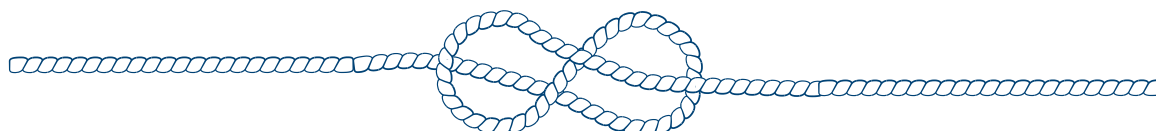

- Delivered to the Honorary Secretary, not less than eight (8) days before the date fixed for the holding of the Annual General Meeting.

Re-sanding the beach

After a couple of very challenging seasons, 2022/2023 found the Club open for business and firing on all cylinders. And what an amazing season it has been. Certainly, one worth taking the time to reflect on and remember the highlights of all the incredible things our diverse membership got up to over the course of this, our 117th year.

At the commencement of the season, SLSC recognised some of our long-standing members and awarded the National Service medal to Dave "Danger" Jenkins and Rob Gibellini – congrats on 15 years' service. Rob is a well-deserving nominee for Life Membership at the upcoming AGM.

Gear inspection went off without a hitch thanks to all hands-on deck helping out and new Patrol Captain, Emma Askham leading out the first patrol for the season – Patrol 9 on 24 September, with all patrols under the inspiring leadership of our club

captain, Emily Miers. The season's social start was celebrated in traditional style by the Start of Season party, hot on the heels of a truly remarkable celebration of 40 Years of Women in Coogee SLSC luncheon. A great job from our MC and chief questioner – Sharon Deans.

September saw another club highlight – and emerging tradition: the Gotcha4Life 24 Hour Row. A few statistics show how amazing this programme has become: 60 rowers, rowing 612,517 metres, raising over \$12,500 – the second highest fundraiser in Australia. Supported across the club, with Cooper Habler, 15, putting in 12,212 metres. Great organisation from Dave Smith.

Education also got under way in September, with Spring Bronze being led by Michael Barnes and Charlotte McHenry and Thunder Bronze led by Alex Scott.

Things were in full swing come October 2022, especially in the Competition area, ably directed by Lee Hume, a true gentleman. One outstanding event in this month was the Club's participation in the 2022 NSW Board Riding Championships, with great showings by Angus Folsom, George Messiter, Lachie Hume, Will Waugh and Finn Wilkie. The month culminated in the annual Coogee Gala day where the whole Club competed in a series of water and sand events. Minnows too were well and truly back on the beach come the end of October – and what a great sight every Sunday.

Sadly, October saw the scattering of the ashes of two 50-year members, Allan Norley and John 'Ginger' Weber, both also prominent members of our great friend, Randwick Rugby. It was touching to see their ashes scattered in the bay they both so loved.

November is always a big month for the Club (plague allowing) and this season was no different. Education continued at pace with Thunder Bronze and Special Awards; Competition was busy, especially with the Coogee SLSC v Coogee Diggers event, arranged by Nicola Logan. Juniors too were busy with the SLSNSW development camps and other events. And, of course, the big event was the November Coogee Island Challenge, where the whole of the Club came together to deliver an exceptional event. Far too many people to thank – but the Ocean Events Committee were truly professional and both Tass Karozis and Michael Scroop (and all IRB drivers and crew) deserve a shout out. Everyone though, was fabulous.

Preparations were made from the start of December for the fast-approaching peak times of summer and New Years and Clubbies honed their lifesaving skills in the President's Cup held 11 December 2022. Thankfully, there was brief break over the few days of Christmas – but the Club even found time for the running of the Xmas Scramble – and thanks to Termite and Simon "Faf" Figures for making this happen.

January 2023 saw a return to 'business as usual', and it was great that Coffee Club resumed normal service on 16 January 2023 – thanks to all who help make this important Club get together happen. Just as importantly, another emerging tradition in the Club got under way: the 2023 Dippers Autism Swim 8-week programme, something which aligns deeply with our values of diversity and inclusivity. January was marred, however, by the loss of a great 50-year Long Service member, Damien "Duck" Maree; he will be much missed. Sady, we also saw the passing of John Abbiss, another 50 Long Standing member.

Such sadness, however, was helped by the absolutely sensational news that life member, Gary Daly had been awarded the Emergency Services Medal – a great achievement GD.

Competition got into full swing come February and funding was the focus – with the launch of the Inner Reef Club, an important source of financial support for our competitors, quickly overtaken by the success of NSW State Championships – and what a great result!! Thank you Blocka for all the work here. Finance to get our teams to Aussies was also greatly aided

by the annual Sportsperson Lunch, facilitated by Steve "Chimes" Gillis, another deserving nominee for Life Membership. Always a great day.

Diversity continued to be a focus in the club through February, with our rainbow rescue boards, supporting World Pride, and our Sisters in Surf patrol celebrating the contribution made by our female members and taking place on an unforgettable Super Sunday on the beach.

And so, it all came to a head in April! With the frenzy of season's end, Patrol person of the Year and Patrol of the Year Comps, last minute education and training, celebrations of the Comp area at Aussies and the wrap up of Minnows. Our Anzac Day ceremony was moving and thanks to David "Luna" Park for this. We also must mention Calum Reiter named SLSNSW Junior Life Saver of the Year. Things might have started to wind down – but not our Penguins – dusting off their togs for a winter season and our IRB comp team – just coming in to their own in the season's course.

And so, another very busy season for the Two Blues. And once again, we are very proud to say that under the Club's vigilance and service, there were again "no lives lost".

The outgoing Executive team from season 2021/2022 certainly left big shoes to fill and it is a sign of the strength of our great club that the Executive and Management teams of season 2022/2023 were able to keep such a busy and diverse club ticking over. As the above shows, a huge effort was put in across all areas of the Club, but some special mentions need to be made. Some members give so much more than the general membership will ever see, come social media or otherwise.

The Executive was led under the wise guidance of Pat Garcia, new to the role as Club President, but making an extraordinary contribution to what can be a demanding role. It is only once one has filled this role that one knows the pressures and the problems that the President can face. Pat's constant calmness and thoughtfulness was an inspiration. I know he is grateful for the guidance and counsel of all other former presidents.

Pat was greatly assisted by the others of the Exec team, Ben and Matt and a remarkable contribution from our number one life saver, Emily Miers,

Thanks too to all members who sat on the Management Committee. The monthly meetings are always a robust discussion and a necessary part of the Club's decision-making process. I'd like to thank all the other committees of the club, who also delivered this season, hard work all round. There are far too many to mention but when one considers our events, our bar staff, the kiosk, life members, the Anzac team, our sponsors, our youth, our special projects, our 50-year members, a picture builds of a club committed to its values, and to diversity and inclusion.

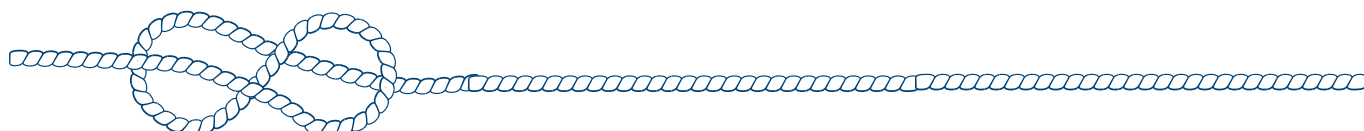

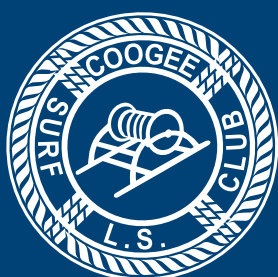
AGM 2021 HONOUR AWARDS

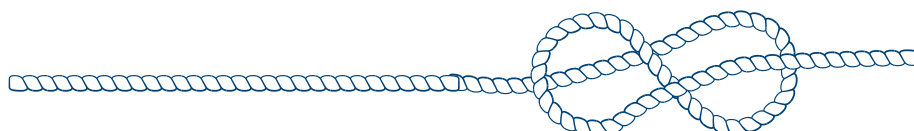

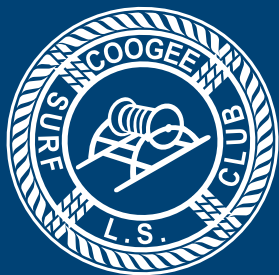

Scott is passionate about his role in SLSC. He attained his BM at Coogee in 2009 and was quick to attain higher awards; something he continues to pursue.

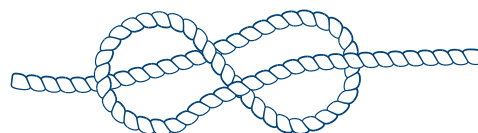

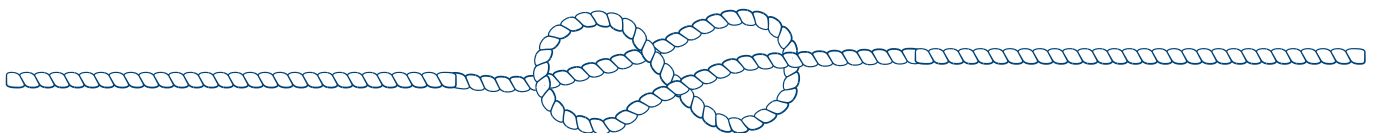

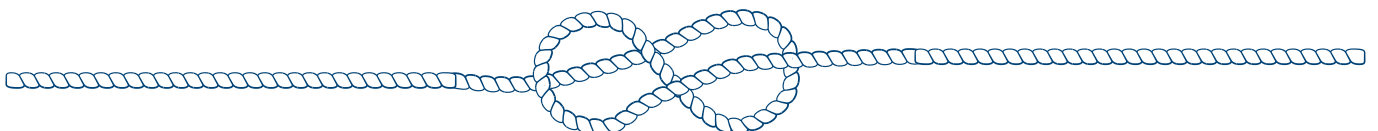

Club Captain's Report



EMILY MIERS

The lifesaving operations of Coogee SLSC during the 2022/23 season were immensely successful. We significantly broadened our volunteering capabilities by welcoming newly qualified life savers and upskilling our existing members. This is a testament to the engagement of our active membership and the contributions of our Education team, Lifesaving Committee and Patrol Leaders. All members have epitomised our Club's community values and in doing so have saved lives and built a cohesive culture.

On behalf of Coogee Surf Life Saving Club I would like to extend my thanks to all members following the conclusion of the 2022/23 patrolling season. In this patrolling season, members of Coogee SLSC have spent over 21,100 volunteer hours on the shores of Coogee Beach keeping the community and passionate beach goers safe. As a Club, we performed sixteen rescues and attended to 2,600 preventative actions across the patrolling season from September 2022 to April 2023.

Our patrolling operations were very strong both in terms of attendance and the level of experience of members signing on to every patrol. The patrol leadership teams, including patrol captains and vice captains, provided

invaluable support and mentorship to the patrol groups, and engaged in advanced training to ensure our incident response capabilities were a top priority. The patrol leadership teams also facilitated skills maintenance at every opportunity to ensure all members were proficient and upskilled in the latest spinal management techniques.

We expanded our membership by welcoming 79 new Surf Rescue Certificate and 113 Bronze Medallion holders. We successfully upskilled our existing members with higher awards including 8 Silver Medallion Patrol Captain Awards, 16 IRB Crew Certificates, 4 IRB Driver Certificates, 56 ART Certificates, 58 First Aid Awards and 6 Side by Side Operators Inductions. Congratulations to the Education Team,

led by Rebecca Mister, Maria-Luise Ossimitz and Marc Schmandin, and all trainers who facilitated these courses.

Our competitors also had a great season, using the SLS Sydney Branch Championships, SLS NSW Championships and Aussies 2023 to strengthen their lifesaving skill set. At Aussies 2023, despite a smaller team in attendance, our competitors placed 11th in the Open Point Score including numerous solo and relay gold placings.

The November 2022 Coogee Island Challenge resulted in 1,300 swimmers successfully crossing the finish line. While the scale of the event is a testament to our local community's participation and support of our Club, it was a terrific day thanks to the support of the Events Committee and volunteer

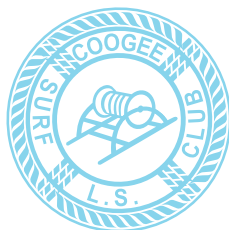
half of the season with eight enthused young people joining us to share ideas, opinions, and advocacy of their peers. This group is an invaluable part of our Blueys.

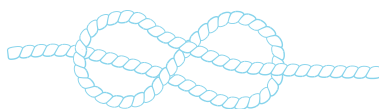

Chief Training Officer's Report



REBECCA MISTER

I am pleased to report that this season Coogee was awarded the highest number of awards in Surf Life Saving Sydney branch (423) and this is in no small part down to our dedicated team of trainers, assessors, and helpers.

I would like to start by acknowledging the support of Maria-Luise Ossimitz, Advanced Awards Coordinator and Andrew Tooher, IRB Education Coordinator who have worked closely with me throughout this season. In the past few months, we have gained another member of the Education team with Marc Schmandin joining as Assistant CTO – Bronze, I'm looking forward to Marc taking over responsibility for the Bronze and SRC courses next season. I would also like to acknowledge and thank Debbie Zonich and Trudy Jones for their help and never-ending patience with so much of the backend admin that others don't see.

Bronze & SRC

This year we ran 6 bronze and 1 Surf Rescue Certificate courses which kept the Education team, and the Memorial Hall busy. This season we piloted Bronze candidates completing their Provide First Aid course prior to start of bronze course allowing us to reduce classroom time spent on these activities and ensuring everyone started the course with basic first aid and CPR skills.

Surf Rescue Certificate: this year we had almost 80 purple caps completing their SRC and starting to patrol. This course was led by Doug Hawkins, with support from Jon Harwin and Rachel Garcia as Age Managers and many other age assistants.

Thunder Bronze: "Thunder Bronze" is a fast-track course for current patrolling SRCs over 2 weeks. This year we were able to hold 3 courses, each assisted by several parents, trainers, and water safety.

- September led by Alex Scott
- November – led by Athenia Pascoe and Pat Garcia
- January – led by Athenia Pascoe and Adam Treharne

Spring Bronze: This course led by Charlotte McHenry and Michael Barnes and Ben Heenan ran from Sept to November 2022.

Summer Bronze: This course led by Alex Scott and Ben Heenan ran from January to March 2023.

Dads and Mums Army (DMA) XXVI: This course led by Katrin Baldow and

Doug Hawkins ran from January to March 2023. Some of the candidates in this squad started training on the beach in October so a great commitment by everyone. This course is run with Minnows and aims to enable Minnows parents to be part of Water safety as well as patrolling.

Between Summer Bronze and DMA we had almost 70 candidates assessed in a single week (including back-to-back assessments on a Saturday morning) – I think this is a record for Coogee (and next year we'll try to schedule assessments on separate weeks!).

Coogee led courses: This year we have run ART and IRB crew courses, with the next Silver Medallion IRB Driver course running during the off-season.

ART: Changes to ART award this season meant that we spent time upskilling existing ARTC holders giving us 71 ART awards (27 new award holders), with more courses are planned during the off-season. Thanks to all our ART trainers Craig Howie, Kath Power, Andrew Tooher, Ben Heenan, Will Bao, Will Davison (and myself), we also have a number of new ART trainers in development.

IRB: The IRB team led by Scott Parker ran an IRB Driver course in the off-season followed by 2 IRB Crew courses this season; giving us 4 new drivers and 17 new IRB Crew holders. Huge thanks to all drivers who came and helped in the early mornings, particularly Dave Paget, Josh Ricamara, Will Davison, Rob Illidge and Andrew Tooher. IRB training continues through the off-season, with driver training happening over the Winter months.

Advanced Awards: This season our members continued to upskill by achieving Higher Awards including First Aid, Silver Medallion Beach Management and Trainers and Assessors, showing the depth of our member qualifications. After a few seasons with limited trainer courses this season we've had a number of people start their trainer course.

Gold: This year saw the return of Gold assessments for the first time in 3 seasons, with 4 members gaining their Gold Award. Thanks as always to George Fatseas for his ongoing Gold Medallion training in the pool and on the beach.

Resus certificate: This season we worked with the Blue Caps and Silver Caps (U11s and U12s) to run Resuscitation Certificate courses over 3 separate weekend sessions for over 60 nippers. This helps prepare them for SRC in future seasons. We'll be working with the Minnows Education team in the off-season to plan further training courses for next year.

UNSW/other education initiatives:

Education team: I would like to thank all the Lead Trainers as well as the many Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators who continue to support the ongoing success of Coogee's Education team. In addition, I would like to acknowledge those members who help with Water Safety and act as content experts.

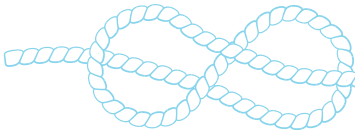
This season we have started regular informal Education meetings with endorsed/probationary/re-endorsing trainers as well as those who are interested in becoming trainers. These meetings are part education topics and part team development. This season we welcome 3 new endorsed trainers; Cate Kyling, Josh Fernandez, and Raul Flores. We've also welcomed back Wayne Penn and Peter Harvie as endorsed trainers. We also have a few probationary trainers in the wings, with more members keen to become Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators in the coming season.

This season I have worked with Ruby Thomasyu, Director of Youth Services and Cate Kyling, Junior Captain to plan further training and education for our Youth members and are planning further training for the off-season and into the 23/24 season.

Finally, I would like to thank the Lifesaving Committee lead by our Club Captain, Emily Miers and our Club Management Committee for their continued support, and assistance throughout the season, with special thanks to Debbie Zonich for her ongoing support, advice and for never getting cross with my questions.

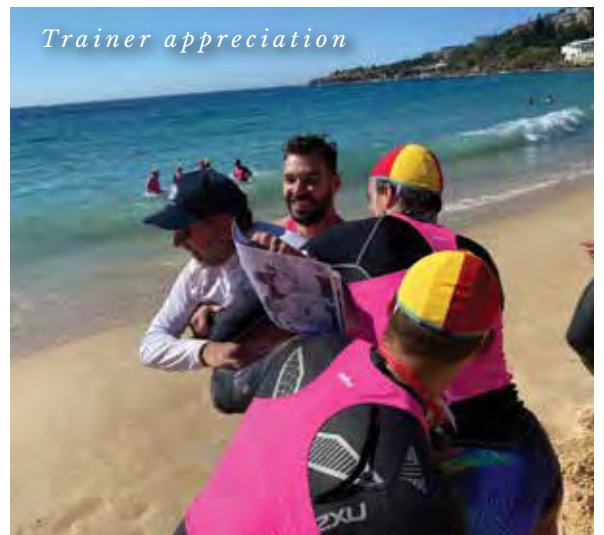

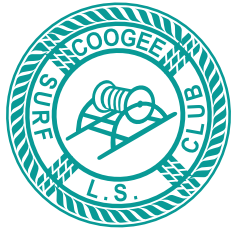

Competition Director's Report



LEE HUME

The 2022-2023 season was always going to be challenging, given the success of our previous season and with the Australian Surf Lifesaving Titles being hosted in Perth. Due to the location, we had a much smaller team and therefore less representation across the various disciplines.

Our area captains drew up several goals for the season to emulate or improve on previous results. Each area was at different points in terms of their succession plan and the idea was to create a supportive environment where competitors could strive to perform at their best. Upon reflection, we can say that as a team we have met many of our expectations and, in some circumstances, exceeded our goals.

One of the major focuses for the year was continuing to build upon the philosophy of 'one club' and bringing the different areas of the club together. This saw pre-season training commencing with a group session of all our competition areas and continued into our first club championships with both the senior club and nippers combining. The theme of one club

continued with both the senior club and nippers being issued with the same competition uniform and coming together for one group photo of all the members who have represented the club at both senior and junior level.

The Australian Championship saw approximately 80 competitors represent Coogee across youth, masters, and open events. The club achieved varying degrees of success across all groups. The youth led the way to begin the Aussies program with both George Messiter and James Azar picking up Gold in the U14 and U13 Surf Board Riding. The R & R had lots of success across the event, also achieving Gold in the U13-U15 and Silver medals in the U14/U15 Mixed 2 Person and U13/U14 Mixed 2 Person. The beach area medaled in both individual and

team events with the U14/U15 Female Beach Relay team achieving a Silver and in the individual Emma Haley got a bronze in the U14 Female Beach Flags.

The Masters commenced their program following on from the youth. Unfortunately, several of our competitors were unable to make the trip to Perth. Of the contingent that did they were able to achieve one gold medal and five bronze across both beach and water events. In the beach events, Rona Macniven achieved gold in the 40-44 years Female 2km Beach Run, while Sharon Deans (Team manager) achieved bronze in the 50 – 54 yrs, Female Beach Sprint and 200 years Female beach relay. The water was strong in the masters with Finian Stronach picking up a bronze in the



30-34 year Male 2km swim. Also need to acknowledge is earlier efforts where he picked up a Gold medal in his age group for the Coolongatta Gold. A further two more bronze medals were won in the 150 year Female Surf Teams and 50-54 year Female Board Rescue.

The Open Area was outstanding finishing 11th overall in Australia. In particular, the club was the second strongest across R & R and Beach Events. Between the two areas they achieved a total of seven Australian Gold medals. In the R & R area every single Coogee SLSC competitor in both Youth and Open events won at least a Gold Medal at Aussies. We also had for the first time in the clubs history a mother (Tracey Bloxsom) and daughter (Millie Bloxsom) as Australian Champions in the same team (Open Female 5 Person) event. This feat was replicated by both a father (Scott Ryan) and son (Luke Ryan) who also became Australian Champions in the Open Male 5 Person. In keeping with the family theme both Chris and Sami Gately also won Gold within their respective R & R Open teams.

The Open beach area contributed a total of two Golds, three Silver and three Bronze to our tally. Some stand out performances within our relay teams highlights the depth we have within the area. The U19 Female Beach Sprint deserve special mention having won gold for two successive years in a row,

along with the individual performance of Tamara Abagi who picked up a Bronze for her performance in the U19 Female Beach Flags. William Mison's performance throughout the championships carnivals was amazing having secured Gold at both Branch and State he also won a Silver within his event the Open 2km Beach run at Aussies. Inspired by Wills heroics the U17 pairing of Asher Thomasyu and Ronan Sheppard won a bronze in the Male 2 x 1km Beach Run Relay. Also, I would like to mention Luke Avati who won State in the U17 Male Beach Sprint and was hoping to secure the Gold for a third year straight. While, he was unsuccessful achieving this he did secure Gold in the U19 mixed relay, a silver in the U17 Mixed Beach Relay and the U19 Male Beach Relay. He was also selected during the season to represent NSW at the surf interstate selections, where he won the sprint events.

The boat area had a tremendous season having achieved three boats in the finals at the NSW State Championships across three different divisions which included the U19 with the Havachats, the Male Reserve Boat crew, the Coogee Sons and lastly the Coogee Spices in the Female Reserve grade final. The Havachats, also achieved a bronze medal at the ASRL Open which had one of the largest competitive fields of the season and

missed out narrowly on making the Australian final. However, the standout performance once again was the Coogee DMG's who came first at the Australian Short Course Championships last year, made the final at the ASRL open and came second at the Australian Surf Lifesaving Championships in Perth.

The Sports lifesaving area has continued to improve and develop with Coogee well represented across a variety of age groups within the Champion Patrol and Champion Lifesaver competition. In the Open Champion Patrol event the team finished second at the State and qualified for the Aussies. Emma Grand also won a Gold at Branch, bronze at State and a bronze medal in Perth within the Open Female Champion Lifesaver.

The water area has been a major focus this year with a goal of developing depth and continue to revitalise the area. Thomas Bennett played a huge part as a coach in working with our youth. Coogee was able to field teams in board and ski events among our youth and were represented in finals at both State and Branch. The highlight of the season was the U19 Taplin who achieved a bronze medal at branch and the Open Mixed Lifesaver Relay who came second at the branch and qualified for the State Final.

The competition area has continued to thrive at Surfing with Finn Wilkie leading the way in recent years. This year our younger generation have flourished and excelled within championship events. We have had a core group of surfers under the tutelage of Clayton Cantarella who has achieved several Gold Medals at Aussies. Angus Folsom made the semi finals at Trigg Beach in Perth, while George Messiter took out the event. This was followed up with James Azar taking out the Gold medal in the U13 Male Surf Board Riding. What is even more impressive is the fact George achieved Gold at both Branch, State and Aussies.

The Club Championships were well attended throughout the year with 62 competitors taking part across the three rounds and some great interclub rivalry. The season's opening event was the Gala Day where we joined the minnows for the first Club Championships of the season. With relatively small surf conditions the racing was quite tight with little separating many of the athletes. It was an enjoyable event which celebrates the many talents of our athletes.

The club events had an emphasis on fun and inclusion. We ran two events throughout the season which included the Presidents Cup and Rose Shield. For each of the events we invited our junior competitors (U11 and above) to

join us within each of the team events. It was encouraging to see the level of involvement continue to grow within these events with the Presidents Cup alone fielding 6 teams.

It takes a team to run a competition area and there are many elements that need to come together to make it work successfully. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Executive Committee for their support throughout the season. Your commitment to ensuring members are afforded the opportunity to compete for our club and are valued is greatly appreciated. I would also like to acknowledge Steve Gillis who for as long as I can remember conducted the Sportsman's lunch to raise much needed funds to support our Aussies representative team. I would like to thank the area captains who supported, coached and mentored their athletes throughout the season. Your passion for your area and the club has ensured the continued success and development of our competitors. Furthermore, I would like to thank Andrew Bloxsom for his continued help throughout the year. You have worked tirelessly in your role and have left the area in a better place. Lastly, can I congratulate all competitors who represented Coogee and I look forward to seeing you all on the beach next season.

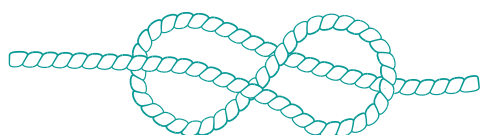

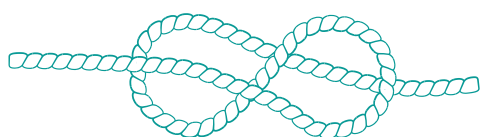

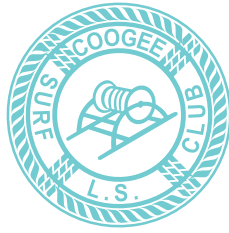

The Coogee Minnows: training our future Surf Life Savers.



The 2022/23 season has been another cracker. Firstly, we have been able to conduct operations without impost of COVID related restrictions (but we've kept several the changes we've made that have improved our ability to deliver safe training). Another notable aspect has been that this was the first in five seasons that we were not forced to cancel a Sunday due to weather, dangerous surf, or poor water quality. This was somewhat of a surprise given the triple La Niña event the east coast was subject to.

The outcome, Coogee Minnows had more time on the beach and in the water fulfilling our mission: training our future Surf Life Savers. The Minnows juggernaut has again delivered an outstanding season to train our future Surf Life Savers. Some of the highlights to call out for the season are:

- Graduating 72 SRCs - This team of Junior Surf Life Savers were once again recognised for their high level of skill and overall proficiency. Moreover, a number of this team have flagged a desire to fulfil higher responsibilities in the coming years including Age Managers and Trainers which is a line of effort that will be developed in the coming season.

- Our Under 6's have returned to the beach this season but more significant than the joy that they bring is the engagement of parents and number of Age Assistants that were present from day one. This is a testament to the efforts of Nicole Ashcroft and has set the benchmark for our approach going forward.

- Training outcomes - the continuation of no parents on the beach and the large water training cohort through the weeks has further increased the surf confidence across

the Minnows group. The Minnows group has again grown to nearly 900 children and we expect this to be larger again next season.

- Competition - Aidan Byrne along with his dedicated team has once again delivered a fantastic programme for the development of our junior competitors. Coogee was placed 2nd overall in the State at the completion of the Age Championships where the team achieved 10 individual and 16 team medals.

- Mums and Dads Army XXVII With the support of Doug Hawkins and Katrin Baldow, the club has delivered another 23 parents to the ranks of our Surf Life Savers, to patrol the beach and fulfil the role of water safety for our program.

Many thanks to the hundreds of volunteers who enable our program each week. To the Executive and Management teams, I offer my



sincerest thanks for the significant contributions you make to deliver the safe and effective program. In particular, I'd like to call out the contributions of Emily Ashcroft, Shannon Campbell, Will Charles, Aidan Byrne, Keiran Brown and Catherine Yuan - unseen by the masses, this team operates almost continuously through the year to shape and develop the program delivered through the summer. I also thank Kali Ogle, who has stepped forward into the Vice Captains role and continues to give so generously on and off the beach.

With the season ending, I would like to mention two families finishing their years with Minnows. With the

graduation of the Purple Caps, Jon Harwin finishes up 16 years on the beach with Coogee Minnows, nine of which he has the mighty Purple Caps. This has been a significant commitment by Jon, Christine and the family and we thank them for this. The transition of the Purple Caps also sees Rachel Garcia formally finish her time in a leadership position with Minnows; however, I anticipate that we may continue to see her on the beach with the Blue Caps.

Our under 7s returned for their second Minnows season this year. With more than 100 children and 20 Age Assistants and Water Safety consistently on the beach, we have a large number of fish, dolphins, turtles and whales on their way to becoming lifesavers.

Building water confidence and beach competition skills. This year was really about taking the water familiarity from last year and growing each child's confidence in the water as well as building their competency around key competition skills. The children can now swim about 25m out to a floating mat, dive under waves and get back into shore safely. On the beach, they spent a lot of time racing across the beach with flags, relays and sprints. Our children built their understanding and interest in competition activities as well as their fitness.

Surf Life Saving signals. Our Minnows should now be familiar with the surf life saving signals, which they can use wherever it's hard to hear such as the park or across the shopping centre. They should be able to ask for help if

they ever get in trouble, tell you they are OK and direct you to where they want you to be (back, forward, left, right and stay still).

Age Assistants and Water Safety volunteers. We would like to say an enormous thank you to the volunteers that came down week in and week out to make sure the program could run and that the children were having a good time. We cannot do it without our Age Assistants and Water Safety.

Age Manager volunteers. As Age Managers, we connect every week to design a program that we hope the kids will love and that will leave them with a few more skills or a bit more confidence than they had the week before. We have welcomed Catherine Luff to the Management Committee as the new Lime Cap Age Manager, but for the first half of the season, she stepped up next to Chris, Nicole and Simon to help out as an Age Manager for Pink Caps. Competition Report

At the start of the 2022/23 pre-season, there was strong hope, with vaccination rates high, that interruptions as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic would be consigned to history and a 'normal' season would be ahead of us, including one free of the weather events that hit Sydney last year. Thankfully, those hopes were realised and a full season of competition, with fantastic results throughout, was had, culminating in the Club placing 2nd overall in the State at the completion of the NSW State Age Championships.

No sooner had Sunday nippers started, we were straight into competition, with the annual All of Club Championships brought back to a Sunday to ensure maximum involvement from all nippers. This gave the coaches great insight into where each of the returning competitors were after the winter but also helped identify the new talent in the younger age groups and new members to the Club. Fresh from the Club Championships, our first carnival with other clubs was a welcome return of the Randwick Shield after a 3 year gap, hosted by Maroubra. This was a great introduction, in a friendly environment, to our new competitors and those wanting to give competition a try, while also giving our more seasoned competitors a good hit out.

In mid-November, we also held our second LaPa Gold Challenge at Frenchman's and Yarra Bays. We introduced an additional shorter course to ensure that there was a course to suit all participants. As a good sign for the year, the sun was shining and everyone had a really enjoyable experience. All participants raised much needed funds for the Competition Team to help with equipment, coaching and sending our Youth Competitors to the Aussies, which were held in Perth, WA, this year. We will look to grow this amazing event next year, with the aim of getting the wider Minnows community more involved.

As we progressed towards the Championship Carnivals, of the Sydney Branch, NSW State Age Championships and, for our older competitors, the Australian Championships, Coogee also sent competitors to carnivals at Swansea Belmont for the Kracka Challenge (Water), Wanda, North Narrabeen (Sand), Manly for the Nipper Nats and North Cronulla for the Australia Day Junior Ironperson Classic. Our U8s, also got a taste of competition with carnivals at Sourth Maroubra and Dee Why. After a gap of 3 years, the NSW Inter-Branch series returned and Coogee had 4 competitors, Emma Haley and Evie Bowie

on Sand and Kathryn Jordan and Amber Curry in water, selected for the triumphant Sydney Branch team.

The 2023 Sydney Branch Championships at North Bondi were set up as a dry run for the upcoming State titles with the program split between the younger competitors (U9 & U10) on Saturday January 28th and older competitors (U11 – U14) on Sunday January 29th. With the sun shining and the water conditions perfect, the Club put in some fantastic results, and left us feeling confident for the upcoming NSW State Age Titles.

The 2023 State tiles, once again, saw the competition being hosted by the Sydney Northern Beaches with the events being staged between North Steyne and Queenscliff Surf Clubs for the Water and Beach events and at Freshwater Surf Club for the R&R and Lifesaving events, scheduled over 4 days from 23rd to 26th February. Our U9s (Water) and U10s (Sand) were first up on Thursday 23rd, with the highlights being Andre Szabo winning the U9 Male Board race, Coogee's first gold at State level on a board in living memory, and Max Nguyen retaining his title in the U10 beach flags. This great start continued on Friday with our U10 females dominating all of the water events in their age group, taking out gold in the Surf race (Sohphie Rowles) and, showing that Andre's win the day before was no fluke, a second win in a Board race (Hailey Avard) and then teamed up to also win the Board relay and Surf Team. Up at Freshwater, the R&R team were also racking up the points placing first in the U13-15 5 Person R&R, U14 2 Person R&R and U11 2 Person R&R.

These great results continued over the final 2 days of competition, as our older competitors contributed to more wins with Marnie Laurence taking gold in the U11 Female sprint, Taylor Morgan also crossing the line first in the U13 Female sprint and Kathryn Jordan taking home gold in the U12 Female surf race. In the team events, the U13 teams were successful in the Male

Sprint Relay and the Mixed Sprint Relay and the U12 taking gold in the Mixed Cameron relay. Despite leading the overall points score going into the final day, we were narrowly beaten by North Bondi, placing 2nd overall to cap off a fantastic State Age titles. What made it such an amazing achievement was that all areas (Water, Sand and R&R) contributed to the success across the 4 days with 33 medals won and 26 top 6 finishes (points are awarded to the top 6 placings): **15 - Gold, 10 - Silver, 8 - Bronze, 11 - 4th Place, 7 - 5th Place, 8 - 6th Place**

Highlights included:

- The Club placed 2nd overall in the State at the completion of the Age Championships.

- The Club won 11 individual medals:

- The Club won 22 team medals

As one final effort, a small team of 11 Minnows travelled over to Perth, WA to compete at the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships (Aussies) over 2 days on 25th & 26th March. Against the best in the country, this team didn't disappoint taking home 3 gold medals, a silver and a bronze.

These results over the season were borne out of the incredible dedication and effort of our competitors, both in training and competition, along with the programs put in place by our coaches and their passion in delivering them. All the coaches, led by Damien Costello on Sand, supported by Louise Connor as Manager, Cameron Habler in the Water, supported by Elisha Curry as Manager, and R&R Coordinator, Jen Trinca, and support team (Josh Hankin and all of the water safety, our officials and Sharyn Baker for all the support she has given me) have invested enormous amounts of personal time and commitment to developing and implementing these programs, for which we are all grateful. The way all our kids compete with respect and a smile, genuinely enjoying themselves is a credit to all the coaches.

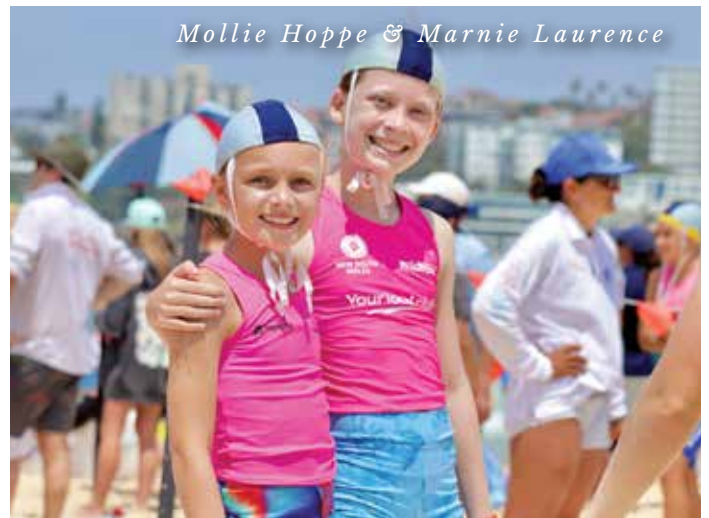

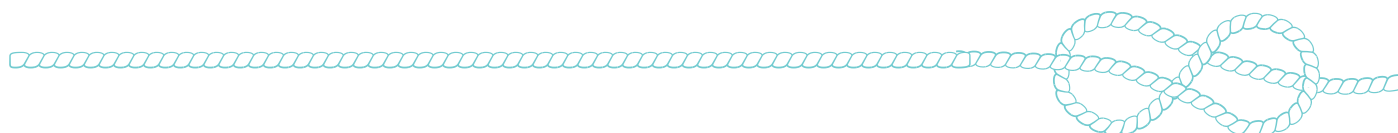

John on achieving their 50 years of membership of SLSA .

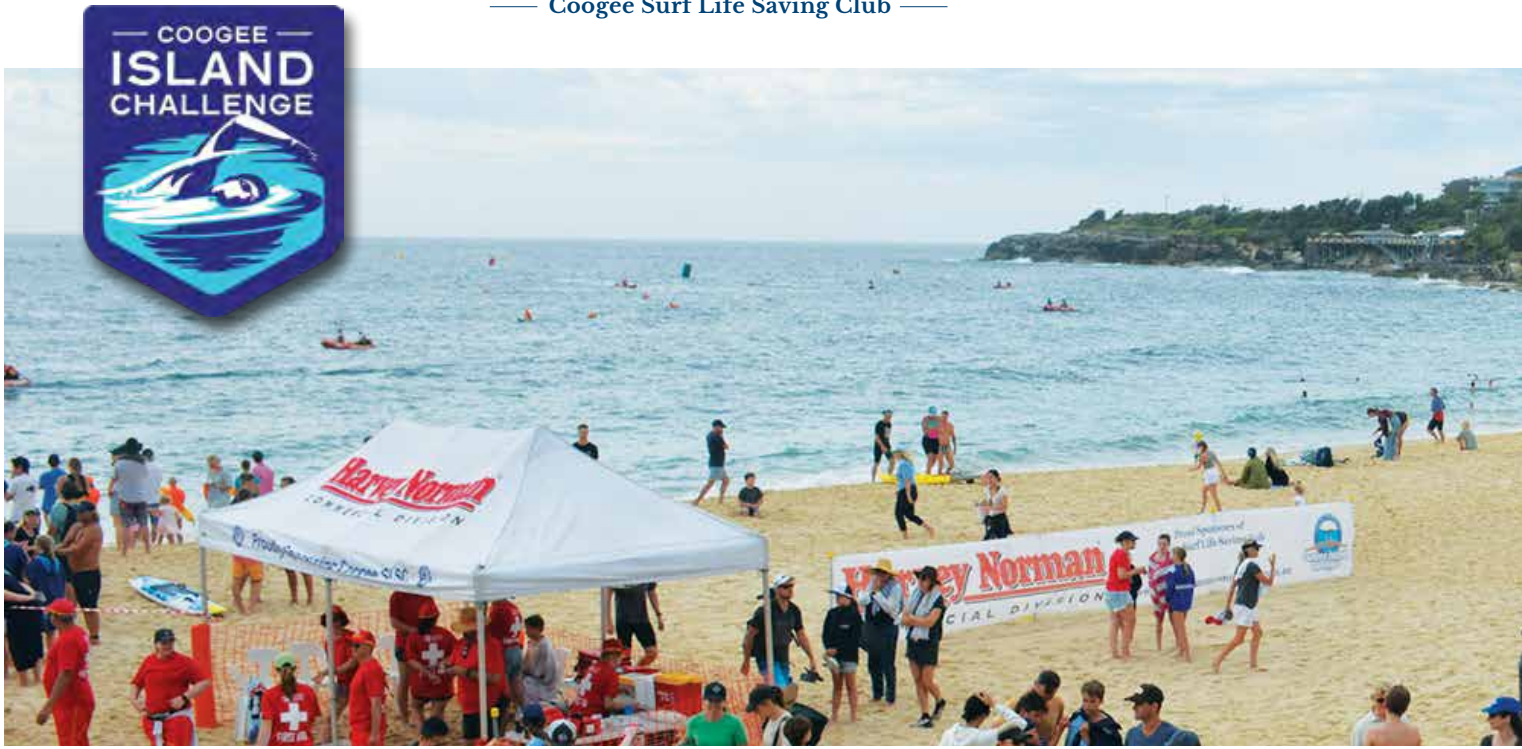

Although the April 2023 Coogee Island Challenge had to be cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the committee provided a goodwill gesture

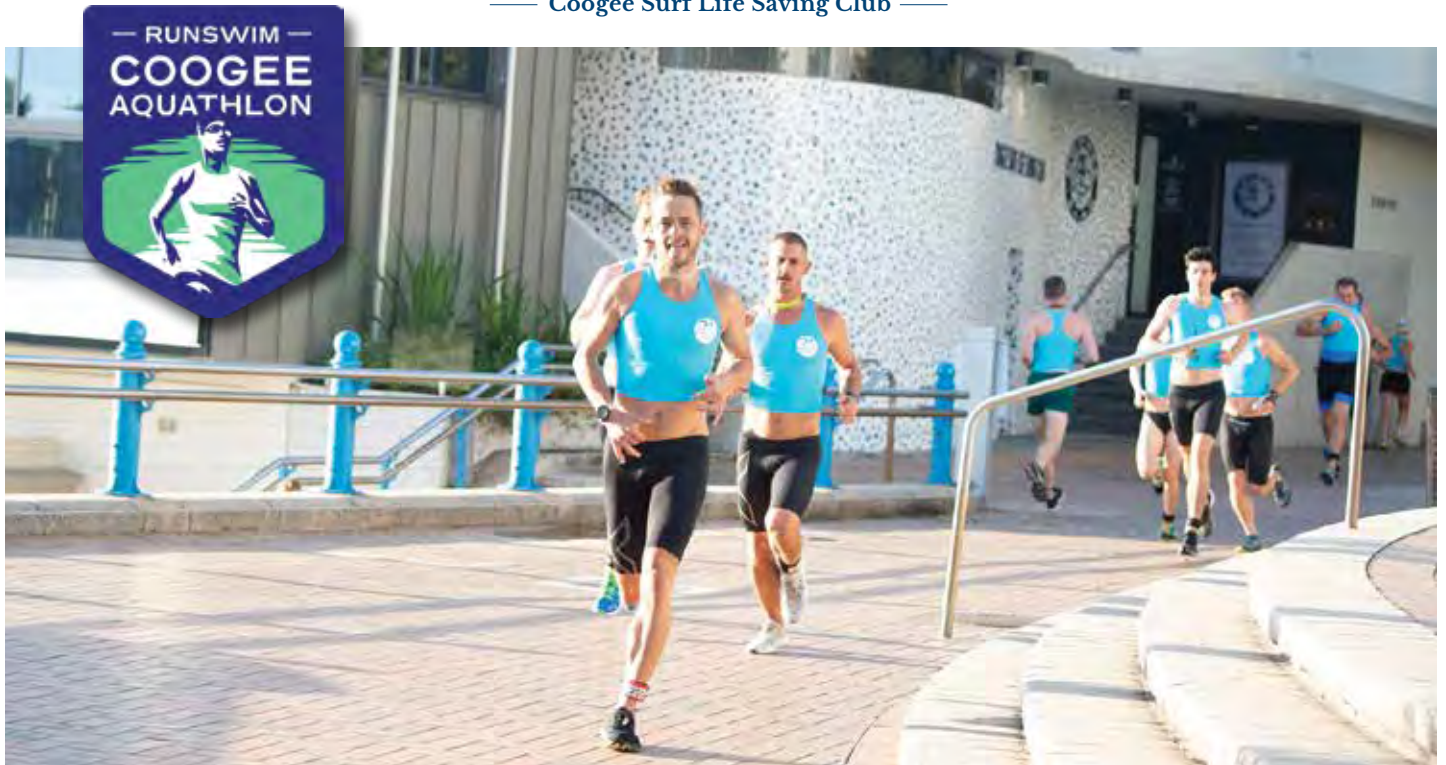
of a discount code for the next swim scheduled for 26th November 2023 which serves as an incentive for participants to prepare and participate in our next CIC.

Coogee SLSC has once again had an impressive season sharing our Water Safety messages with the wider community of Sydney, and ensuring more people are now aware of how to be safe at the beach, and in the ocean.

We attended the SLSNSW Multicultural Water Safety Film Event, which for the first time saw many cultural groups supporting this messaging.

We worked with SLSNSW, and the National Foundation for Australia-China Relations and the Australia-China Youth Association, delivering two very successful WS sessions for over 90 students.

Under an invitation from the Multicultural Community Liaison Officer Eastern Beaches, we presented a session to the Punchbowl Indonesian Womens Group, which was very well received by the ladies. This invite also led to Coogee SLSC presenting to the Inner and Eastern Sydney Migrant Interagency team

(IESMI), on how Coogee is working in this space, and how we can increase our WS messaging to Migrant communities.

We continued our strong relationship with UNSW and Sydney Uni with a number of theory sessions delivered to over 350 students - thanks Felipe Ferri De Barros for your assistance.

Thanks to Olivia McAusland we received \$1,000 from the Awesome Foundation, which enabled us to purchase hi vis Beach Safe Community singlets for our community members to wear when we do water sessions.

Our major achievement this season was the creation and delivery of the new Beach Ocean Safety

Course, working with UNSW and SLSNSW. This two day course is a formal package designed to increase peoples skills in base line ocean safety, in both theory and practical skills.

This was an extremely successful Pilot course, with 18 UNSW Students graduating, and the BOS Course Model now readied for roll out for other NSW Clubs to use in their local communities.

As always, a very big thank you to all the Coogee members who support this community work, in attending these sessions to provide training and water safety.

On the weekend of the 10th and 11th of September 2022, Coogee SLSC participated in the 24-Hour Row to raise money for Gotcha4Life.

The money raised, is used by Gotcha4Life to directly fund several grassroots, high impact workshops and training programs, and is creating positive ripples through many communities.

We joined over 50 other Surf Clubs and Sporting Organisations, throughout Australia, by taking part, for the second year running. We had 54 participants, rowing on two rowing ergometers (aka “indoor rowers”), for 24 hours straight, from midday Saturday until midday Sunday, non-stop. These Club Members, and with the help from some of their family members, from ALL areas of the Club, rowed in 1-hour shifts, to achieve this.

Rowing for one hour straight on an ergometer, is tough. It presents, not only a physical challenge, but it tests you mentally, as well, as anyone who has done it can attest. But more

importantly, it was done for a great cause – we were raising funds for the mental health charity, GOTCHA 4 LIFE.

Over the 24 hours, Coogee rowed more than 660,000 metres, in total. As a collective, the Surf Clubs raised over \$309,000. But get this..... Our great Surf Club, on its own, raised over \$13,000. This made Coogee SLSC, the NUMBER 3 FUNDRAISING CLUB IN AUSTRALIA!

So, when we add in last year's tally, of \$16,000, we are close to \$30,000 from our little Coogee Surf Club community, alone.

We should all be so proud of so many amazing members, across ALL sections of the Club, for their physical and Fundraising efforts. The good news is, that the GOTCHA 4LIFE 24hrRow is on again this year, on the 9th and 10th of September. So, pencil

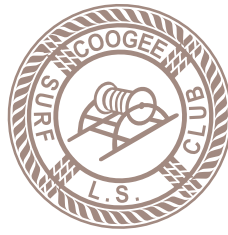

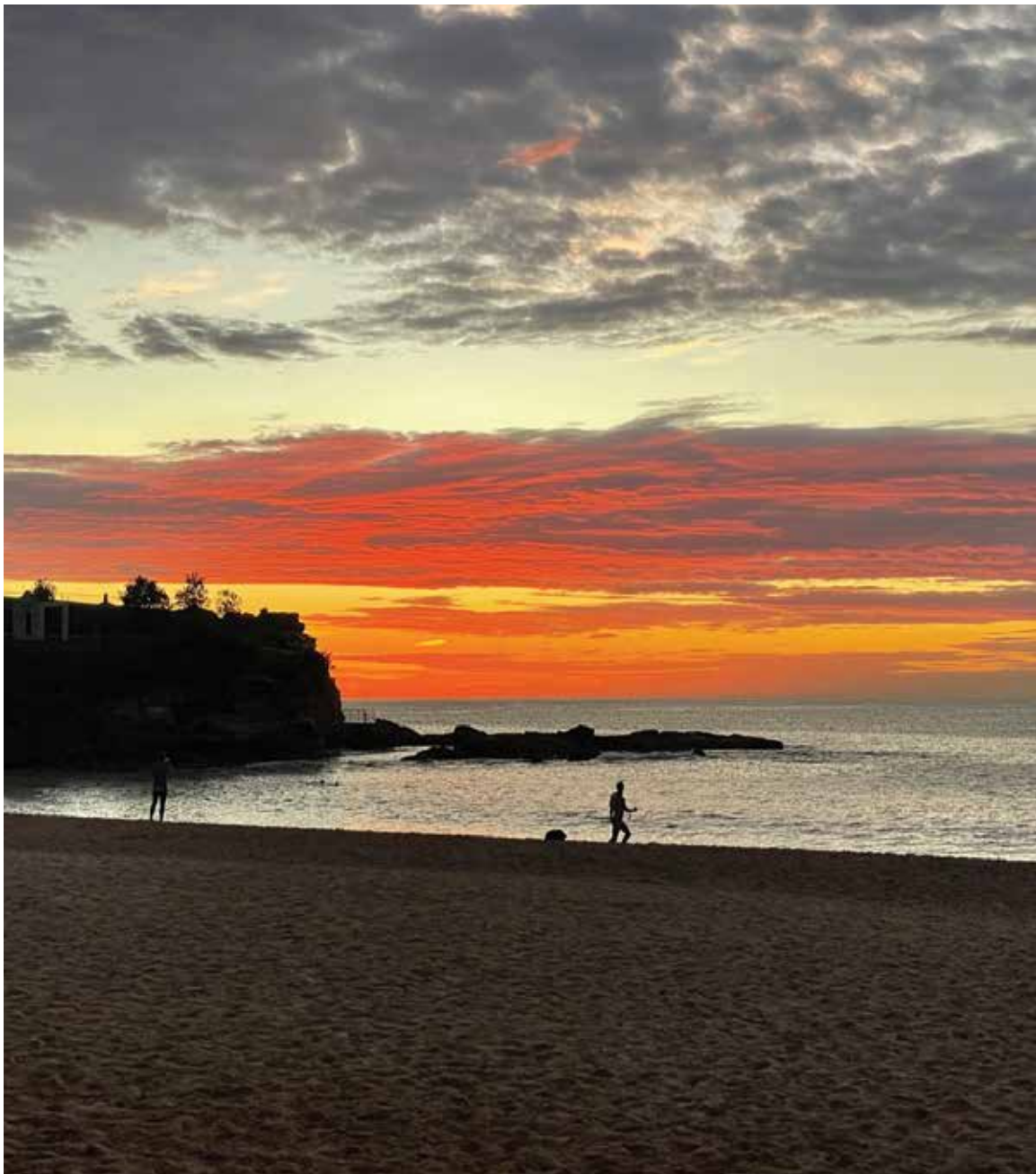

Our Club manages its resources in order to support its members when patrolling, competing, learning, training or teaching. The responsible management of our Club's finances remains a key platform of our Club's success.



Treasurer's Report



MATT LARKIN

SUMMARY

Coogee Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. (the Club) report a surplus of \$9,833 in 2022-23 compared with \$18,076 in 2021-22 (after subtracting \$225,595 in contingency funding held over from prior years). Gross income is \$1,649,515 and total expenditure amounts to \$1,639,682 in 2022-23, compared with \$1,467,726 and \$1,224,055 in 2021-22. The surplus is a welcome result as the Club looks to rejuvenating its lower-level training facilities and improve its online presence over the coming seasons.

OCEAN ROOM

Ocean Room activities (use of the function space that is reported in 'Club ventures') contribute the largest position to the Club's operational activity and report a net profit of \$104,100 in 2022-23. This result is a credit to Natasha Brennan, Simon Figures and their staff for managing the space so well.

Revenue totalled \$707,900, including \$143,800 from the weekly Sunday bar. Ocean Room turnover is equivalent to 43 per cent of total revenue and around \$350,000 more than in 2021-22. The increase is attributable to a larger number of events across the year. Total expenses equate to \$603,800 (around 100 per cent larger than last year), with \$280,000 attributable to staff expenses and \$230,000 to bar supplies.

INCOME FOR CLUB ACTIVITIES

Club activity is based on total income amounting to \$1,045,700 in 2022-23 after accounting for the Ocean Room activities (i.e. net profit).^{*} see graph 1 on page 88

Membership fees of \$294,602 are the largest share of club income, around \$84,000 greater than 2021-22. Minnows membership fees (juniors under 15 years old and their parents) account for 52 per cent of all membership fees, and are 21 per cent greater than 2021-22.

Sponsorship, grants and donations totalled around \$232,000 and remain consistent with last season. The Club would like to thank our major sponsors that include the Coogee Bay Hotel, Harvey Norman Electrical, and Randwick City Council. We would also like to thank AJ&C for their financial and in-kind support over the season – designing the redevelopment of our downstairs facilities. This upgrade will see the Club facilities brought into the 21st century with new and more private bathrooms, improved space utilisation, and better education and training facilities. A full list of sponsors is on the back page.

Event income is \$130,000 in 2022-23, around \$16,000 less than last year, remains foundational to the Club's funding. A successful November Coogee Island Challenge and May Run-Swim Coogee have contributed more than \$75,000 and \$16,000 in revenue. Thank you to the Events Committee for their continued diligence in

putting on these ocean events for the Club and the community.

Unfortunately, the Club was forced to cancel the April Coogee Island Challenge on the day due to unforeseen weather conditions. Consequently, the Club retained 50 per cent of entry fees to cover costs and provided swimmers a 50 per cent credit for the November 2023 swim. As a result, \$33,000 in revenue from the April 2023 swim has been carried over into 2023-24 as income in advance.

The Competition team put in an enormous effort to raise around \$100,000 in 2022-23 largely from the competition levy, regular fund-raising activities, and the Sportspersons Lunch. Thanks to Lee, Andrew, Jen and Steve for coordinating the bulk of the efforts. The Kiosk generated \$73,600 in revenue, around double 2021-22, thanks to more favourable weather. The Club would like to thank Wayne Penn and the Bluey's staff for their effort during the season.

Lifesaving and education activities raised around \$40,000 in 2022-23, around \$25,000 more than in 2021-22 due to an increase in training (including new Bronze members). Thank you to all the trainers that volunteered during the season.

The Club also raised \$33,000 in funds for a member's family in need, which was transferred in full.

CLUB EXPENSES EXCLUDING OCEAN ROOM ACTIVITIES

Expenses, excluding Ocean Room activities, totalled \$1,035,900 in 2022-23. With an increase in labour expenses to accommodate in the increasing complexity of the Club operations and increasing cost pressures, the expenses related to club activity grew by around \$186,000 compared with 2021-22.^{*} see graph 2 on page 88

Club's operation and administration costs are the largest share of expenditure totalling \$470,000. The Club has increased the size of the office on 2021-22 with the addition of a staff member and greater spending on maintenance hours. Staff expenses (ex. Kiosk staff) total around \$200,000 and is the largest portion of the administration costs. Other major operational expenses include cleaning (\$43,100), depreciation (\$30,000), and utilities (\$18,000).

The Club supported over 100 athletes to compete across the season and to travel to Perth for the annual Aussies championships. Competition related expenses totalled \$215,000, consistent with last season. \$32,400 related to entries for carnivals up and including to the State Titles; and the Club is excited to welcome the Jeffrey Sayle surf boat into its fleet with a final payment of \$21,500. The Aussies tour totalled \$114,100 with fundraising (\$25,400), team uniforms (\$23,700), transport (\$16,400), and accommodation subsidy (\$13,600) costs

comprising the largest expense items.

Lifesaving expenses equate to \$84,300, 40 per cent of which is capitation for the senior club. The Club purchased some new equipment this season including a patrol trailer, 10 new rescue boards, tubes and manikins – largely grant funded. Thank you to The Randwick Club, Coogee Beach Club, South Sydney Juniors Rugby League Club, and Matraville RSL for their generous contribution. Education spent \$33,700 mostly on awards and providing top rate courses to our new and existing members.

Events, including Coogee Island Challenge and Run-Swim Coogee, incurred costs totalling \$106,000 that included signage, digital marketing and other event related costs. We also purchased \$21,200 in merchandise. While this represents an expense in 2022-23, a large portion of the stock will be held over to 2023-24 owing to the cancellation of the April swim.

The Kiosk incurred total costs of \$50,500 including \$13,200 in wages and \$37,300 in goods. We were able to on-sell most unused items to local businesses following the seasons and therefore hold little stock over the winter.

BALANCE SHEET AND RISK

The Club's balance sheet continues to be in a very strong position, supported by the modest surplus in 2022-23. Cash and cash equivalents have shrunk to \$635,261, but far exceed what is required to manage the flow of payments across the coming season. The Club will look to transition more of this cash to term deposits over the coming season to support future investments and initiatives.

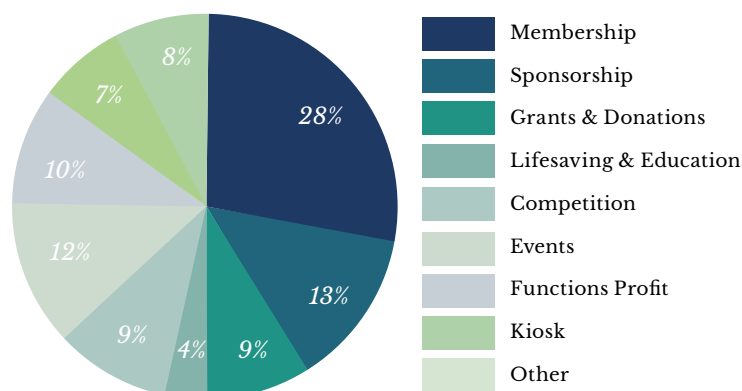
Stock on hand is slightly larger than last year at \$16,379 but, given the large volume of function activity, this is within reasonable operating parameters and will shrink over the quieter months.

Trade debtors are also larger than last year, though this reflects a couple of large invoices for activity in May that are to be processed in June.

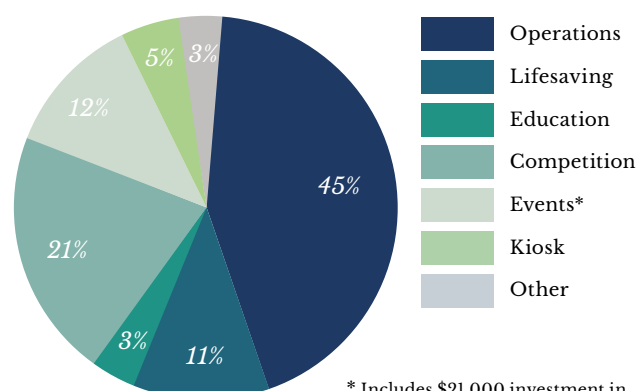

Independent Auditor's Report

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012, complies with the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and is a not-for-profit association incorporated in New South Wales under the Associations Incorporations Act 2009. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows, AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors and AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

INVENTORIES

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

PROPERTY

Freehold land and buildings are shown at their fair value (being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable willing parties in an arm's length transaction), based on periodic, but at least triennial, valuations by external independent valuers, less subsequent depreciation. The building in which the club is situated as shown in the accounts as having a value of \$278,160. In the event of a termination of the lease of the premises, it is anticipated that the building would not have a realisable value.

INCOME TAX

The club is exempt from payment of income tax under the present provisions of the Income Tax Act.

EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled. Changes in the measurement of the liability are recognised in profit or loss.

PROVISIONS

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

INCOME STATEMENT

Coogee Surf Lifesaving Club Inc, operates under the SLS NSW fundraising number CFN11033.

Net fundraising is applied to the operational expenses of the Coogee Surf Lifesaving Club Inc. in its core lifesaving activities

CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet. The club has no other credit or financing facilities in place.

CRITICAL ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES AND JUDGEMENTS

The committee members make estimates and judgments during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

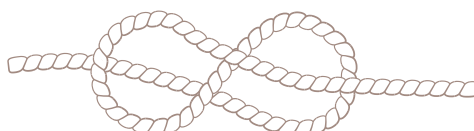

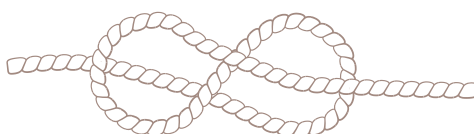

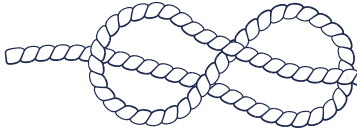

John died in a London Hospital on 16th December 2022. You will be missed old mate.

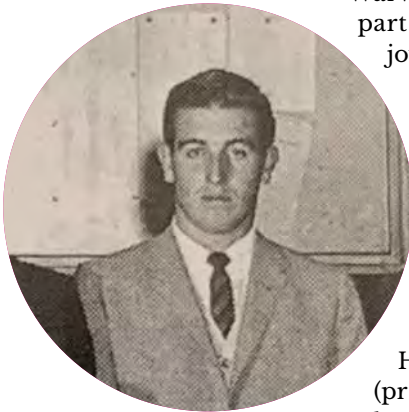
WARWICK ALLEN

Apart from the surf club Grant's other great love was Randwick Rugby where he played 100 grade games.

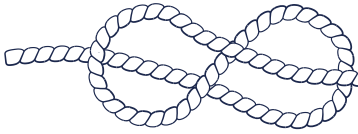
Schooling at Matraville Sports School where his father, Geoff, promoted the game which produced some great players.

It was with great sadness that we reported the passing of Alan 'Norles' Norley on 29th June 2022 at 76.

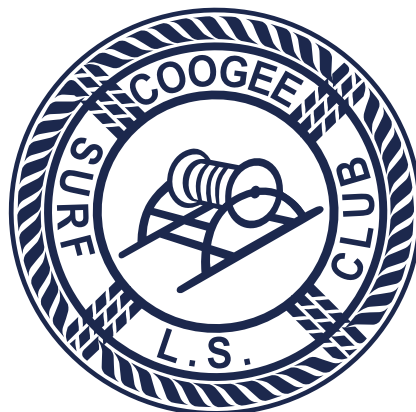

50-Year Long Service Member

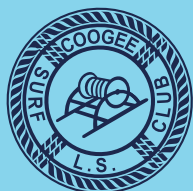
It was with sadness that we had to report the passing of 50 year long-service member Frank White.

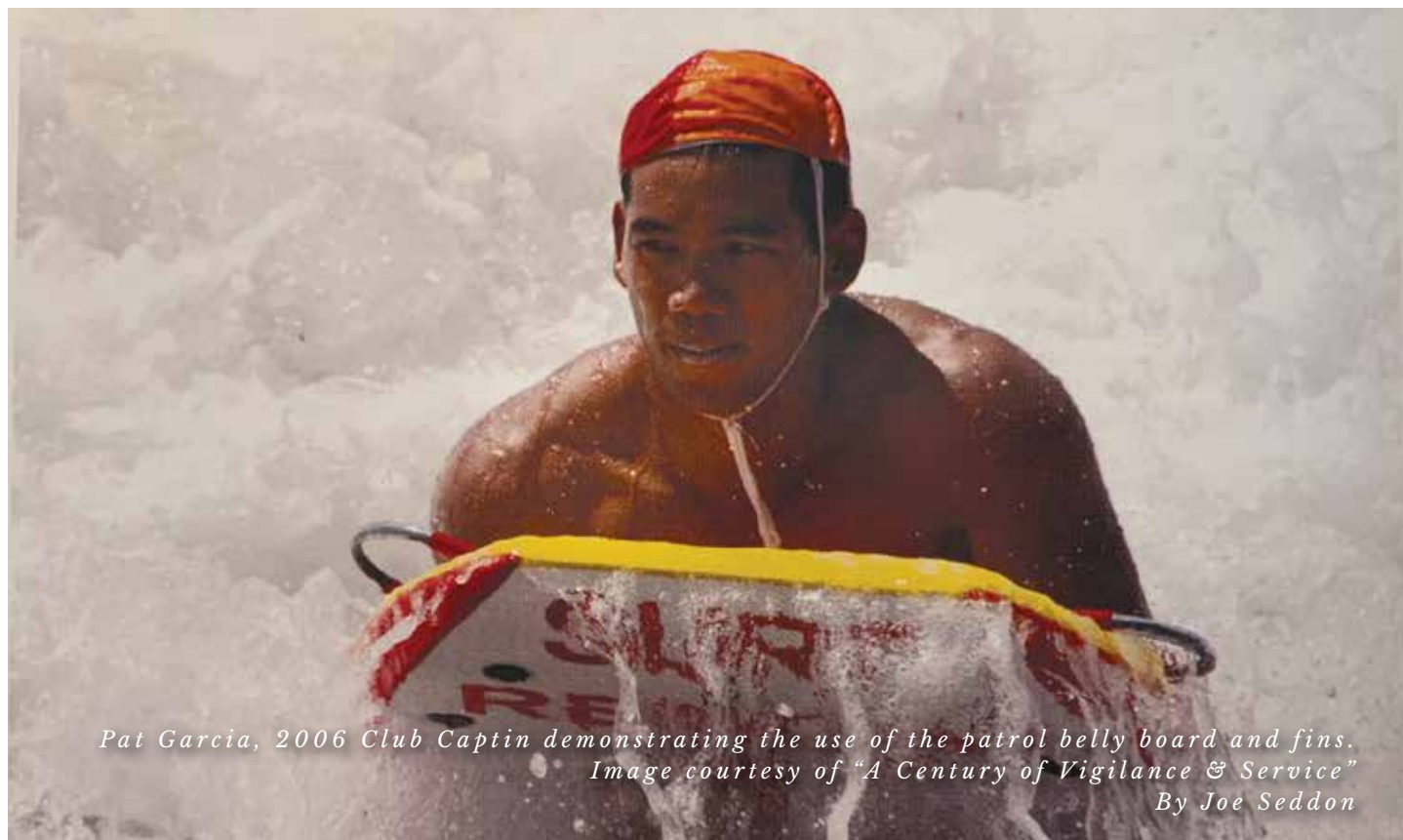

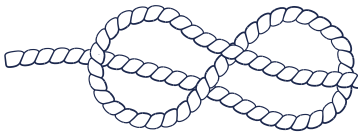

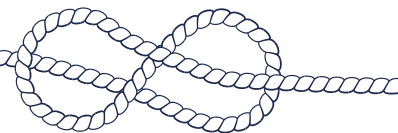
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
