- Delivered to the Honorary Secretary, not less than eight (8) days before the date fixed for the holding of the Annual General Meeting.

Ladies and Gentlemen, a new season, a new constitution, a renovated Clubhouse, and a new normal. The following pages reflect the activities and achievements of the Club and its members during the past year.



Ladies and Gentlemen, Presented to you is the 115th Annual Report and Financial Statement for your consideration.

In Lifesaving terms, the season was once again a success and it is always a pleasure that we can report "NO LIVES LOST" on the beach whilst our patrols were on duty in a summer that was once again disrupted by the continuing pandemic.

Congratulations and thank you to all our Patrol Captains, Vice Captains and active patrolling members for fulfilling your duties both professionally and responsibly throughout the season where you compiled over 21 thousand hours of voluntary community service, completed 6 rescues and countless first aid treatments.

AGM AND LIFE MEMBERS

The season started with the Annual General Meeting being held under Covid-19 restrictions and a Clubhouse in mid-renovation. As a result, the 2020 AGM was held off-site at the Randwick Club and via video link for those that registered. This meant that electronic voting was used for the first time in the history of the club. From that AGM, we empowered a new committee under the new constitution endorsed at the SGM held a few months earlier. We thank the committee and the organizers of our last AGM for their efforts and getting the season kicked off in a timely manner and under unprecedented conditions.

Also at that AGM, we had the proud moment to endorse two of our latest Life Members in Simon Figures and Pat Garcia. Congratulations to you both on the greatest honour the Club membership can bestow, and on your extraordinary achievements as members of our great Club.

MANAGEMENT

With the new constitution adopted, the new streamlined committee kicked off in September, with quite a few new members and a newly distributed portfolio. We are still feeling our way through the operations of the club under the new structure, but the coming season should be even more productive, as we target our strengths and weaknesses identified in the recent Strategic Workshop sessions.

LIFESAVING AND EDUCATION

As already noted, our patrols performed exceptionally over the summer, and we thank outgoing Club Captain, Andy Gardiner for completing four years in this role. These results come from dedication and commitment across the full patrolling membership, and Andy and his Lifesaving Committee are to be heartily congratulated.

From an education perspective, the season started in the unfortunate position of having no Clubhouse and yet operations expected to commence and proceed as normal. We would like to thank the Randwick Club and Coogee Randwick RSL for providing facilities where we could train and educate our members to ensure our operations continued as close to normal as possible. These facilities were also used for our early season Committee meetings as we settled into the summer.

Although training and education was being managed at an offsite facility until January, our education team still managed to continue our recent form and cadence of squads to achieve the greatest number of awards in Sydney — Coogee Surf Life Saving Club —

Branch, but in particular Bronze Medallions. To be achieving this year after year is a great accolade, and congratulations should be passed on to our education team for an outstanding effort under difficult circumstances.

The full lifesaving activities of the summer are detailed in the Club Captains and Education reports to follow.

COMPETITION

On the competition front, the club has had its most successful season ever at an Australian Championships. Not since the boom years of the early 1970s where we dominated the Beach events as individuals and relay teams has Coogee brought home more gold medals. As the sun finally set on the Aussies, Coogee had won a total of 8 Gold in the Youth and Open carnivals across Beach and R&R events, with a further 5 Gold in the Masters, along with many silver and bronze medal results and outstanding personal achievements. Congratulations to the competition team, coaches, trainers and committee for an outstanding season. The full competition activities of the summer are detailed in the Competition Directors report and Championship results to follow.

EVENTS

With a Covid enforced cancellation of the Island Challenge in November, April saw the return of the event for what was a delayed 20th Anniversary. With close to 1500 swimmers participating, it was a fantastic fundraising event for the Club. Sharon Deans, Tass Karozis and their Events Committee are to be heartily congratulated on running a great event, and the volunteer effort amazing as always. This event continues to grow in stature, thanks to all involved.

COMMUNITY

Coogee Surf Club continued our ongoing commitment to community programmes in 2020/21, running successful programmes with the UNSW and ongoing support for the Autism Swim, colloquially known as Dippers. Thanks to Helen Murphy and her team for running a successful programme. As we approach the new season, other programmes are now being developed. We encourage all members to support and get involved in these rewarding efforts.

MEMBERSHIP

Club membership had a mixed season, with a total of 2250 members across all categories. This is reflected in the membership summary at the start of this Annual Report and detailed listing at the conclusion. While lower than last season, of particular note has been the encouraging continued growth in the Active Senior (18yrs+) and Active Junior (15-18 yrs) membership categories. Unfortunately, we do not see the same growth in the Cadet (13-15 yrs) category which has continued a slight decline. This has been identified as a weakness we need to address.

The biggest change in membership numbers compared to last season has been seen in the Junior Activity Members (Minnows 5-13 years). This was to be expected with the Covid restrictions limiting the group activity size and interaction, and the Minnows cancelling the U6 Age Group activities altogether. We are expecting the Minnows group membership to rebound in the coming season when hopefully all restrictions are removed.

ADMINISTRATION AND OPERATIONS

From an Administration and Operations perspective, the club reopened to its members in December 2020, just in time for the Christmas period. We had hoped to open the lower clubhouse earlier in the season, but we were thwarted by water damage caused by a series of east coast lows. We thank all our membership for your patience during the renovation period, and we hope you enjoy our new Ocean Room facilities.

On a personal note, I would like to thank Tony Waller and Matt Scanlon for countless hours in working with the external building contractors during the renovation works, and their continued support as we work through the minor issues that remain to be resolved. Matt, in particular, has been on hand almost 24/7 during this period, and we cannot thank him enough.

With the Ocean Room renovation now complete, we are seeing significant interest in the hire of the Club facilities for private functions and great attendance at Sunday afternoon trading. These will allow the Club to become financially self-sufficient and allow expenditure in areas that have been tightly controlled in recent years. This doesn't mean we can be any less vigilant with our expenditure, and all expenses will need to follow the processes we have put in place to ensure our ongoing viability as a Club.

While the Clubhouse may have been closed to members from April 2020, the Club was still operational as a business. In December, we also appointed Trudy Jones as our Functions Manager to be the first point of contact for all potential Ocean Room bookings. These names are the persons that kept the Club running through the closure of the Clubhouse during the renovation, and through the winter of the pandemic, in preparation for the season ahead. They are unsung heroes of the Club, and deserve every accolade that can be afforded them. We are truly lucky to have them working for Coogee SLSC and I personally thank these three people for their extraordinary efforts.

This season, we again lost some long and distinguished members of our Surf Club community. To all those who lost family or friends during the past year, the Club extends our sincerest condolences.

In conclusion, it has been a very successful year for the Club. This success has not been achieved by individuals, but the efforts of many. Thank you for the honour of being Club Secretary for our great Club this season and I greatly appreciate everything we have achieved.

Building Committee Report

On the 13th December 2020 our Club celebrated the re-opening of our clubhouse after major renovations which took nine months to complete.



With the Covid pandemic and a community lock-down hitting just as the works were to begin there was much trepidation as to whether we should commence the works.

Would we be able to get the necessary tradesmen? Would the hardware and building supplies be readily available?

After much deliberation it was decided to commence the works, as the Clubhouse was to be closed because of the pandemic regardless. It was a prudent decision by the management committee which held its nerve and commenced the project.

Overall delays were experienced totalling approximately 2 months. The most significant being the elevator which arrived only days before the official opening. Strings were pulled by Lifesavers who knew Lifesavers (we are a diverse bunch) and magically our newly arrived elevator cleared customs and the wharves in record time. Its installation was completed the night before the opening ceremony. Catastrophe diverted!

The opening ceremony was something to behold. Lifesavers, both young and old; community members, The President George Shales and board members of Surf Life Saving NSW watched on whilst Club President Todd Mison and the Mayor of Randwick Danny Said officially cut the ribbon and declared the Club open for business.

We thank both the State Government and Randwick City Council for their financial support of this project.

A special mention must also be made of the fantastic support given to the Club by the Council Officers, the project team from Xenia, and the architectural team from AJ&C.

REVITALISING AN ICON

So, what have we achieved? The Clubhouse had been extended over time resulting in a series of disparate rooms with access difficulties and no visual connection from Clubhouse to beach. Its most loved features were the iconic clock and classical style portico which needed to be retained. Keeping within the existing building footprint the brief was to repair and augment as much of the structure as possible with a further requirement to remediate the damaged seawall upon which our Clubhouse sits.

The outcome has surpassed our expectations. With a function centre & training space for our members we are now able to conduct up to five separate training sessions & meetings at the one time in a fully compliant public hall.








Another turbulent year rounds out our season, and proof that our lifesavers can adapt to the ever-changing environment of life with Covid-19. We have an exemplary group of people stepping up to keep our community and beach safe.







Club Captain's Report



ANDY GARDINER

This season has been one of uncertainty and disruption, for obvious reasons, but I am not going to drone on about Covid-19 as I think everybody has heard enough on that subject. I would like instead, to congratulate all our patrolling members and trainers who rose to the challenge of patrolling and training in uncertain times and applaud the tenacity, resilience and good humour which has carried them all through a turbulent season.

This was my fourth year as Club Captain, and I have enjoyed this one just as much as the others. It has been particularly pleasing to watch our younger members rise through the ranks on committees, patrols, in the training arena and across competition. We are blessed with a host of talented young men and women at Coogee SLSC, and I look forward to continuing to help them succeed in their Surf Life Saving careers.

The patrols, as always, were well attended. Despite the restrictions of the pandemic, our life savers completed over 20,000 hours of volunteer service from the end of September 2020 to the end of April 2021, an average of nearly 3,000 hours every month. The weather was up and down this season and so were the crowds. There were some very busy days, but Christmas and New Year passed without incident and there was a feeling of calm across the entire summer holiday as locals enjoyed their beach without the usual crowds of tourists.

Despite the smaller crowds, there always seem to be people who find a way to injure themselves. There were 165 serious first aid treatments required, but the patrols were on hand, as always.

There were also some serious rescues performed this season, including the Branch Rescue of the Month in November 2020. Brie Turner, Matt Serhon & Alexandra Scott responded to a capsized fishing vessel in the bay. Brie and Matt in the IRB, with Alexandra coordinating the emergency services from the beach, extracted 2 very tired and scared individuals, one with a dislocated shoulder, and safely returned them to shore for urgent medical attention. Without their swift and professional response, the outcome could have been very different, and it was a great reminder of the important work that all our volunteers do.

November's Coogee Island Challenge had to be cancelled, but the April swim went ahead and was one of the largest island events we have ever had with nearly 1,400 swimmers taking part. The social media and communications around the event were also a big factor in the day's success and thanks go to all the volunteers and the organising committee; Tass Karozis, Sharon Deans, Nicola Logan, Melanie Reiter, Sarah Young, Michael Scroop and Martin Mashford. It was great to see their effort, experience and attention to detail rewarded with so many smiles by everyone who attended.

Our Education team managed another 138 new bronze medallion holders, as well as 64 Minnows who completed their Surf Rescue Certificates. Thanks to the lead trainers and their teams in the Bronze and SRC courses; Charlotte McHenry and Allison Roberts, Michael Barnes and Adam Treharne and Doug Hawkins and George Fatseas. Countless other trainers assisted them and also gave their time to train higher awards and the Thunder and Lightning Bronze

courses. Without this team, the club would grind to a halt, so thank you to you all.

Two members gained their Gold Medallion this season. This is the highest life saving award available and congratulations must go to Brett Morgan and Raul Plimer.

This season, Coogee produced a total of 377 new awards, the most in the branch yet again.

Despite restrictions, everybody still had to complete their Skills Maintenance. Our Proficiency Officer. Cameron Callaghan managed 3 fullservice days and multiple specialist sessions, all running very smoothly. Cameron introduced a session booking system to manage Covid restrictions. This was a great solution and had the added benefit of providing a dedicated time for members to arrive, which meant less standing around on the beach and more time getting things done.

As a result, Cameron was able to oversee 801 members through their skills maintenance and get them competition and patrol ready. Well done Cameron.

The results of the patrol competition were added to the patrol's scores from inspections across the season. Congratulations to Patrick Moore and Patrol 6 who took the honours as Patrol of the Year.

Congratulations also to Matt Larkin who was awarded Patrol Person of the Year in what was a very close competition.

Chief Snstructor's Report

I am pleased to report that during the 2020-2021 season the Education area continued to deliver the highest number of Awards (377) in the Surf Life Saving Sydney Branch. This was in spite of restrictions due to COVID19 as well as having no club room to train in during the first few months of the season.

I would like to thank The Randwick Club and James Giltinan from the Eastern Suburbs Tennis Club for their support in allowing us to use their facilities to deliver our courses.

This season we welcomed 139 new bronze medallion members, which is the highest in the Sydney Branch as well as a significant 40 % increase from the previous season.

The Spring Bronze started off the Bronze courses. This was the first season we saw the fruition of our Coogee SLSC Academy members as they progressed from SRC to Bronze. Transition through the Academy meant that they were more engaged with the Club over the years in areas of education, leadership, competition and community service. There was only 1 Academy member who did not achieve their bronze this season and this was due to medical issues, we hope to see them well soon. This demonstrates the effectiveness of the Academy in membership retention and development.

This season we ran several Transition Bronze courses for members as they go from SRC to Bronze. The new SRC and Bronze medallion courses will allow for a smoother and shorter transition from SRC to Bronze medallion in future seasons. The Lightning Bronze course lead by Doug Hawkins continued to deliver opportunities to non-members to achieve their Bronze Award over a 10 day period and join the Club participating in patrols and contributing to all of the Club activities.

The last of our Bronze courses was the Dads and Mums Army Course. This course was established to train Minnows parents to take on roles during patrols but also to provide water safety and lifesaving needs during Minnows.

This season our members continued to upskill by achieving Higher Awards including Silver Medallion Beach Management, IRB crew and driver, Advanced Resuscitation Techniques, Gold Medallion, First Aid, Trainers and Assessors showing the depth of our member qualifications.

Even though international University student numbers were reduced due to COVID19 restrictions, this season, Coogee SLSC continued to support and deliver courses to community groups including. The University of New South Wales. Members attended a full day course where they learned about the dangers and joys of using Coogee beach. I look forward to developing new Community programs next season to engage further with the various community groups.

Building on from previous seasons, we continued our close relationship with the Coogee Minnows, delivering the SRC course to under 14's. We were also engaged with various age managers in developing education programs to be incorporated into the Sunday morning Nipper activities, best preparing them towards their SRC. We delivered Resuscitation Awards to the under 13's and under 12's groups. I would like to thank Tracey Constantinou, Sean Wain, James Campbell, Will Charles, Jon Harwin and Rachel Garcia for their assistance as under 14's, 13's and 12's age managers. I look forward to developing our Minnows relationship further next season.

Being again, the most successful Surf Lifesaving Club in the Sydney Branch does not come easy and is definitely not a l person achievement but rather a solid education team outcome. Members of the Education team again selflessly and with dedication worked together to provide numerous hours in the training room and on the beach delivering our courses. This year saw our Education Team grow with the addition of several new trainers and assessors.

I would like to take this opportunity to wholeheartedly thank my Education Team including Zach Giltinan as the Assistant Chief Training officer. The lead trainers from Spring Bronze (Allison Roberts and Charlotte McHenry), SRC, Academy and Transition Bronze, Resuscitation under 13's and 12's (Doug Hawkins and George Fatseas), Lightning Bronze and Dads and Mums Army Bronze (Doug Hawkins), Summer Bronze (Adam Treharne, Fiona Phelps and Michael Barnes). Higher Awards are essential to up-skill our patrolling members ensuring that we continue to provide the highest possible care on our beach. This season Craig Howie, took on the lead for the Advanced Resuscitation Techniques with Beck Mister. The IRB area continued to be led by Andrew Tooher, Scott Parker and Brie Turner excelled by training both IRB crew and drivers, that are critical roles on every patrol. The Coogee Silver Medallion returned this season lead by myself and supported by 16 members who improved their skills both on the beach and in the classroom gaining valuable knowledge and experience specific to patrolling on Coogee Beach. The highest achievable Award obtainable in Surf Life Saving is the Gold Medallion, and this season I was privileged to be the lead trainer for the squad. It was personally rewarding to see members train and achieve higher awards on their way to the gold medallion.

I would like to also thank the numerous trainers, assessors and club members who assisted during the various courses supporting the lead trainers. There are too many to individually name here but they are all well known to both new and old club members, so they have not gone unnoticed. I would like to thank all of our Club Members who supported Education and took on Higher Awards this season.

The 2020-202l season continued to be personally rewarding for me as CTO. I enjoyed seeing the fruition of programs started in previous seasons. I enjoyed working with Rebecca Waugh as the Director of Youth Services, Mary Ryan and Wayne Penn who looked after the Academy and Ruby Thomasyu as the Junior Captain. It was also rewarding welcoming so many new Bronze Members to the Club from various backgrounds and also see old members achieve their gold medallion after seasons of training.

Finally but not least, I would like to thank the Lifesaving Committee lead by our Club Captain Andy Gardiner and our Club Management Committee for their continued support, and assistance throughout the season and our wonderful ladies in the office Debbie Zonich and Karen Beale always cheerful, supportive and facilitating.

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





Competition Director's Report

It was a season like no other, starting with a new set of policies and procedures for everything in consideration of the global COVID pandemic.

The limitations on training and a paucity of carnivals in the first half of the season lurched into an explosion of carnivals post-Christmas culminating in Aussies on the Sunshine Coast where we achieved the club's greatest ever haul of eight Australian Championship wins to mark this season as truly memorable for something other than coronavirus.

The season began in a climate of social distancing and limitations on group sizes for gatherings. This, combined with the ongoing club renovation, meant conducting a training session was a difficult exercise let alone competing. Carnivals that have been regular fixtures on the season calendar were being cancelled as they could not comply with all the public health orders. With only boat carnivals able to go ahead pre-Christmas, early season was all about preparation and positioning the competition area to be ready once competition opportunities arose. During this period, the Coogee Boat Academy was launched, the Coogee SLSC Competition group was established on Team App as the common communication channel, and the new R&R trailer delivered.

The first event on the club competition calendar held prior to Christmas was the Anonymous Donors Biathlon. First across the line was Finian Stronach, first female Melanie Reiter and the team event was won by Will Mison and Joey Todd. Special thanks to Michael Scroop for organising and conducting this event.

Once NSW SLS got to the point where they were confident that they could hold the State Championships in March, releasing the entry circular to clubs on 23rd December, the competition calendar began to fill to bursting point. After a few cancellations of events, the season finally swung into action with the traditional Australia day long weekend carnivals at Manly and Freshwater, the start of a run of twelve weeks with two to three surf sports events every weekend until the end of State Championships, with a short break for Easter, then off to Aussies.

Squeezed into this period were the three well -attended rounds of the Club Championships, building on the reinvigoration last season and the appetite to compete after the limited opportunities in late 2020. Ashley Finegan and Jake Andrews were worthy winners of the Club Championships (Open and Junior for both) after the three rounds were completed. Madeleine Quinn and Max Moylan were the Cadet Champions. Thank you to all who attended and especially those who helped with the smooth running, including Mark Andrews, Michelle Finegan, Andrew Bloxsom, Renee Gibbs, and Ben McDonald, plus the band of recorders and Josh Ricamara who looked after IRB support.

Sydney Branch Carnivals were held at various locations in February. Maroubra for Beach events and Masters, Yarra Bay for water events after swarms of blue bottles caused the event to be moved from Maroubra. The R&R Branch was ultimately held at Coogee on 20th February after Coogee stepped in and applied to host. The carnival was well attended by teams from around Sydney and was lauded as a success. We were great hosts, but our teams weren't as charitable, dominating on the day.

Branch proved a valuable hit out for our surf and beach teams. There were many highlights and medals won including Jake Andrews winning the U19 surf race and combining with Cooper Stokes, Marcus Littlejohn, and Ethan Illidge to win the U19s surf team. Max Moylan came in second in the u15s surf race and combined with Campbell Groves, Josh Fernandez Zoltahn Szabo to claim the U15s surf team. Madeleine Quinn 1st in the U14 surf race and Zoltahn Szabo 3rd in the U14 Ironman and Ash Finegan 4th in Open Women's surf race.

On the track, the U15 girls dominated, and all the relay teams were stand outs. The three strong Lifesavings team also had great success with Lana Reiter 1st female U19, Josh Devine 2nd male U19 and Emma Grand 1st in Female Opens.

NSW STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

This year, with COVID considerations, the Open carnival was split with Water events at Swansea and Beach events at Redhead. Rules were put in place to prohibit competitors competing at different biozones, so competitors had to choose between Water or Beach events. Masters was held on another weekend with Life Saving events and Boats were separated out from Opens to be held on a fourth weekend, which ended up being postponed due to severe conditions and held two weeks later, on the weekend of 10/11 April, 5 days before Aussies began.

At the end of all that, Coogee placed 4th in Age and Masters, 5th in Opens. the only club to place top 5 in all, an amazing achievement. All medal results are listed separately.

On the Beach, we had 20 competitors make the journey up to the Hunter, our team winning 14 Medals, including 5 Golds, 4 Silvers and 5 Bronze, contributing 84 of the 139 points from the club point score.

In Life Saving events, our small team entered the Champion Lifesaver events as well as the Patrol Competition. The best results were in Champion Lifesaver, 3rd place to Josh Devine in ul9, with 4th placings to Lana Reiter (U19) and Emma Grand (Open).

In R&R, we had some excellent results and a great preparation for Aussies. In the Open Male 5 Person event Coogee finished a very close third to Freshwater and Wanda, our Open Mixed 5 Team finished a respectable 6th and with the addition of Jay Carter, improved to Bronze in the Open 6 Person.

The U19 Team continued their success by again winning their event. They also backed up straight after the U19 event to win their first NSW Open Women's 5 person. U15s events were at Redhead the weekend prior. In the U15 5-person event, two teams represented Coogee, with the U15 Team under coach Drew Hayes triumphant and our developing U14 Team also claiming the bronze. In the U15 2 Person event, Jasmine Miller and Michayla Penn won gold.

In Open Water events, in good conditions at Swansea Belmont, highlights were 7 finalists in surf swim (U15s Max Moylan, Josh Fernandez and Cooper Habler and U19s Ashley Finegan, Alfie Ashton, Cooper Stokes and Jake Andrews, with Ashley and Jake also progressing to the Open Surf race finals)

Jake Andrews made it through to the final of the U19 Ironman, the first year for Jake with the ski leg included. The under 15 surf team finished a very close 4th in their final.

Ashley Finegan won silver medals in both the female U19 and Open belt races. Jake Andrews finished a close 4th in the under 19 belt race. Thank you to Andrew Bloxsom for manning the reel, plus U17 and U19s assisting on the lines.

The boys made the semi-finals of the board relays in each age group, quarters of the Board rescue and the final of the ul9Taplin relay.

On finals day, Ashley finished 10th in Open Female Surf Race Jake 8th in the Open Male Surf Final. Ashley then backed up to finish 12th in the U19s and Jake finished 6th to grab a point in the U19 surf race final. The 15s also had strong races with Cooper 10th, Max 11th.

MASTERS STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Coogee Masters team finished 4th at the State Championships with 17 gold, 12 silver & 11 bronze medals. The highlight of the season was our first ever Female Ski Relay team. This has been something they have been striving to achieve for several seasons and they were thrilled with their State Championship bronze medal.

In the Boats, Coogee's 6 crews took it to the rest of the state with some of

our crews achieving great results, the best of which was Open Women crew, Coogee Recoverie, who improved with every race and saved their best till last where they executed their perfect race to finish in silver medal position. The U23 men's crew, Coogee Sons, finished 6th, their second consecutive state titles final.

In other results, our Open Men bowed out in the quarter finals, and two other U23 crews went out in the rounds against stiff competition. The Masters Women crew, Coogee Cogs, had a great run through to bow out in the semis.

Special thank you Rod (Termite) Colman, who swept the Open Men, U23 Sons, and Chameleons whilst their respective sweeps were on injury leave.

AUSSIES

Coogee sent a team of 121 to the Aussie titles on the Sunshine Coast in Queensland.

The carnival started with Youth events U14 and U15, over the first two days. Whilst there was no official point score for Youth, the team won 4 gold, 3 silver and 2 bronze medals. Highlights were aplenty on the beach track where 3 gold medals were won in U15 beach sprint by Luke Avati, the U15 female beach relay (Annabel Penny, Yasmeen Janschek, Eden Levit, and Leila Maxfield) and the U15 mixed beach relay (Annabel Penny, Eden Levit, Luke Avati, Nick Clemson). In the Ul4 2km beach race, Connor Boyd ran a very gallant race into the silver medal and Huon Groves also did well to finish 11th. They backed up in the U15 2x 1km relay to finish a very solid 8th.

In the flags Luke Avati in the ul5s had a great run through to the final, bowing out in 5th and Yasmeen Janschek in Ul5s placed 9th.

Elsewhere the R&R team also had success with the 2 person R&R team of Jasmine Miller and Michayla Penn earning the silver medal, losing on a countback to the eventual winners. The U15 5 person R&R team took out gold, with 5-point deduction in the final, and were thrilled with their own execution along with the result.

Competition was fierce in the water, but there was a silver medal won by Finn Wilkie in the U15 board riding event. Max Moylan and Campbell Groves made the final of u15 male surf swim. Madeleine Quinn and Zoltahn Szabo missed u14 surf race finals by one place each.

These remarkable results were borne out of the talent of long-term

Minnows, and years of development and coaching in that program.

In Masters competition, our relatively small team of 33 competitors continues to excel amongst the bigger club teams, finishing 8th on the table with 5 gold, 10 silver & 7 bronze medals. Highlights on the beach included the 170+ Female Beach Relay Team of Sharon Deans, Renee Gibbs, Helen Deas, and Linda Walsh winning their 4th Australian Title, with Sharon and Helen also going one-two in the 50-54 beach sprint. Rebecca Waugh won the 45-49 2km beach run title. There were many other medallists and finalists.

In the water, highlights included Elisha Smith winning the 40-44 years Female Surf Race and was a part of the winning 110 Years Female Surf Team with Nicola Logan and Sally Wood, our youngest Master, competing 5 months after joining the club.

In Opens, Coogee finished equal 16th in the pointscore. The team won 4 gold medals, so we have 8 new Australian Champions across Youth and Opens.

In Champion Lifesaver, we had 2 representatives, Josh Devine U19 and Emma Grand in female Opens, compete in the select 9 person fields, where entry is gained via high placings at NSW State Championships. Emma performed brilliantly to claim the bronze medal.

Our 7 boat crews competed hard all week but couldn't quite crack the finals. Still, it was a great effort to have so many crews competing at this level. The experience gained along with the increase in number of competitors and establishment of the Boat Academy has provided a great launch pad for next season.

On the beach, there were early highlights with a gold medal to Bailey Habler in ul7 2km beach run, a dominant run from start to finish, he crossed the finish line 30 metres in front of second. The following day, Bailey joined forces with Marcus Littlejohn to win the silver medal in the U19 2 x 1km relay run. Ruby Thomasyu made it through to the final of the U17 beach sprint and finished a very close 5th in final. The U17 mixed relay team of Ruby, Ryan Harper, Ellie, and Max Tanner were the best placed of all the relay teams, winning the silver medal. The boys and girls U17 relay teams both made their finals.

In R&R Open events, Coogee's six teams participated in 5 of the 6 finals conducted, winning 3 of the events, 2nd in another and two other top 6 finishes. The winning teams were the Open Men's 5 person of Chris Gately, Drew Hayes, Grant Hayes, Jay Carter, and Scott Ryan, coached by Andrew McEncroe, plus the U19 mixed team of Sami Gately, Bianca Wallace, Yasmin Stuetz, Eliza Bodkin and Grace McDonald, who backed up to win the Open Women's event against teams with far greater experience.

The Coogee team was able to win the Ron Sandstrom trophy for the most successful R&R club at the Australian Championships for the second time in the club's history, a great achievement for all involved in the R&R team and a great reward for their season long efforts.

In water events, the highlight was Jake Andrews, who qualified to swim the surf race finals in both the U19s and Open Men's races, where he swam two great races to finish 16th in the Opens final, then backed up 90 minutes later to finish 9th in the U19 surf race final.

In summary, a great effort by the whole team, not just the medal winners but all competitors who gave their all representing the Two Blues, they should be very proud of their achievements and efforts.

On behalf of all competitors, we wish to thank all our wonderful volunteer support personnel including carnival officials, IRB Water Safety, transport drivers, mentors, spectators, families, and club administrators.

Special thank you to all managers and Area Captains, along with Aidan Byrne, Renee and Steve Gibbs from the juniors. Thank you also to Kevin Allen (Officials Liaison), Michael Scroop (Coaching Coordinator) and Lachlan Smart (Assistant Competition Director) and all others who served on the Competition Committee and supported these efforts.

Special thank you also to the coaches, who do the season long journey with the competitors, led by senior coaches Chris Gately, Andrew McEncroe, Grant and Drew Hayes, Nick Wright, Cameron Habler, Craig Bennett, Rebecca Hamilton, Matt Leary, David Smith, Harvey Barratt, and Paul Beale.

Thank you to our Office administration staff, Debbie Zonich and Karen Beale who provided great support throughout the season. The ongoing support from the Management Committee of the club in all our endeavours is also greatly appreciated by all of Competition.

Competition cannot run without funds, so thank you firstly to our

ongoing sponsors, Harvey Norman, Sydney Mutual Bank and Macquarie Private Wealth and thank you to our new sponsors this season, BoHaus Café, Facilities First, Recoverie and Chargrill Charlie's. Thank you to Melanie Reiter in Sponsorship who helped facilitate these deals.

Thank you to all who helped raise funds through the course of the season, especially Steve Gillis for putting on the annual "Sportsman's Lunch", supplemented by the competition levies paid by the competitors. Hopefully now that the club is open for business there will be an opportunity to hold fund raising functions for Perth next season and create more social opportunities for the team to come together.

Finally, whilst we bask in the rosy glow from these Aussie results, we should contemplate that there is still lots of work to be done and improvements found. The boats area is on the way with its Academy. Great results were achieved in youth and R&R, but many areas lack depth, especially in water competition and no Open competitors in the beach area.

The water area will require expansion of coaching resources and significant spending on craft for the

coming seasons to develop the depth of the skilled juniors coming through the junior program, with the goal to eventually build an Open team again.

We should support and develop these young competitors as we build a strong competitive foundation from within our own Club.

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STEVE GIBBS

"Resilience" is the word which best describes our 2020/2021 season and I could not be more proud of how our Minnows and Volunteers persevered and in fact thrived through change and uncertainty to make this one of our best seasons yet.



First I want to recognised the herculean efforts of the Minnows Committee and particularly to Shannon and James Campbell, Emily Ashcroft, Catherine Yuan, Will Charles, Aidan Byrne and Kieran Brown who worked from April 2020 to completely re-design the Minnows Sunday Program at least twice, model and budget for the financial impacts of COVID, established the U15's Academy for the Light Blue Caps, implemented electronic sign ins and re-built the registration and proficiency process. Every step required multiple consultations with Council and SLSNSW and I cannot emphasise enough the work this group did to make our season happen. At the same time I want to call out Aidan Byrne, Renee Gibbs, Michael Kavanagh and Cameron Habler who again re-designed programs and negotiated with various authorities to enable our competition kids to train from July 2020.

Notwithstanding the obstacles our Minnows took great steps forward this year. Minnows engagement improved significantly on last year with consistently higher participation rates on Sunday mornings and 200 plus children attending at least 2 training sessions per week in addition to the Sunday program. It was pleasing to see the children developing deeper bonds both within their training groups and the Coogee SLSC community and developing their confidence in the surf. This is something we want to build upon next year and carry through into the Youth ranks of the club.

AS WITH ALL UNANTICIPATED CHANGE, WE WERE FORCED TO TAKE A STEP BACK AND CHALLENGE THE WAY THINGS HAVE ALWAYS BEEN AND WE LEARNED SOME NEW THINGS:

• We learned that once we remove parents from the beach our participation rates improved. Kids were more willing to have a go because there was not the option to stand next to Mum. At the same time Age Managers had better visibility of those kids who were less confident and could give them more time.

• We also learned that once 100 plus children are participating in swimming and board training during the week, the confidence and competence they bring to the Sunday program lifts the confidence of all of our children.

• Finally we learned that engaging our recent SRC's as our first line Water Safety improved the learning outcomes for our kids. These are all things we will take into next season.



I WANT TO CALL OUT SOME HIGHLIGHTS FOR THE SEASON

• We graduated 64 SRC's – The SLSNSW Examiners acknowledged this group was the most skilled group they had ever assessed. Well done to Sean Wain, Tracey Constantinou and Team.

• Promotion and inclusion of the active kids voucher for minnows registration.

• Water Competence – A combination of No parents, good weather and higher participation at board training contributed to a significant advance in surf confidence across the program.

• Competition – Aidan, Renee Michael, Cameron and team – Ran a great program and kept the kids motivated. Testament to this group that Coogee SLSC fielded its largest team at the NSW Age Championships with 144 competitors against a backdrop of lower participation rates in Nippers state-wide due to COVID with that team taking 4th place. Furthermore 2021 marked the first season the Minnows runners who have trained for years under Renee Gibbs and R&R teams who have trained under Chris Gately and Jen Trinca have had an opportunity to match themselves against Australia's best at the Australian Lifesaving Championships. Coogee SLSC's haul of 4 Gold, 2 Silver and 2 Bronze medals in the Youth Championships was simply fantastic. Our athletes and coaches have made us all very proud. With the depth of talent in our Lime Caps and Purple Caps ranks Coogee SLSC should have every reason to be hopeful that we can build upon this great result in years to come.

A large group of kids put their hands up to do the midweek resuscitation course which was very successful. We got great feedback from the lead trainer about our kid's knowledge and concentration on the nights. This was the kids first in hopefully many surf lifesaving certificates. The rest of the group got to check and refine their resuscitation skills on John Mudge day.

The season ended much the same as last season with Mother Nature cancelling the last day on the beach. This season the miserable weather stopped us which was better than last year's pandemic stop. We had planned a mini presentation for the whole group so we could acknowledge all the kids efforts during the season. Well done all the mighty Purple caps on outstanding effort all season.

And here we are, merely weeks away from completing our Surf Rescue Certificate next season. Many years of effort has got us to this point and the 2020-21 season was an absolute cracker. Notwithstanding the whole COVID thing, which we're certain has been covered elsewhere in the broader report, we managed to really focus on developing our core skills through the season. Building on our confidence and our individual skills; to really start developing our capacity for saving others (not just saving ourselves!).

This year we doubled down on tube rescues, both conscious and unconscious. Board rescues were prominent too; although, it would be fair to say, most unconscious patients largely resembled those who were considerably more conscious than not. Nonetheless, skills have been honed and we're rapidly starting to resemble the candidates of the red and yellow that we yearn to be.

Off the beach, there was extracurricular training in resuscitation and basic emergency care. Again, we saw a good section of the team take up the opportunity to develop these critical skills of a surf lifesaver. And beyond the shores of Coogee, our competitive team kicked exceptional goals from local carnivals through to State and Aussies.

From a coach's perspective, this year really saw a change in the individual focus of our young men and women. Not all at once and not always consistently, but the change was there. The reality definitely landed — within a year, we'll be lifesavers.

And as this reality took hold, our sons and daughters started to push their boundaries of comfort and fear. Some of the apprehension was replaced by self confidence, which sometimes paid off with a stunning board ride to the shore, and sometimes with a nose dive and an uncomfortable few seconds chewing sand. But it has been the response to the large surf and the chewing of the sand that has given us the greatest confidence in these young lifesavers, because this year their response changed from 'fear and tears' to one of admiration of the ocean, an acceptance of what had happened, and a desire to learn from it (of course with some emotive tears at times as well).

As we close out the 2020-21 season and refocus on the season ahead, there is much to be grateful for. We were lucky to have had our time on the beach, to train, to learn, and to work as a team. And as always we need to thank our Age Assistants and Water Safety for their continued support each and every weekend. It's a cliché, but we simply cannot run the Sundays without them.

Enjoy the off season with your winter sports. Remember the basics, keep swimming and be ready to be daring once again in the surf; to train hard, occasionally eat sand but all in the hope that when you are called upon to save a life, that you have the skills and team around you to do so without apprehension.

The 2020/21 season was set against a backdrop of the COVID-19 pandemic where our number 1 goal was to have a competitive season at all. As new guidelines were issued by NSW Health, our program had to be continually adapted to ensure the health and wellbeing of our competitors and families.

The great success of the season was that we put on close to a full program, once again had a top 5 placing at the NSW State Age Championships and, more importantly, all of the competitors enjoyed themselves and continued to show their commitment to competing for Coogee.

The season started under a cloud of uncertainty and with the number of participants at Community Events capped by the Government, it was becoming clear that most carnivals would be split between Sand and Water events and Age Groups. With no carnivals scheduled by the Sydney Branch Clubs and the Randwick Shield also cancelled, we were left to look across the Bridge for competition with the Sydney Northern Beaches Clubs and arrange our own local competition.

Our first carnival of the season was in early November where our Sand team competed at Queenscliff. The Water team kicked off their season with a visit to Swansea Belmont for the Kracka Challenge. Coogee also sent competitors to carnvials at Freshwater (Water) and North Narrabeen (Sand), while also hosting the Coogee Gala Day. The Coogee Gala Day was a Water and Sand invitational event for the U8-U14 age groups, with our Eastern Suburbs neighbours, North Bondi, Maroubra and South Maroubra in attendance. It was a resounding success and definitely a model to be used in the future.

Over Christmas, we got some clarity of what the NSW State Age Championships would look like - the make-up of these events was going to be like never before with the Championships being broken up into 4 sub events by age group and discipline (U9-U11 Sand, U9-U11 Water, U12-U14 Sand and U12-U14 Water). New rules were also introduced on the Sand limiting each competitor being only



able to compete in one team event. With the team events being a historical strength of Coogee, these rules were felt to be very harsh indeed, something all of our fellow Sydney Branch Clubs agreed with.

The Competition Team also ran the Coogee Champo Day in mid-February – it also acted as one final hit-out in preparation for State. Along with the other carnivals and gala day, all played important roles in honing and developing skills, building teamwork and having the team ready for the State titles. Despite all of the obstacles put in front of us, Coogee sent a team of nearly 140 competitors to compete at State.

On the 25th & 26th of February, our U9-U11s competed and on 27th & 28th of February our U12-U14s competed at Swansea Belmont (Water) and Redhead (Sand) – we were greeted by some big surf in the water and, while the carnival being split between Sand and Water gave it a different feel, our competitors were enthusiastic and ready to compete. As always, the competition was of a very high standard and all our competitors represented the Club with distinction.

Highlights included:

• The Club place 4th overall in the State with 173 points

• For the fourth year in a row the Sand team won the overall points score in their area.

• The Club won 5 individual medals: Gold (4)

Coogee Ssland Challenge

The COVID-19 pandemic affected events in such a profound and devastating way that scuttled mass events in 2020. The November 2020 CIC was not immune and with restrictions capping events to a maximum of 500 the swim was unfortunately cancelled.

By early 2021 restrictions had eased enough that it looked promising the April swim would proceed. The Events Committee moved full steam ahead with planning, albeit with far more detailed approvals and processes than in previous years.

One of these was developing a COVID-19 Safe Plan highlighting:

Paperless on-day entries, all online and no cash payments

New Rolling • Start arrangements, 3 entrants every 5 seconds

COVID check-in QR code(s) for . entrants and volunteers

Thanks also must go to our major sponsor Harvey Norman Commercial for their enduring support of our event, and to Coogee Diggers for the most welcomed post-event food for our hungry volunteers.

Registrations steadily were increasing, the ocean swim market was desperate for an event. Digital promotions were in full swing, the club's website event page revamped and the brilliance of social media saw immediate results in consistent surges of registrations as the event grew closer.

In the days leading up to the swim the local swell was significant that an ocean swim on the northern beaches was cancelled. Was this an ominous sign?

However come race day conditions turned around completely. The day was a cracker. Flat ocean, clear sky, outside temperature reaching 25 degrees with water temperature 23 degrees.

Coogee's renowned volunteer turnout didn't disappoint with over 180 registered volunteers!

Before sunrise the IRB's were fueled up and in the water setting out the marker buoys. Thanks to Randwick Council for supply of a new rainbow sock to the finish buoy as a symbol of inclusion.

The new beach setup incorporated a snake-like formation for competitors spread 3 across, encouraging a socially distanced start format, rolling into the start every 5 seconds. Registration tables became timing chip pick up points. Volunteer sign on sheets all by QR codes.

RUNSWIM COOGEE – Postponed till late 2021. As of going to press, road closure approvals under consideration by Randwick City Council.

For the first time in CIC history, late entries were ONLINE ONLY, removing a big slice of administration time on the heach

At race close, event numbers reached 1,459 swimmers - a 16% increase on April 2019 but a massive 55% increase on November 2019.

Notably, Vice Club Captain and PC, Emily Miers took out overall 2nd place in the womens 2.4km.



40 Years of Women's Participation



The 2020/2021 Season represents the fortieth anniversary of women's participation in Surf Lifesaving, and particularly Coogee Surf Club.

At the Annual General Meeting held on Sunday 26 July 1981, the motion by JJ Seddon (President) and seconded by PE Carney (Club Captain) that the Section/Sections of the Constitution reading "Membership of the Club is open to males over the age of 13 years" be amended to read "Membership of the Club is open to persons over the age of 13 years", and furthermore wherever the word "male" appears the word "male" be deleted, was carried by the membership.

This season represents the fortieth anniversary of female participation in Coogee Surf Life Saving Club. From our first four Bronze Medallions and three Qualifying Certificates in 1981/82, females now represent 43.9% of our patrolling members (Cadet, Junior and Active Senior), and a growing percentage of our Reserve Active (32.5%) and Long Service (12.0%) members. Females also represent 44.2% of our total membership that includes our Minnows, Associate and General membership categories.

On behalf of Coogee Surf Club Management, we would like to extend our thanks for all female contributions that have been made since their introduction in the 1981/82 Season, and also to the Management of the Club in the early years for their foresight to make female participation and inclusiveness a part of our Club.

We are very proud of everyone's contribution to our Club across all aspects including Minnows, lifesaving, competition and management, and indeed, we would not be the Club we are today without our female members.
































Community Education



Our club manages its resources in order to support its members when patrolling, competing, learning, training or teaching. The responsible management of our club's finances remains a key platform of our club's success.





ROBERT ILLIDGE

The Club reported an Operating Surplus of 143,593 – however 90,000 of this relates to a revaluation of the investment unit rather than club operations. Neglecting the revaluation, FY21 Operating Surplus was 53,593 (which compared to a Surplus of 76,951 in FY20 and a Surplus of 2,338 in FY19. This headline result was particularly welcome given the challenging Covid-19 operating environment and the considerable task of commissioning the new Functions room.

FY21 INCOME

Favourable revenue impacts included strong support of our sponsors, additional grants & donations, government COVID 19 support subsidies (Jobkeeper & Cash Boost), a successful Ocean Swim (Apr 2021) and strong trading for the 4 months post commissioning of the new Functions room. Unfavourable revenue impacts included the cancellation of one Island Challenge Ocean swim (Nov 2020), cancellation of RunSwim Coogee Biathlon and the loss of 8 months of functions/ bar trading as the new Functions room was built.

MEMBER SUBSCRIPTIONS

SLSNSW provided \$35K to allow us to support lifesavers through the impact of Covid 19. This amount was used to discount fees for cadet & active members and to support SRC's and family fee relief in the Junior club. Due to Covid-19, the Junior club had reduced members subscriptions. When the subsidy is factored into total member subscriptions, despite the disruptions the result is close to that of FY20. External Funding - Donations recovered significantly over this year to \$35K (FY20 \$7K) and sponsorship & grants remained strong at \$201K (FY20 \$211K). A special mention to all Junior & Senior club sponsors - thank you once again for honouring your sponsorship commitments despite the impact of Covid-19 - we could not do what we do without you. Jobkeeper & Cash Boost - the club is an eligible charity under these government schemes received \$77K to support payment of our office staff.

CLUB VENTURES

Function room income for 4 months was \$76K. Liquor sales were \$111.1K. Total Function room and bar expenses were ~\$200K and includes one-off fitout & commissioning costs (eg. stock) that make assessing the profitability problematic. Separation of the function/bar accounts from general operations and a longer period of normal trading will allow accurate analysis ongoing. The cancellation of Island Challenge in November and the cancelation of the RunSwim Coogee Biathlon were unfortunate hits. A superb effort by the Events Committee delivered a spectacular Island Challenge in April that yielded a net profit of around \$50K. Given the improved marketing strategies it is likely they will exceed expectations for both Island Challenges and the RunSwim this coming year. The Sportspersons Lunch generated a larger profit than last year (\$27K vs \$24.7K) - Thanks

Competition income was \$80.4K (FY20 \$41.1K) comprised of Competition Levy \$8.5K (FY20 \$12K), Aussies' accommodation payments \$51K (FY20 \$0) and gym fees (6 months) \$20.6 (FY20 \$28.4). • The Lifesaving teams supporting our various education courses & patrols at Wylies Baths continue to provide a significant contribution to the Club of \$36K (FY20 \$29K). • The Kiosk produced a net profit of \$2K. This social enterprise venture employs a significant number of Junior members. Significant thanks to the office staff and several parents for a lot of the hidden tasks required to make this work.

OTHER INCOME

 Other Earnings. Interest earned on our Cash and Term Deposits was \$8.2K, this reflects a reduction in balances as \$330K in grants held were remitted to Randwick Council (renovation costs) and the low interest rate environment. Note the club still holds a grant to the value of \$102.5K (exc. GST) that is to be paid to Randwick Council on final project acquittal.
Home unit returns were down 20% on FY20 due to Covid rent reduction. Note that rent relief allowed us to retain the tenant during FY21, and a new 6-month lease is in place.
Club Sunday raffles yielded \$8.5K - thank you to all competitors and supporters that made this happen.

FY21 EXPENDITURE - HIGH LEVEL

Expenditure was extremely well controlled in the first 6 months of the year and fitout of the Function room came in below initial expectations. Expenditure from January onwards was normalised and in the latter part of FY21 capital purchases of IRB motors, boards and skis for both the Junior and Senior clubs were made. Funds were also committed to upgrade both the competition garage and Memorial Hall to provide improved storage.

Lifesaving expenses were as per FY20 however Education expenses increased by 130%, largely due to increased awards and external courses. Many of these expenses were offset by grants. Total competition expenses less Sportsmans Lunch were \$168.1K. R&R trailer & craft purchases were \$36K & Aussies costs were \$88K (in line with previous championships held on the Sunshine Coast). Net competition expenses were 44K(FY2037.7K) when these items were deducted. Event expenses were up \$24.6K (72%) which largely reflects a return to 'normal' as the function room was used for member functions. Within this Island Challenge costs were only \$16K (FY20 \$23K) that reflects that some associated expenses (merchandise) that were not incurred in FY21. • Admin & Office expenses down \$16K (5%) on FY20. The were The main changes were a reduction in admin labour expenses of 20% and merchandise purchases of 77%. One-off fitout expenses were \$31K. Cleaning expenses for 5 months (due to Covid gym closure) were \$24K - equivalent to an annual spend of \$57K compared to \$27K in FY2020. This increase to meet COVID19

requirements remains a concern – annual gym fees offsetting this expense are typically \$28K. Fees may need to be reviewed in the future. • Maintenance expenses were \$34K (up 235%) but this includes significant plumbing works for the change rooms and accruals for the fitout of both the garage & Memorial Hall. • Insurance costs remain similar at \$53.3K. There is an active review of the current insurance portfolio underway. To date this will yield a minimum of \$8K in savings for FY22.

SUMMARY

A review of the Balance Sheet suggests our Club remains in a sound financial position, highlighted by the Net Asset and Net Cash position. Of note for the coming year:

The Management Committee acknowledge that members have made sacrifices over recent years. To 'give back' to members a fee reduction for next season has been approved - \$50 for senior members and \$25 for cadets. In addition, the charges for hot water in the shower areas will be removed over the coming months. There is a project underway to separate the club accounts into three areas - CSLSC Functions, Operations and Minnows. This will result in better reporting to the Management Committee and allow effective evaluation of profitability and enable better decision making. There are also projects underway to modernise all Financial Standard Operating Procedures, introduce electronic timesheets, review the bar register/stocking/POS systems and optimise the club's banking arrangements.

Once again this was a very tough year – I would like to thank Todd Mison and the Executive Committee for the enormous amount of effective work we managed, and David Winkle as Vice Treasurer for his assistance. I would also like to congratulate Steve Gibbs and the Minnows Committee for creating a brilliantly successful nippers' season during a pandemic, and for their sound financial management.

All members, please applaud our valued employces -Karen Beale, Debbie Zonich & Trudy Jones for their essential contributions. Karen is retiring from the club after 21 years of dedicated service and I would like to publicly thank her for everything she has done.

Andrew Gardiner is also finishing a long tenure as Club Captain – he tirelessly worked to improve Lifesaving at Coogee and has created a great legacy in that regard.

Yet again I single out Rob Gibellini for his massive and ongoing contribution to our club. He tirelessly seeks out and applies for numerous grants – most of which are successful and help us offset significant expenses – sincere thanks for your efforts over many years.

Lastly to the Management Committee, Building Committee (Matt & Tony) & Governors (Luna & Tony) – thanks for your patience and support.

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
