasion, the unanimous expectation was for a forecast for strong east winds, heavy rainfall and dangerous surf building over the weekend. A week later, the Championships were

postponed again as Cyclone Uesi lashed the coast, with poor water quality and big surf conditions, as trees and logs the size of telegraph poles washed up on the eastern beaches. Unfortunately, there was never a chance to reschedule the carnival.

The NSW State Titles were held at Blacksmiths Beach (Swansea Belmont) in early March with a team of 30 Masters and 90 Open competitors entered across the events. The Open Team finished 8th overall in the pointscore (5th from Sydney Branch), while the Masters finished 5th in their pointscore (3rd from Sydney Branch). This followed a week after the Minnows powered to second in their overall pointscore (1st from Sydney Branch).

Coogee was dominant in the Beach and R&R Areas and is a tribute to their coaching staff. 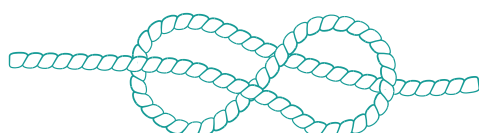

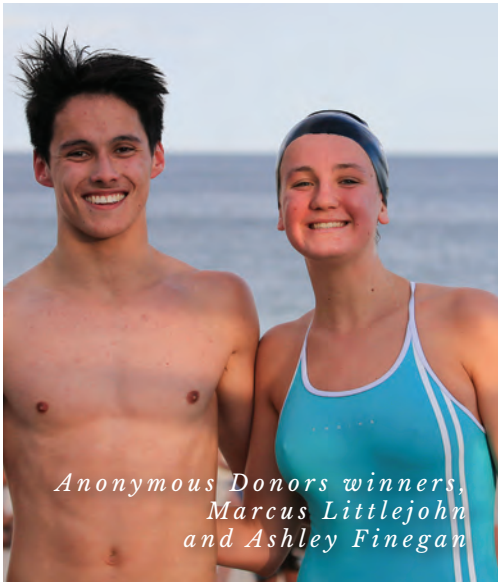

The 2019 season was an action packed and adrenaline filled year. Each year we get better and better and this year is no different. This season we saw a more dedicated and focused training group that put technique and perfection to the forefront of our training. Preseason for the Hammers began in October 2018 to April 2019 due to the fact that we race in the winter. In that time, we logged over 300 training hours on the water in the IRB, not including IRB maintenance on motors/hulls/propellers and fitness regimes which intensely focused on technique and surf negotiation.

For the 2019 preseason we had the opportunity to train down the coast with Kiama Downs SLSC IRB racing team. They are multiple Australian, State and Premiership Gold medallists, and their knowledge and skill sets were priceless. Here we learnt an array of IRB crew and driving techniques and the importance of the chemistry between driver and crew. I would like to say this weekend away paid off.

In the NSW Premiership and State Championships, the Coogee Hammers IRB Racing team reached over 40 finals although with many disqualifications. In the NSW IRB Premiership, we bronze medalled in the over 45s category in the tube rescue and Rookie Mass rescue. In the State Championships we bronze medalled in the over 45s for tube rescue. Unfortunately, in the Australia titles we did not see the same results in previous years but were able to make quarter finals and rounds in the Masters, under 23 and Opens IRB championships. Whilst we did not see the same results in previous years such as Australian Bronze medal in the over 35 Tube rescue in 2017 and over 35 Teams Mass Rescue in 2018, we have never collectively achieved reaching this amount of finals. This milestone is representative of the hard work and training attributed to this outstanding group of individuals that trained and competed with such devotion and dedication.



The NSW IRB Premiership was located at Round 1-Stockton SLSC; Round 2-The Lakes SLSC; Round 3-Cape Hawke SLSC; Round 4-Caves Beach SLSC. The NSW IRB State Championship was located at Cape Hawke SLSC. The Australian IRB Championships were held at Cudgen Headland SLSC, Kingscliff.

“Family” is a word I would use to describe this team. Whilst we like to win medals our main focus is to have fun, enjoy ourselves, better our skills in the surf and keep constantly improving. It is with this mindset that we trust each other's ability no matter the conditions. We look forward to next season as we grow in number, knowledge and skill in this sport.

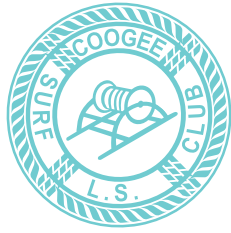

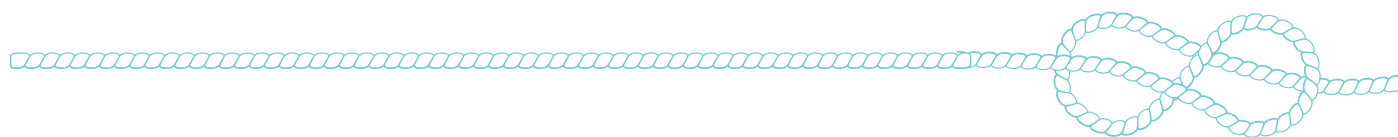

We have the largest number of participants and the highest retention rates in the state.

To the Coogee Minnow's Age Managers, Apparel Team, Officials, Competition Director, Surf Sport coaches, Age Assistants, IRB drivers, Social media coordinator, treasurers, secretaries, education, Water Safety supervisors, water safety volunteers and to all who are on the beach, mentoring and developing our kids every week, I would like to acknowledge your fantastic efforts and say a massive thank you from the Minnows community.

A very heartfelt thank you to the Coogee Senior Club Executive Committee and Governors for their tremendous support of Minnows and also of me personally.

Our Under 14s light blue caps under the guidance of trainers Doug Hawkins and George Fatseas and Age Managers Paul Haes and Mary Ryan plus many parent helpers completed the new pilot program for the Surf Life Saving Certificate and Minnows passed along 74 newly qualified lifesavers to the senior club.

Minnows again supported Autism Swim with the Coogee Dippers for the 4th year running. I am also so proud that Coogee Minnows sent our first competitor to the inclusive championships at the State Titles. Laura, with plenty of encouragement, went on to be awarded a gold and silver medal for her events.

Minnows also increased the capacity of the Minnows Water Confidence group under Alex Hilston

supporting the inclusion of a higher needs candidate, Zoe Smith and the transition of Laura Barnett. Thank you to Helen Murphy, Alison Roberts and Ashley Palm Manning and Jenny Todd for their ongoing support and smiling faces.

Minnows supported the suggestions of the Under 14 leadership in our continued environmental initiatives. Minnows purchased keep cups, we started our Minnows swap and go stall and raised \$1500 for the bush fire appeal, donated to the charities that our Minnows leadership team chose.

This season has also thrown some new challenges at the Minnows community. The smoke from the September-December 2019 bushfires caused us to modify and limit activities that the kids undertook on Sunday mornings. Post Christmas the rains came and broke the drought but also caused massive flooding and washout into the ocean, forcing the cancellation of Sunday morning sessions as tree stumps washed up onto the shore line. Then who could have picked it....a pandemic in COVID-2019. We were forced to cancel the last weeks of Minnows, presentation day and move the Minnows Annual General Meeting online.

We also worked on the education side, learning signals and the first steps of CPR (DRSABCD).

It was Coogee's turn to host the Randwick Shield with the added pressure of a new requirement for it to be run as an official Surf Sports carnival. This meant ensuring all of the entrants needed to be competition proficient (the children were required to complete a 150m swim in the ocean – made all the more difficult by it being early in the season and the water being that bit cooler). It

was very pleasing to see the Silver Caps as the largest entry and many getting to experience a carnival for the first time. Based upon the smiles and enjoyment they had, we hope to see them all giving it another go next season.

For the competitive children, there were regular carnivals, in addition to Randwick Shield, culminating with the NSW State Age Championships. There were some great performances with many finals made, helping the Club to a second place overall.

Many thanks to all of our U10 volunteers (Age Assistants, Water Safety and BBQ crew) — Coogee Minnows simply cannot function without you. We introduced a requirement for the WWCC this year and within a short space of time, we were all compliant, making Coogee Minnows a safer environment for our children. Our journey to become life savers is flying past at a great rate of knots but no season has gone faster than 2019/20. With smoke disrupting our Sunday mornings and competition training, then to massive seas with driving rain left over from a tropical cyclone leaving debris clogging the beach and leaving us to finish the season off with a world pandemic. The season started with our usual proficiency swim and we were really impressed with all bar one of our kids in the pool (more about the one later). Most kids smashed the qualifying time. disappointment of quite a few kids. We also continued with our signals and most important DRSABCD.

A great change to this season was the John Mudge competition. We changed it from SLS sports to a SLS skills-based competition. It was a bit chaotic on the day, but all our kids embraced it and we got positive feedback about the format from our volunteers. Unfortunately, with the interruptions to the season we were unable to fully prepare for the day, but it was a great introduction for our last three seasons.

We had plenty more kids that last season were ready to give up and this season really improved and enjoy their time in the water. HUGE thanks to our great group of encouraging Water Safety for this. Our aim is to get kids confident in the water, know what to do in different conditions and not panic.

With a disrupted season training our competitive kids stood up where it counted and had a very successful season. Well done all, you made the Purple caps proud. More about this in the competition report.

Massive thanks to all our wonderful volunteers who show up every Sunday to make our Minnows experience truly rewarding.

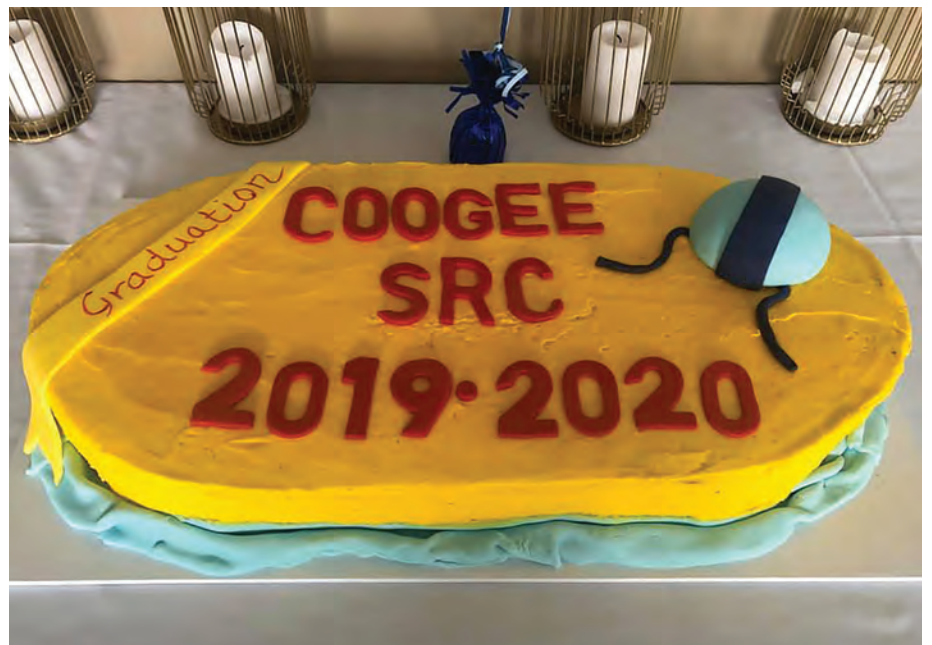
Special thanks to all the volunteers over the seasons including those that supported the kids through their SRC, helped with beach setup, marked the roll, counted kids in and out of the water,

Competition Report

The 2019/20 season set another contemporary benchmark for the Minnows Competition team, which placed 2nd overall behind the deserving team from North Curl Curl at the NSW State Age Championships at Blacksmiths Beach, Swansea Belmont. Coogee were again the highest placed team from Sydney Branch at these Championships.

Our season started in earnest on the drive back from Swansea Belmont in March 2019. Buoyed by a third-place finish at State Age 2019, planning began for our next visit in March 2020. After much work behind the scenes and thought into ways of enhancing an already flourishing and successful program, the coaches and all competitors got stuck into pre-season training in late July 2019 and did not stop until they once again arrived at Blacksmiths Beach.

Three of the new season goals were early successes:

1. Involving water competitors into the previously sand only pre-season training was great for building team unity.

2. The organisation of a pre-season camp for existing competitors at Coledale SLSC, was a tremendous success. It united all families involved and got the kids back into the physicality and mentality of surf sports. It also had the extra benefit of helping foster a new relationship with another surf club which we hope to build on in the future.

3. Increasing our early season efforts in identifying Minnows who were keen to give competition a go. This was promoted at the Competition Information presentation in September and was further explored during early season Sunday morning activities, by the Surf Sports Coaches, who conducted engagement sessions to make contact with those children who may have been interested in Surf Sports but were a little unsure how to join one of the training squads. This was a fantastic success across all age groups with some great talent identified and interest harnessed. It was particularly heartening in the U8's and U9's Age Groups to see that several of the kids we met on those days finished the season as Branch or State medallists. Our U8's enjoyed a super successful and



fun Branch U8s Championships which sets them up very well for their first full competition year in 2020/2021.

Once into the season, the preparations for Randwick Shield, which was Coogee's turn to host, dominated early season efforts as we took the lead role in the development of a template for the future running of this carnival at a permanent home of South Maroubra Beach. Despite the cancellation of water events due to heavy seas, Coogee won back the Randwick Shield (the All Age Relay) and the carnival was a success, thanks largely to the efforts of our committee and parent helpers.

During the season, our Coogee Minnows competed in carnivals at Queenscliff, Cronulla, Elouera, North Narrabeen, Manly and Wanda (Branch water), all in preparation for State. All played important roles in honing and developing skills, building teamwork and having the team competition ready in the big end of season carnivals. The competitors consistently competed in the right spirit of sportsmanship

and respect; they were wonderful ambassadors for the Two Blues of Coogee.

On the weekend of 28th February to 1st March, Coogee sent a team of 131 competitors up to Swansea Belmont to compete in the NSW State Age Championships, the highest-level carnival that we can participate in as nippers. Around 100 surf clubs from NSW were represented and 2700 Nippers competed in all areas of Surf Sports competition. We were greeted by beautiful weather, terrific conditions in the water that were a bit like home with the steepish entries and waves breaking closer to shore due to recent storm damage. The storm damage had created havoc on the beach and the tracks were not up to the usual standard but the hosts had worked feverishly to prepare them as well as could be. There were better lanes than others, but you took the good with the bad and made the most of it. As always, the competition was intense over the 3 days and our competitors represented with pride and distinction.

Highlights included:

- For the third year in a row the sand team won the overall point score in their area, including 12 gold medals and excelling in relay competition, winning 3 gender relays:

- U12 girls (Alice Bowler, Amelia Byrne, Jemima Sewell, Niamh Lynch),
- U12 boys (Noah Anderson, Jack Johnson, Ollie Sheldon, Jack Butler) and
- U13 girls (Sienna Durante, Leila Maxfield, Emily Matheson-Rayner, Juliette Gray).

- Also qualifying 11 out of a possible 12 teams into Mixed Relay finals, winning 4 of the 6 finals:

- U9, (Layla Pablecheque, Yve Sullivan, Talin Opai, Nicholas Giannikouris)
- U11 (Emma Haley, Evie Bowie, Sam Patterson, Flynn Robinson)
- U13 (Sienna Durante, Leila Maxfield, Seb Elizondo, Nicholas Clemson) and
- U14 (Eden Levit, Annabel Penny, Luke Avati, Brandon Cowen).

- Three individual gold medallists:

- Emma Haley in U11 flags
- Annabel Penny in U14 Sprint
- Conor Boyd in U13 1km.

- 14 individual finalists in the individual sprint, including eight qualifying for the first time and six of them won medals, all of whom were developed from within the ranks of Coogee Minnows.

- The R&R team finished 2nd in their overall point score for the third year in a row, winning gold in 2 of the 3 divisions, the U14 5-person R&R (Jasmine Miller, Michayla Penn, Elouisa Hawkes, Evelyn Deans, Chiara Hammond) as well as U11 2-person R&R team (Laura Peshevski & Milla Hlywa), coached by Michayla Penn of the U14 team.

- The water team also had a break-out season, scoring 37 points, a leap of 30 points from the previous year and including 3 team medals.

- The decade long medal drought in the water was broken by the team of Max Moylan, Josh Fernandez, Campbell Groves and Cooper Habler competing in the blue riband U14 boys surf team, who took out the Silver medal behind Newport. Not to be outdone, the U9 boys Surf swim team of Roman Szabo, Jacob

Samokhin, Henry Gellin and Ashton Habler doubled the Silver tally hours later. Caitlyn Lee, Dakota Fielding, Angus Folsom and Louis Benuska won bronze in the U11 Cameron.

The final tally of 219 points included 12 Gold medals, 10 Silver medals and 10 Bronze medals.

The improvement from 3rd place in 2019 to 2nd place in 2020 along with a huge leap in points gained from 168 to 219 was built upon a significant increase in Surf Sports participation across all competition arenas, particularly in the water. It was not unusual on a Thursday evening, our main session, to see over 100 Coogee Minnows running on Coogee Oval while another 70 were training across the road on sand and in the surf. Within eligible Age Groups (U8's - U14's) over 200 children were training regularly, roughly 40% of total active membership of those age groups, a great sign for the club.

Further, these results were borne of the incredible dedication and effort of our competitors, both in training and competition, along with the programs put in place by our coaches and their passion in delivering them. All the coaches, led by Renee Gibbs on sand, Cameron Habler in the water and R&R & March Past Coordinator, Jen Trinca, have invested enormous amounts of personal time and commitment to developing and implementing these programs, for which we are all grateful. The dynamic programs that these coaches oversee and continually evolve for our competing kids and their dedication to help them to reach their potential to be the best they can be is something for which the whole club should be very proud and thankful. The way all our kids compete with respect and a smile, genuinely enjoying themselves is a credit to all the coaches.

In the background, a small army of parents facilitated the training and participation at carnivals, so thank you to those that provided Water Safety, Officiated at carnivals, provided First Aid, IRB support, Age Group Comp Coordinators and those that managed and chaperoned the competitors, plus our tent and gear transporters, led by Glen Sheldon and family, who made major contributions to our enjoyment of carnivals.

Special thanks to Michael Johnson and Sheila Royles for taking responsibility for our Officials group which involves organising the requisite number for each carnival necessary for us to compete, plus facilitating training



for our 3 new Officials. Thank you to Madeleine Coorey, Brett Turnbull and Andrew Bloxson who undertook the significant training to become accredited Officials.

A huge thank you to Bec Waugh and the Minnows Committee for their trust and support, allowing us to evolve our methods in an effort to strive for continual improvement and help us reach the goal of developing our kids to reach their absolute potential.

The expansion of the competition area over the past 3 years has necessitated more volunteers to be involved and help with coaching, training and management. This is an area which is constantly evolving. Strategies for defining roles, training people to manage the different aspects of competition and bringing fresh ideas to continue to grow the competition area will be a focus leading into next season. The first key plank is in place with nine parents recently completing the SLSA Development Coaching Course.

Water Safety Report

Reflecting back on the 2019/2020 it's been a topsy turvy kind of Nippers season for water safety. After a walk along the shore at 7am on our first day back on the beach in October and seeing a carpet of blue bottles, dead birds and other pollutants on the shoreline, we had to cancel all water activities.



From the second week until the Christmas break we were blessed with both favourable weather and surf conditions. The second half of the season after the new year however began with smoky skies and burnt embers floating on the water. Then monstrous storms hit us in February and closed the beach for 2 weekends forcing Nippers to be cancelled. Our hopes to have a good final run at the end of the season were abruptly smashed with news of cancellation of all sporting events for the containment of Covid-19.

A decision to cancel water activities, it is not made lightly. We always conduct a thorough risk assessment and take into consideration the safety of both the children and our water safety team.

With regards to major First Aid incidents, we are happy to report that the season came to a close without any serious injury and are delighted that the children and water safety alike enjoyed our wonderful beach safely and with no incidents.

On behalf of all our children and the Minnows Committee, Glen and Jaz would like to extend a very big thank you to the awesome Water Safety personnel who once again ensured our children stayed safe in the water whilst learning valuable surf skills. The commitment and dedication you all displayed is humbling. Everyone from under 6s to the under 14s is extremely grateful to you for placing yourselves between our children and those potentially



dangerous elements – including large dumping waves, abandoned boards and at times, blue bottles! Thank you very much!

A coup for the water safety team this season was the introduction of the water safety sign on app. After a few teething problems at the start, everyone agrees it's an easier and more efficient way to record water safety hours.

We wish to recognise a couple of key milestones for the season:

- Congratulations to the 2019 graduating Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) candidates, you made it through after close to 10 years of Nippers. With the assistance (and patience) of their trainers, Age Managers, and parents, our 70+ graduates are now qualified as life savers. In fact, in the second half of the season we had many of the SRCs performing water safety in their orange shirts.

- Once again we were thrilled to be able to work with Autism Swim and assist in the facilitating of the "Dippers" program - now in its third year. The Dippers program is designed to assist

children with Autism to have fun on the beach and in the water in a safe and controlled environment. Some of these children were reluctant even to step onto the sand and so seeing them in the water each week was a wonderful and heart-warming sight. The program has grown consistently over the past 4 seasons and once again there was a very strong show of support from our club members who volunteered as Water Safety and "buddies" to these inspirational children. Thank you to those Water Safety and buddies that volunteered to assist, you have made a massive impact to the lives of these children and their families and you have again done Coogee Surf Lifesaving Club proud.

Finally, both of us would like to thank Bec Waugh for her hard work, support and inspiration as Minnows Captain as she stands down this year.

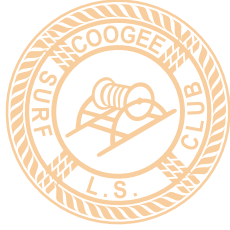

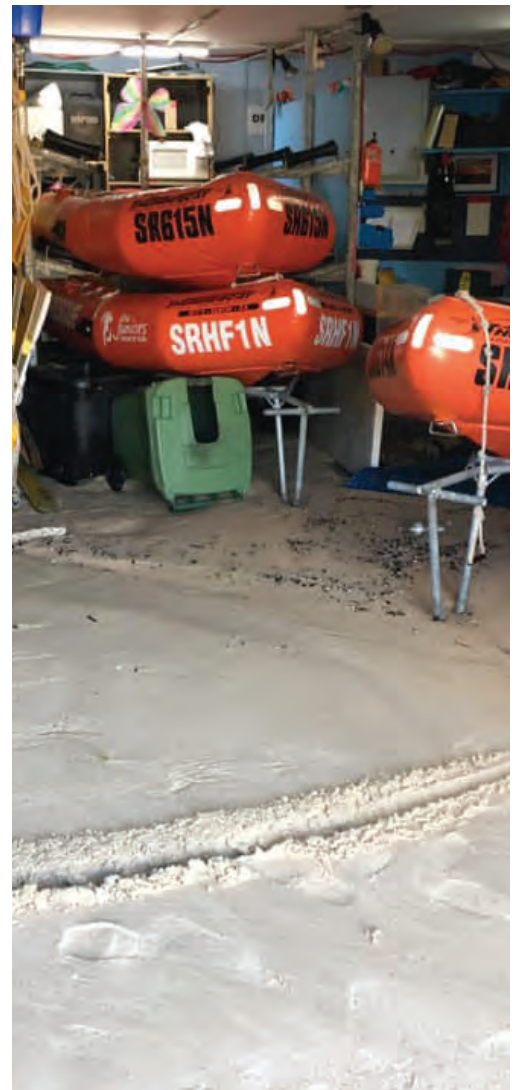

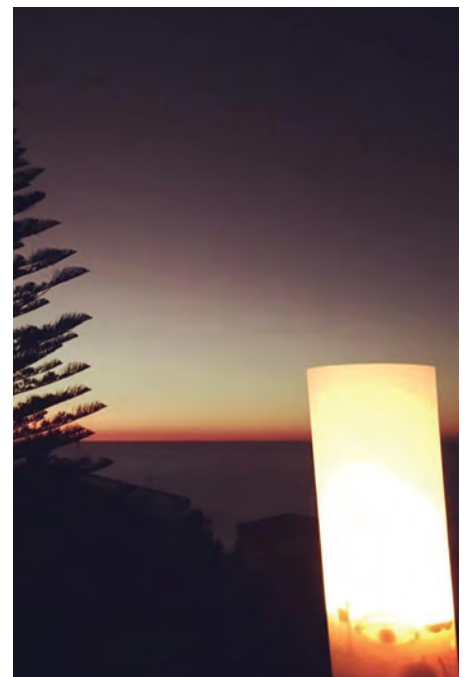
Most members who use our memorial hall downstairs rarely recognise these very important honour boards and silver tablets.

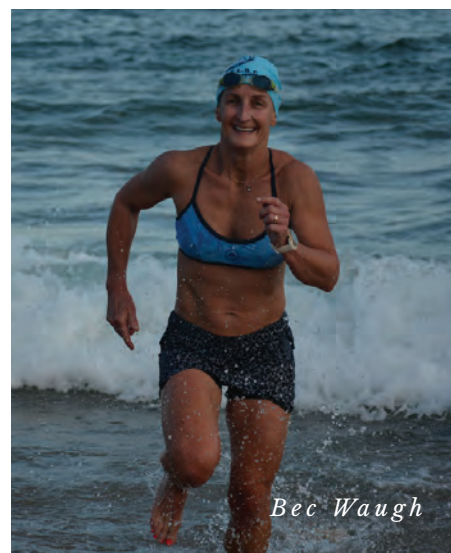

George Bass Surf Boat Marathon Report

A funny old season it was for the Coogee Boaties this year, as it was for all. From bushfires, to a pandemic it was an action-packed, roller-coaster ride. However, squeezed within these historical events we strove to set out to achieve our goals of a successful season.

One of those goals was to field two competitive teams for the George Bass Marathon. For those unfamiliar with the event, it is a seven-day surfboat marathon, which runs along the path pioneered by Bass and Flinders from Batemans Bay to Eden on the far south coast on NSW. Each stage length is between 19 and 27 kilometres down the coast, and gives support to the south coast branch and several surf clubs along the way. I would particularly like to note that we fielded our first female team in the club's history of attending the event, which was a monumental achievement to our female rowing members.

Both Coogee teams were going great guns and settling in according to plan with the occasional blister here or there, until we were woken at our Bermagui camp site (located next to the surf club) early on day three to what appeared to be bush fire embers falling from the sky. Things took a turn and the mood changed dramatically.

We were woken by emergency services on that Tuesday morning, letting us know that the camp site was now the evacuation point for 6000 local residents and tourists as we were surrounded by a very large and approaching bushfire. We were to remain

here for the next 48 hours.

From that moment on, I can honestly say I have never been prouder of a group of people to co-operate and selflessly help those less fortunate than themselves.

I'm incredibly proud to say that our Two Blue team was there to support emergency services and Bermagui surf club in any way we could. We had boaties and our support crew volunteering at the evacuation centre day and night, manning the BBQ, giving away food, clothing and bedding, the IRB was on standby to evacuate people from surrounding beaches and what I thought was one of the most powerful helping tools - just having a yarn and keeping victims company. There may also have been some hugs and tears shed along the way, however the Coogee spirit was never to dissipate. Not once did I hear a complaint from any of our members and in saying that I believe we did the Two-Blues proud.

We were also rocked by some further bad news that one of our support crew members sons was fighting a fire near Albury and injured as a result of his fire tanker being viciously tossed by wind. We wish Andrew all the best with his recovery and the rest of the Julian family.

With the coastal highways all shut, we made a break for it at midnight New Year's Day via Bega and Canberra after the emergency services gave us the nod to leave. The scene we anxiously departed was rather saddening: we were to return to our homes safely, and those we left behind their future undetermined.

After all that I'm pleased to say everyone arrived home safely in the late afternoon of the 2nd of January and we were honoured to share our stories as part of the club fundraising charity day held on Australia Day, where funds were raised for Bermagui Surf Club and the widowed wife of a lost firefighter. A big thank you to everyone who supported us and checked in to see how we were doing during the eventful days, and in the days and weeks that followed. I hope that there is a speedy recovery to all bush fire victims around the state and we cannot wait to field teams in the next event in 2021.

We also cannot forget to say a massive thank you to our legendary and long-time sponsor Sydney Mutual Bank (previously known as Sydney Credit Union) for their support on our George Bass journey.

Howard Emanuel,
expressing his gratitude
for our immense sense of
community support during
the 2020 bushfires*

20 January 2020

Dear Sir/Madam,

On 31 December 2019 a devastating bushfire raged through the coastal hinterland of the far south coast of NSW. This bushfire caused enormous destruction and displaced many hundreds of people.

A few days after this event there was an emergency relief centre set up at the SLSC in Bermagui and it was at this relief centre that I met several members of the Coogee SLSC who were in residence having had the passage of their participation in the George Bass classic interrupted by the calamity on the southern coastline.

At the relief centre your club members volunteered to man the barbecue, to cook breakfast for displaced bushfire victims and it was here that I met several Coogee SLSC members.

Unfortunately, my wife and I had suffered the total loss of our home and property situated at Wandella, inland from the devastated town of Cobargo.

We were at the relief centre trying to gather ourselves and come to terms with the events of New Year's Eve and were both in a highly vulnerable emotional state, traumatised and I suspect to some degree in shock. Along with many others, I stood in line for a cooked breakfast and began to chat with one of your members who was preparing my "brekky" on the "Barbie".

I guess this fellow could see the devastation on the faces of those he was serving and asked me what my experience of the fire event had been and when I explained to him that we had lost everything except the clothes we stood in and had left our beloved property in a state of panic, his reaction is something I shall, not only never forget, but will always cherish. Being "male" I along with many, if not most of my gender, have been through entrenched social cultures, discouraged to express my emotions and feelings openly and fully, though on this occasion I desperately needed to do so.

The Coogee SLSC member not only reached forward and clasped both my hands tightly, but I witnessed a very beautiful moment in my life as his face totally collapsed and he cried openly and unashamedly in the most public of settings.

Now this bloke was no diminutive presence but a big hulking "Alpha" male built like the proverbial, you might say, with an exterior demeanour as tough, resilient and rugged as you could get and he was in full public view essentially holding onto me and we both cried our eyes out.

In the end he told me he was so very sorry for the loss my wife and I had experienced.

I gathered myself as did he and moved off to consume my fare feeling like as someone knew what turmoil there was going on inside me and at an incredibly vulnerable time took great comfort in that.

I think this man's act of open compassion and kindness said a great many things to me in the moment not the least being that indeed we are not alone on this life journey as we are want to sometimes feel and that men could and should try and reach out more to one another in a vulnerable state.

My gratitude and my eternal love go out to your SLSC member for helping me through a most difficult time in my life.

As well I reflected on what a great ambassador this guy was for your surf club, what a wonderful public face of your organisation. I can see now as perhaps I have glimpsed before in my life the innate value institutions such as yours which draw all manner of people together to share common goals and importantly to serve the community.

My congratulations go to you for fostering a culture that celebrates life, that teaches those within to serve selflessly without the lure of material reward, but indeed only the opportunity to serve their fellow human beings, often I guess, in a moment of personal peril and struggle.

My heartfelt thanks to Coogee SLSC to the gentleman (and a big one at that) concerned and his club mates who put themselves forward in a time of need.

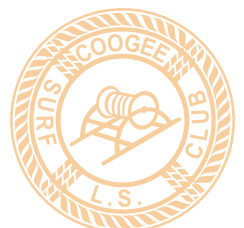

Billy Bishop did not make too many Mondays but at 96 it becomes a big effort. Did miss these members come our Christmas party.

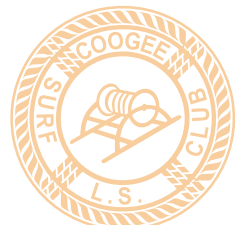
Special mention of Les Holden who drove over from Mosman to be part of the conversation each Monday morning, not bad at over 90.

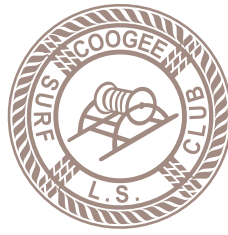

Finance



Our club manages its resources in order to support its members when patrolling, competing, learning, training or teaching. The responsible management of our club's finances remains a key plank of our club's success.



Treasurer's Report



ROBERT ILLIDGE

The Club reported an Operating Surplus of \$76,951 (which compared to a Surplus of \$2,338 in F18/19 and \$17,677 in F17/18.) This headline result was unexpected given the disruption of all club operations due to Covid-19.

Despite significant weakness in some of our key revenue lines, there was unexpected external revenue from Sponsorship, Fundraising, Covid-19 support and the Kiosk. Cancellation of the Australian Titles reduced expenditure significantly.

Recognising the future loss of revenue associated with the building redevelopment, the Management Committee recognised that the club needed to reduce expenditure as much as possible – this was very successful and I give my thanks to all members for their discipline.

Member Subscriptions grew 8% with the Senior Club up 21% offset by a 3% decline in Minnows subscriptions. Minnows remains the growth engine for the Senior Club membership.

External Funding. Donations were down significantly on FY19 but were more than offset by a 13.5% increase in sponsorship in FY20. The Randwick Club provided \$25K through Club Grants that has been expensed in the purchase of a new IRB and motor – their continued support is appreciated. In partnership with Sydney Branch & Sydney Airport the club received \$17K - \$7K of this was the bucket brigades manned by patrolling members – thanks so much for your support. A special mention to all of our club sponsors – thank you for honouring your sponsorship commitments despite the impact of Covid-19.

Jobkeeper & Cash Boost - the club is an eligible charity under these Federal Government schemes and received \$27K to support payment of our office staff.

Club Ventures

- Ocean Room revenue was down \$101K from 2018/19 (\$37K room hire, \$64K bar sales) which is the poorest result since 2010/11. The many reasons include current condition of the room/facilities, mid-March closure due to Covid-19, lack of forward bookings due to the impending renovation, reduction of marketing spend and a general lack of focus. Expenditure was reduced

considerably, particularly maintenance, but could not come close to offsetting the fall in revenue.

- Following a strong Island Challenge in November that yielded \$25K net profit, Covid-19 forced the cancellation of the second swim. ~\$3K of retained entries have been offset in the accounts. Although the pandemic caused this cancellation, I highlight that poor weather caused weak net profits in 2018/19 and that there is major risk in relying on the Island Challenge as a reliable source of income.

- The Sportspersons Lunch generated a similar profit to last year (\$25K) which has significantly contributed to the surplus – Thanks again to club stalwart Steve Gillis and this fantastic yearly commitment to fund the Aussie's touring team.

- The Lifesaving teams supporting our various education courses continue to provide a significant contribution to the Club of \$24K.

- The Kiosk produced a net profit of \$7K – this is a great result, as the venture employs a significant number of Junior members. Significant thanks to the office staff and a number of parents for a lot of the hidden tasks required to make this work.

- The Coogee RunSwim Biathlon was planned but cancelled due to Covid-19 – approximately \$9K of entry fees were paid and have been offset in the accounts. Titan Gym had been engaged as a major supporter. This has potential to be a low risk major source of revenue in the future.

Other Earnings. Interest earned on our Cash and Term Deposits is up \$10K over the year from investments. This will be reduced in the future as \$270K (net of GST) NSW Club Infrastructure Grant will be diverted to Randwick Council for use in the funding the building redevelopment.

FY20 Expenditure – high level.

- Patrol & Education costs were reduced by \$16K (17%)

- Competition expenses (excluding Entry Fees & purchase of new Surf Boat in F19) were reduced by \$3K (17%). Entry fees for carnivals up to and including NSW Championships were as per F19

- Cancellation of the Australian Championships reduced Entry Fees by \$14K and Touring Costs by approximately

\$20K. Some exceedingly good work by the Competition Committee ensured the Club received back 'at risk' accommodation deposits in full.

- Event costs were down \$29K (48%) due to the cancellation of Island Challenge (April), Run Swim and Coogee Carnival.

- Admin & Office costs were generally in line with F19 Building Maintenance was down by \$38K recognising the impending building redevelopment. Closure costs of ~\$10K were incurred.

Summary:

A review of the Balance Sheet suggests our Club remains in a sound financial position, highlighted by the Net Asset and Net Cash position.

There are considerable challenges in the coming year:

- It is essential that there is a highly profitable restart of the new Function Room – this is the major controllable source of income and will only be active for 6 months given November commissioning.

- Despite Covid-19 restrictions the actual income that can be expected from the major fundraising events (Island Challenge Nov/Apr & RunSwim) must be maximised.

- There will likely be Covid-19 impacts on the amount of income in donations, grants and sponsorship. Many of our loyal sponsors and donors have been heavily impacted by Covid-19, and there is much competition for grants within lifesaving and all tiers of government.

- Discipline in expenditure must be maintained until our income is secured.

This has been a very tough year – I would like to thank Paul Hinds for his support after I assumed this role in September. I would like to take the opportunity to thank Karen Beale & Debbie Zonich for their essential contributions. An unsung hero of the club is Rob Gibellini, who tirelessly seeks out and applies for numerous grants – most of which are successful and help us offset significant expenses – sincere thanks for your efforts over many years.

Lastly to the Governors (Luna & Tony) & the Executive – thanks for your patience and support.

We communicate with the Management regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

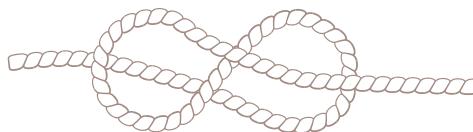

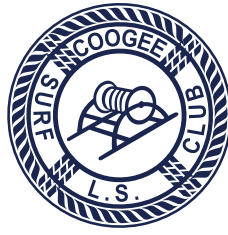

CHARLES 'BARRIE' CRIBB ASM Club Patron 1989-2020, Life Member and 75 Year Long Service Member

Barrie Cribb died at the age of 91 on Friday 8th May 2020 in MacLean Hospital. Barrie carried a lot of titles; Club Patron, Life Member, 75 Year Long Service Member of the Association and the award of ASM from the Federal Govt.

He joined the Coogee Club in season 1942 - 43, gained his bronze No 20380 in 1944-45 along with the Emerson twins, John and Keith and with the movers and shakers of that era. These included Rupert Mudge, founder of the Minnows, Ron Wells, John McGowan, Clyde Park and Kevin Turner, the last two being the last of our 75 Year members.

Barrie carried a couple of nick names - Slim, The Cloud and Cribby. He was a very good swimmer and became part of the Junior R&R on joining. He had an exceptional record serving our club as Chief Instructor, Secretary, Club Captain and President. He was also one of the foundation members of The Penguins Winter Swimming Club 1947-48 along with names like Cannott, Little, Johnston, and Day.

Being too young to join up for the war he made sure that the Anzac tradition remained strong within the club. He worked with Nob Hill on establishing the World War II Honour Roll, a board that is a valuable reminder of those who served both Country and Club.

Barrie, along with Alan Kennedy, is credited with the foundation of the SLSA in Great Britain. Both Barrie and fellow club member Ted Renshaw were instrumental in club start-ups in the UK. The first club was set up in Bude, Cornwall with both Barrie and Ted instructing and with Barrie also examining.

In the mid 1960's Barrie negotiated to gain more crown land in order to expand the club to the footprint it has today. Barrie was also carnival organiser of State Surf Championships held on 13th and 14th February 1965 at Coogee. The State Association congratulated Barrie on conducting the best organised Surf Championships ever held. As Club President he oversaw the handover of the Coogee Surf Boat, sponsored by 'The Associated Motor Club' to Cornwall Surf Club, Parrenforth. The UK Prime Minister, Harold Wilson, wrote a letter to the Coogee Club thanking them for their donation of the surf boat. Barrie also organised the South African Surf Lifesaving Test with Australia which was held at Coogee. This was at the time of apartheid, so it did attract protesters. However, it was run successfully with only a few hiccups.

Barrie excelled as an administrator, being Chief Instructor, Club Captain, Club Secretary and was President for six seasons from 1965 to 1971. He was Club Patron from 1989 till his passing. Barrie was awarded the Honour Blazer in 1949, a 50-year long service award in 1993 and 75-year award in 2018. He held the Australian Sports Medal.

Of his many achievements in the late 1940's and early 50's he, along with Norman May, made the club competitive in the surf, especially in the belt and surf races, at carnivals. As a competitor Barrie was a team member of the senior R&R in the late 40's and into the 50's and a march past coach. He was a Club Champion and was selected as a Branch Representative and was named in the Australian team to compete in Hawaii, but he did not tour at that time.

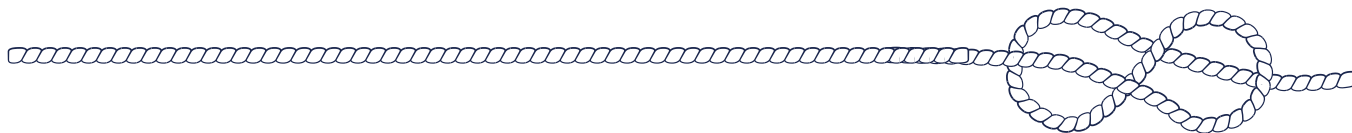
Born in Grafton, Barrie moved north to Yamba Surf Club in the late 1970's and gave them the benefit of his expertise. He was made President of Yamba Surf Club and swam every day at the ocean pool. They even gave him his own swim lane, Cribby's Lane.

Barrie is mentioned 33 times in word and photos in Joe's Book - 100 years of Vigilance and Service of Coogee Surf Club. He did help and encourage so many young members in his surf club career and that is why so many members from home and abroad have conveyed their sympathy.

He was a unique character who had salt water in his veins and surf lifesaving in his head. Our club was blessed to have had his company. He will be missed.

BARRY 'BOLLA' TELFORD **Coogee SLSC Life Member**

Barry 'Bolla' Telford died on Monday 17th February 2020 in the Prince of Wales Hospital. Barry had been in and out of hospital over the months prior to his passing. 'Bolla' as he was affectionately known, was one of the club's great characters. A country boy who grew up on the beach at South West Rocks before moving to Sydney and transferring to the Coogee Club.

He received the Honour Blazer in 2006 for work during that year. For his contribution to the Club over many years he was awarded Life Membership in 2009.

FELICITY BROWN (NEE BREENE) **Original female member 1980 and first female** **Honour Blazer recipient**

All who knew Felicity were saddened to hear of the unexpected passing of one of Coogee Surf Club's first female members, Felicity Brown, who died 23 December 2019.

Felicity gained her bronze medallion in season 1981/82, soon after females were invited to join our club. She was one of only 7 female trailblazers and went on to become one of our first truly influential female members in lifesaving, education, and competition officialdom.

On joining Coogee, Felicity quickly became an Assistant Chief Instructor, before taking over as Chief Instructor of our club during seasons 1986/87 & 1987/88. Felicity was the first female to be awarded our prestigious Honour Blazer in 1987. She also travelled to Vancouver on a World Lifesaving Instructional Tour that same season. Felicity was also a Finalist in the State Patrol Person of the Year award. She held several other positions on club committees and was a member of Sydney Branch Board of Examiners.

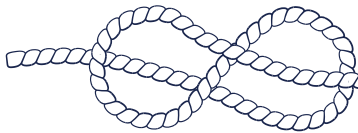

JEFFREY 'SNAYLEY' SAYLE OAM **50 Year Long Service Member, Australian Surf Boat Champion** **and a Wallaby representative.**

It was a very sad day for Coogee Surf Lifesaving Club and our partners in sport, Randwick Rugby Football Club ("RDRUFC"), with the loss of Jeffrey Leonard Sayle. Jeff passed away on the 30th September 2019, a 50-year member and one of the club's truly great characters. Snayley, as he was affectionately known, was an integral part of Coogee's "Golden Day" of boat rowing when both our "A" and "Reserve" crews won Australian gold medals in 1972 at Blacksmiths Beach. Jeff was in the Reserve crew swept by the late John Lemarseny, who was to become Jeff's lifelong friend and who he called 'Dad'.

Jeffrey had so many great friends at our club and at Randwick Rugby where he was Club Patron. The "Patron Saint" of everything to do with Randwick Rugby as well as strong believer in Coogee Surf Club, Jeffrey's presence was immense throughout the years. As a club member he always attending our AGM's and spoke on behalf of RDRUFC. As a guest speaker at functions and sportsman's lunches he was, without doubt, one of the funniest, jovial, larrikin and larger-than-life characters of both the rugger and surf club. The stories of his exploits, especially off-field, could be told for weeks! His favourite restaurant was the Dong Dong which became a weekly tradition as a meeting place where he enjoyed the company and a wee drink.



Despite his prominence around our club, Snayley's greatest passion was the sport of Rugby Union. This is where he achieved legendary status around Australia and the World. At the height of his football career, he achieved the greatest honour of playing a test for Australia against the All Blacks. In these early years as a rugby flanker and as a rower for Coogee he was a sight to behold, with one of the fittest and strongest physiques one would ever want to see. As time went on, Snayley played hundreds more games for Randwick as a prop forward. He went on to coach 1st grade at Randwick for many years in the 1980's and 90's before coaching the NSW Waratahs. Jeffrey was a Life Member of RDRUFC and of NSW Rugby. In 2006 he was bestowed with the Order of Australia Medal for Services to Rugby through Randwick and Surf Lifesaving through Coogee Surf Club. He was also an Australia Day Representative, delivering his message to many country towns throughout the State. In recent years, and with failing health, he was lovingly cared for by his sister Janette with whom he shared a special bond. Also The Duck and Phibys were constantly by his side.

On behalf of all Coogee Surf Club members we express our deepest sympathies to Jeffrey's family, friends, and colleagues. Jeff will be remembered on the pitch and on the beach as there will only ever be one Jeffrey Sayle.

NORMAN "NOB" HILL **75-Year Long Service Member and 1907** **Foundation Medallion recipient.**

It was with great sadness that the club announced the passing of 75-year Long Service Coogee Surf Club member Norman "Nob" Hill. Nob passed away at 95 years of age peacefully in hospital on Saturday 28th March 2020. He left Coogee only a couple of years back to be closer to his son Greg and his family in the Coffs Harbour area.

Nob joined our club in 1941 and gained Bronze Medallion No 17275. He quickly became involved in the Rescue & Resuscitation competition team before enlisting for WWII and joining the RAAF in 1942.

Nob saw action in Europe before returning to Coogee in 1946. On his return, Nob became heavily involved in surf club life in the areas of boat rowing (mid 1940's) through to march past in the late 50's. Nob served on the club council and lifesaving committee in the positions of Vice and then Club Captain and later as Vice President. In 1947 he became a founding, and later a Life Member, of the Coogee Penguins Winter Swimming Club. Norm was still actively swimming Penguins at over 90 years of age.

Norm was an extremely proud Digger who ran our club's Anzac Day memorial services for 20 years. A quote from his 2006 Anzac day speech highlights his great respect for those who served our country, "The World War 1 boys created the Anzac Spirit that you hear about today, they wouldn't take a backward step and would sooner die than let their mates down". Additionally, he, along with Barrie Cribb, were the driving force and researchers behind the creation of our downstairs Ex-Servicemen's Honour boards.



Nob was a true gentleman and one of the most respectful people you could ever meet. He stood tall and proud and commanded respect from all club members for what he achieved. State Members of Parliament, Marjorie O'Neill, paid respect to Norm in a speech she made in Legislative Assembly of NSW Parliament which is now registered in Hansard while Councillor Tony Bowen also paid tribute to Norm at Randwick City Council's April meeting. Norm was very well respected within the wider community.

On behalf of all Coogee Surf Club members, we express our deepest sympathy to Norman's family and surf club friends. Norm was the last surviving WWII veteran Member of Coogee Surf Lifesaving Club. His passing marks the end of an era for our club. You did Australia and Coogee SLSC proud Norman "Nob" Hill. His legacy will live on. We will remember him.

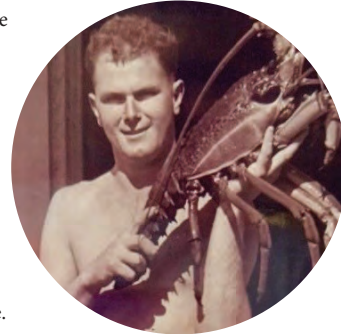

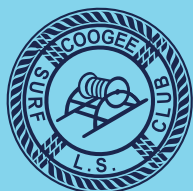
ROBERT 'LOBSTER BOB' RIGBY 50 Year Long Service Member

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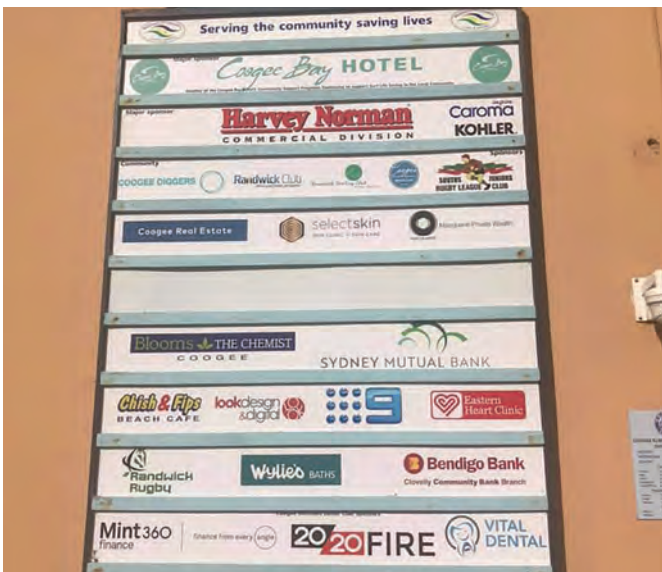
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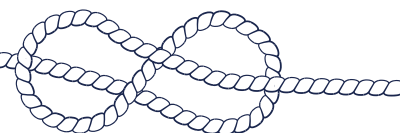
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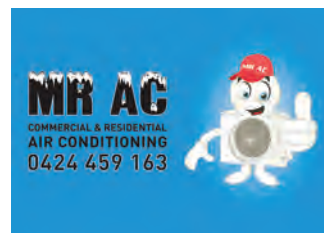
